


#### From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

Having just returned from an astounding, but tiring trip, several TBEI members joined with me on a trip to our past. We visited multiple Holocaust sites and myriad museums. It was physically tiring and spiritually draining.

The emotions ran the gamut from a light joyfulness, to an arrogance that we stood at history's ugliest places and intoned together, the Sh'ma, the Kaddish and other prayers of significance.

We stood in defiance of the wicked, we stood on hallowed ground stating, "We are with you even now". But, in looking at the state of the world through those glasses, I beg the Jewish world be careful. Many



It didn't make me afraid although that could be one response. It made me more resolute to live as a Jew in this world where unchecked venom is allowed to be spit out and allowed to cover real disagreements on the world and how it should be. Many of us have lived in a generation where the cuts and tears to our Jewish souls were too close and too painful to want to speak about. But please remember, when the umbrella of protection was turned upside down and became hateful, we were caught in its spokes.

It didn't make me afraid, it brought tears to my soul because. I can still hear a generation saying, "Never again!". We best heed that clarion call earlier this time than we did last time... It has sent me to the books on my shelves to begin to read, as quickly as I can turn the pages, the great prayers of our Siddurim, prayers we imagine were intoned by a generation before us, standing in pits, a thousand at a time, awaiting a humiliating death. They stole humiliation from the jaws of hatred and recited many prayers: V'ahavta eyt Adonai..... You shall love your God with all your heart.....

We, Jews of the 21st century, have a job to do. Make a pact with our ancestors who believed. Bring one Jew to our house, our synagogue, our temple family before Rosh Hashana. Bring one back - We, TBEI, and most certainly THEY, need it right now more than ever. The pride of standing tall as a Jew. Offer to take part in High Holiday services as a reader, or an usher or, even as a participant. Make a statement that we are proud, that we live, that we are here, and we belong.

All that said, have a restful summer- the holidays are late this year! Check inside for our calendar and plan early...

The President's Message.....



#### Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



A year ago, I reviewed many of our fiction novels - just to let you know what our library contains in that field, some of which you would enjoy for your summer reading. At that time, I said I would give you an idea of what our library holds, written by some well-known Jewish authors - names such as: Sholom Aleichem, Saul Bellow, Chaim Potok, Philip Roth, Isaac Bashevis Singer, Leon Uris, Elie Wiesel and Herman Wouk. Due to space limitations in *The Shofar* and time limitations for myself, I will tell you "something" about a number of the books, and list the names of others. Here we go!

#### **Sholom Aleichem**

Marienbad - Written in 1911. this book has a "comic effect," talking about two cities - Warsaw and Marienbad. The story is told through 36 letters, 14 love notes, and 46 telegrams. It is about bourgeois life in the Jewish neighborhoods of Warsaw. and is told through the written communications of friends and relatives. The translator of this book writes in her Introduction: "Fawning friends become mortal enemies as the gossip flies through the mails. Secrets are exposed, confidences are betrayed, some marriages ruined, others cemented, and 'charlatans' have a heyday."

Favorite Tales of Sholem Aleichem, The Best of Sholom Aleichem, Selected Stories of Sholom Aleichem, and Happy New Year and Other Stories are some of the books in our library. His books of tales made him one of the greatest Yiddish writers of modern times. He is known as a "masterful storyteller" who attained his greatest achievement when he wrote his chronicle of Tevye the Dairyman and his seven daughters, which became the basis for the hit Broadway musical *Fiddler on the Roof.* A large proportion of his stories involve the towns and villages of Russia and Eastern Europe. Browse through the collections of stories. You will find them to be "funny, wise, sad, satirical," but in the end they are serious to some extent.

Other books by Sholom Aleichem are: Tevye's Daughters, the Great Fair, The Old Country, and Wandering Star.

#### **Saul Bellow**

<u>Seize The Day</u> - This book is about Tommy Wilhelm, separated from his wife and children, unemployed, at odds with his father and "at the end of his rope both financially and emotionally." He is a man "sinking more deeply into despair until a chance encounter grants him one glorious, illuminating moment of truth and understanding." This all happens on one day! Don't forget to read the Introduction, written by Cynthia Ozick. It helps you to appreciate Bellow and his works.

#### **Chaim Potok**

I know many of you have read <u>The Chosen</u> or <u>My Name is Asher Lev</u>, but our library contains other books such as:

<u>In the Beginning</u> - This familiarizes us with "the rich texture" of Jewish life in America from the 1920's, through the depression and World War II. (warning - small print)!

<u>Davita's Harp</u> - The place -NYC, the time -1930's, the main character - Davita, a woman who has parents dedicated to Communism (one is Jewish, the other is Gentile). Davita sees much in the world - the horrors that continue, yet she gravitates towards Judaism. As the book cover states: "In *Davita's Harp*, Chaim Potok brings to bear the insight and generosity that have informed all of his novels in a stirring and beautiful story about how we learn and use faith, how it can fail us, and how it can help us know ourselves - alone and as a part of an often confusing world."

Other books by Potok which our library contains are: <u>The Promise, The Book of Lights, I am the Clay,</u> and two others which I highly recommend - My Name is Asher Lev and The Chosen.

#### **Philip Roth**

The Plot Against America - Imagine an America that had Charles A. Lindbergh defeat Roosevelt for President by a landslide in the 1940 election. Imagine the fear in every Jewish American household because Lindbergh publicly blamed the Jews for pushing the United States toward a "pointless" war with Germany. Imagine his acceptance of Hitler's anti-Semitic policies. What kind of fear did Jewish families have? Our library also has Roth's When She Was Good.

#### Isaac Bashevis Singer

<u>The Manor</u> - This book is considered to be his "masterpiece" by many others. It tells the story of a "proud and passionate family" as they pursue tragic and triumphant destinies from Poland to New York City.

The Magician of Lublin - Here is the story about a "Houdini-like" popular performer who becomes a local celebrity. He is a Jew who has given up his religion and, away from his wife, he leads a life of "wine, women, and song." His story describes his biggest stunt - one which "takes him to the brink of disaster." This is his struggle with evil. The book is "a study of man's search for the Divine and of the perplexing ambiguities in his path."

<u>Enemies, a Love Story</u> - This is about Herman Broder, a man with three "wives" in NYC - one in the Bronx, one in Brooklyn, and one on 18th street in Manhattan. It is a "lusty, funny, fantastic" story taking place in Coney Island and New York. The *New York Times wrote*: One is forever suspended between laughter and tears by this rich and marvelous novel."

Our library has quite a collection of his novels. There are also several which hold collections of his many wonderful stories. We also have his memoir, <u>Lost in America</u>, which starts with his life in the mid 30's when he lived and struggled in Poland and wanted to join his brother in New York. The memoir covers his trip over, going to a strange place and not knowing his future. He writes about the people he meets. Learn about his dangerous trip to Canada, where he smuggled himself across the border to get his permanent visa to the U.S. This is a book of "fascinating reminiscences and character sketches of one of the world's greatest writers."

#### Leon Uris

<u>QB VII</u> - Read about an "electrifying" legal battle in Great Britain between a knighted doctor and a best-selling American author. It involves libel - the American author defamed the doctor in his book.

<u>Mitla Pass</u> - Travel from the pogroms of Russian shtetls to America and from Hollywood "in its heyday" to Israel in 1956. The book cover states that this book is "breathtaking in scope, painfully human, and alive with earthy humor."

Our library also contains other books by Uris such as: <u>Trinity, The Haj,</u> and, of course, <u>Exodus</u> - which some of you may want to read again.

#### Eli Wiesel

<u>A Beggar in Jerusalem</u> - Wiesel writes that this is a tale about a beggar who comes to Jerusalem. "It is an adventure of one madman, who one night saw not the end of all things, but their beginnings." It involves the Six Day War.

<u>The Forgotten</u> - This is a moving novel which involves a father losing his memory by disease and wants to tell his son his story before it is too late. It involves the period before World War II, and finally the secret trip to Palestine. In the book, the son tries to find out the truth about an act that was committed.

<u>Twilight</u> - In this book, we meet Raphael Lipkin, who has searched for years for Pedro, his friend who saved him from the Holocaust. We go to the sanitarium in upstate New York. Raphael remembers his family hiding from the Germans and others who were never seen again. The book moves from Poland to postwar Paris and Berlin. Raphael is really trying to understand "who is mad and who is sane and what it means to survive."

Our library has other books by Wiesel such as <u>The Oath</u>, <u>The Fifth Son</u>, <u>The Judge</u> (in large print), and <u>Souls on Fire</u>. **Herman Wouk** 

The Hope - Here we have a book of historical fiction. It covers the period from the 1948 War of Independence to the 1967 Six Day War. We see the major battles, the disasters and the victories. This book includes four Israeli army officers and the women they love. In the book, we read about people "crushing odds" - and so it is a "tale of hope for all mankind."

<u>The Glory</u> - This is a continuation of <u>The Hope</u> and covers the period from the aftermath of the 1967 victory, and through the battles of the Yom Kippur War, the Entebbe rescue, the Camp David Accords, and finally the celebration of 40 years of independence. We see the continuation of the lives of the people we met in <u>The Hope</u>. We see the events through their eyes. We also view the great portraits contained of actual world figures such as Golda Meir, Moshe Dayan, Anwar Sadat, Henry Kissinger, Ariel Sharon and David Elazar.

Above, I have reviewed other books of our fiction collection. Don't forget, these are prominent writers, well-known in the Jewish World. Our fiction collection holds the novels of many other writers - some of whom I mentioned in last summer's review of our library's fiction books. Also, remember the fiction section is located <u>behind</u> the door on the left as you enter the library. They are shelved in an alphabetical manner by author.

There are two ways to take home one or more books. If the book has already been classified (has a label with "fiction" and the name of the author, remove its card from the inside of the back cover, fill it out, and place it in the small wooden box on top of the file cabinet in the right corner as you enter the room. If the book is not yet classified, remove a slip of paper from the wooden box, fill it out, and put it back in the box. When you return the book, just leave it on top of the file cabinet.


