
From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson







CHANUKAH.....




The kindling of the Menorah is the focal point of the Chanukah holiday, symbolizing religious freedom and the strength of the Jewish spirit. The menorah is kindled on each of the eight nights of Chanukah. This year Chanukah begins on Sunday night, December 22nd. The candles are lit right after sunset and usually stay lit for at least a half hour after sunset. The Chanukah candles are lit before the Shabbat candles and after the Havdalah candle at the end of Shabbat. The candles are lit from left to right.

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



The book I have chosen to review is <u>Jewish Humor - What the Best Jewish Jokes Say About the Jews</u>, written by Rabbi Joseph Telushkin. Because our Temple is welcoming Rabbi and comedian Bob Alper on January 11th, I thought this might be helpful in examining the important facets of Jewish Humor and understanding more about its use. As Sigmund Freud wrote about Jewish jokes: "I do not know whether there are many other instances of a people making fun to such a degree of its own character." This is the subject of <u>Jewish Humor</u>. Rabbi Telushkin, as the cov-

er states, "identifies the keystones of Jewish character: family love and torments, relations with God; the push of anti-Semitic oppression and the pull of assimilation; chutzpah and its flipside, self-denigration; the love of learning, the passion for arguing, the commitment to justice - and others."

There are a number of specific issues that Rabbi Telushkin addresses. As the book states, among them are:

How Jews cope with persecution and discrimination

How Jews view money and financial success

What Jews think about sex

How Jews see rabbis and other religious leaders

What Jews think about violence

What Jews think about assimilation and intermarriage with non-Jews

How Jews see each other

I recommend reading the list of chapters on pp. 11 and 12 - each one has an interesting name and in italics lists the topics to which the chapter refers. For example, one chapter is "Oedipus, Shmoedipus, as Long as He Loves His Mother": 'The Inescapable Hold of the Jewish Family'

Topic: Between Parents and Children

I also recommend reading the Introduction - "What is Jewish about Jewish Humor"? In it, we find that Rabbi Telushkin states there is no one sentence that can capture the essence of Jewish humor. He writes that "Jewish humor reveals a great *many* truths about the Jews, but no *one* great truth" - and some important truths are left out. However, the issues Jews really think about are expressed in Jewish humor. And what makes a joke Jewish? Rabbi Telushkin writes: "Obviously, it must apply to Jews, but more significantly, it must express a Jewish sensibility." This sensibility concerns subjects and values that receive "disproportionate attention" among Jews - such as: anti-Semitism, financial success, verbal aggression, and assimilation. Again, these are very significant topics for Jews. Jews feel anxious about these subjects - and what does one do to deal with anxieties and fears? You laugh at them. Thus, they are less threatening.

Other jokes have nothing to do with Jewish anxieties, writes Rabbi Telushkin, "but they reflect the distinctive thought patterns of the Jewish mind." Don't forget, though, many non-Jews share one or more Jewish obsessions, making Jewish jokes attractive to them. However, it is said that over the last 50 years or more, some 80% of the country's top comics have been Jews.

Rabbi Telushkin discusses the issue of telling ethnic jokes with the dangers of negative stereotyping. Also, there are self-critical jokes which, the book states, Freud claims are "one of the distinguishing and characteristic features of Jewish humor." As you can see, before you even start looking at the chapters, a cohesive discussion is presented just in the Introduction.

Within the chapters, you will find numerous jokes, but this book also includes a logical discussion about each joke, which I think are enjoyable to read. The explanations of the jokes make you appreciate what it's all about. Here are some examples of the humor in the book.

- 1. How do we know Jesus was Jewish? Four reasons:
- a. He was thirty, unmarried, and still living with his mother
- b. He went into his father's business
- c. He thought his mother was a virgin
- d. And his mother thought he was God

And from the world of business:

- 3. Levine meets his friend Schwartz.
 - "I heard your factory burned down." he says.
 - "Sh,sh" Schwartz answers, looking around anxiously.

"Next week."

Here's a reflection on the Jewish psyche:

2. What's a Jewish telegram?

Answer: It reads, "Letter to follow. Start worrying."

Relating to materialism:

4. A Jewish man goes into an expensive store.

"I want to buy your finest Monteblanc pen for my wife's birthday." he tells the salesman.

"That'll certainly be a big surprise," the salesman says.

"It certainly will. She's expecting a mink coat."

Relating to self contempt:

5. I grew up to have my father's looks, my father's speech patterns, my father's posture, my father's opinions, and my mother's contempt for my father,

There are even Jewish curses:

- 6. May all your teeth fall out, except one. And that should ache!
- 7. May you win a lottery and spend all of it on doctors!
- 8. You should have a lot of money, but should be the only one in your family with it!

I can't even begin to tell you how many great jokes there are in this book. But even more important are the discussions that accompany them. The reader can certainly see Jewish humor from all angles. Who doesn't enjoy laughing - in fact, it's healthy for you! Oh, and don't forget to buy a ticket to see Rabbi Alper who will be at our temple on January 11th.

Remove the slip from the small wooden box next to it, fill it out, and then return the slip to the box. When you finish reading the book, place it where you originally found it.




