



Antisemitism is on the rise and we must all do our parts to stop it. Jews and allies need to be courageous, to call it out and to never make excuses for it. Antisemitism isn't new, but there are new and insidious strains of it. There's the familiar white supremacy movement that pretty much hates everyone who doesn't look like them, the run-of-the-mill anti-Semites, the subtle I-don't-really-mean-it-when-I talk-crap-about Jews kind, and a relatively new form of hate directed at Israel which crosses the line to antisemitism far too often. Antisemitism is hate. Jews, Christians, Muslims, Hindus, atheists....literally everyone is worse off for it. Are we going to end it completely? Probably not. But that doesn't give us permission to throw our hands up and accept it, make excuses, or discount it. It's exactly the opposite. We must talk about it, write about it, learn about it, and call it out. No matter how difficult or uncomfortable, we can't ignore, chuckle along, or accept it. We've already learned the bitter lesson that true hate is never little, it is never unimportant, and it should never, ever be ignored.



The fascinating story of Ben Ferencz - the last surviving Nuremberg prosecutor. Tu B'Shevat Babka

Ingredients

For the dough:

1 Tbsp dry active yeast

1/2 tsp sugar

1/2 cup lukewarm water

 $3 \frac{1}{2} - 4 \frac{1}{2}$ cups unbleached all-purpose flour

1/2 cup barley flour

1/3 cup sugar

1 tsp vanilla

1 tsp cinnamon

1/2 cup milk or almond milk

3/4 cup olive oil

2 eggs

For the filling:

1 cup dried figs, cut in half

1 cup pitted dates

1 cup water

1/2 cup wine or grape juice

1 Tbsp pomegranate molasses

1/4 tsp salt

1 tsp cinnamon

For the topping: (topping is optional)

date honey (silan) slivered almonds

Directions



Place yeast and sugar in a small bowl. Add lukewarm water and set aside until foamy, around 5-10 minutes.

In a stand mixer fitted with dough hook or a large bowl, mix together flours, sugar, vanilla and cinnamon. Start with 3 1/2 cups of flour, and add more later if dough seems too sticky. Add milk and olive oil.

Add the eggs one at a time.

When the dough begins to come together, after about 3-5 minutes, turn out onto a floured surface and knead vigorously for 5-10 minutes. Or if using a stand mixer, switch to high and mix another 4-5 minutes. Dough should be shiny, elastic and very soft when it is done. If dough is sticking too much, add more flour 1/4 cup at a time until dough is not longer sticking.

Place dough in a greased bowl with a damp towel on top. Allow to rise for 1-2 hours.





Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



I am one of those people who very much enjoys a book that is loaded with many photographs and other visual items. I know others do too. In <u>The Jewish Americans</u>, by J.J. Goldberg, we find a "visually stimulating" book about "How the Jews Arrived and Became Part of America's Heritage". There is a text that flows through the book, setting the scene for all of the photographs,

sketching, engravings, woodcuts, and paintings, giving the reader a much needed background of information, But I do believe the visual aids can convey feelings which can in no way be explained just by words alone.

The author shows how the Jewish people has contributed so much to the growth of America. They started as a small band of 23 refugees from the Portuguese Inquisition, dumped on Manhattan's docks in 1654 by an unfriendly sea-captain who would take them no further, and became the most successful community in the long history of the Jewish diaspora. The book tells the story of their life in the New World from the point of view of those who lived it. What were their successes? What were their problems? What was their discrimination like? How did they keep their community and their faith? Their stories are full of all types of individuals: soldiers, gangsters, statesmen, rabbis, tailors and many more.

The book is divided into eight chapters, in chronological order. Just to give you an idea of what's within these pages, I'll supply you the name of the chapter and some examples of what it contains, starting with the Introduction.

Introduction

- Photo of immigrant children in 1910, waiting with baggage in the entrance hall at Ellis Island. What emotions do their faces show?

Also, photo of Albert Einstein as he celebrates his 70th birthday at home in New Jersey with a group of European children who survived the Holocaust.

Chapter 1 - "Before America"

-Engraving of Solomon's Temple in ancient Jerusalem

Chapter 2 - "The Colonial Era and the Young Republic"

-Portrait of Haym Salomon, portrait of Reverend Gershom Mendes Seixas, lay minister of New York Congregation Shearith Israel. He was one of the invited clergies at the inauguration of President George Washington in 1789, portrait of Rebecca Gratz, Philadelphia philanthropist, the model for the character of Rebecca in Ivanhoe and was the founder of the first Hebrew Sunday School and the Jewish Immigrant Aid Society. Lastly there is a copy of "The Jew Bill", finally passed in 1825 in Maryland, giving Jews the right to hold office in that state.

Chapter 3 - "The Coming of the Germans"

-photo of Julius Meyer and Native Americans, was an Indian trader, interpreter, and trusted adviser to the Plains Indian Chiefs, photo of frontier Jews on a community picnic in Montana with their rabbi, photo of Levi Strauss, a dry goods peddler who joined the Gold Rush and was known for his denim "blue jeans", popular among the miners, photo of Rabbi Isaac Mayer Wise - part of the German immigrant wave to America. He became the leader of Reform Judaism. Also, an engraving from 1865, of a "high-society" Purim costume ball. Then more photographs, one of Judah P. Benjamin, "the brains of the Confederacy", serving as its attorney-general, then as Secretary of War and finally Secretary of State, and a photo of Commodore Uriah P. Levy, a man highly decorated known to be responsible for ending flogging in the U.S. Navy. Lastly there is a copy of an advertisement for a Georgian Jewish slave trader

Chapter 4 - "The Jews of Russia and the Great Immigration"

- This chapter contains interesting photos showing: Ellis Island, a Russian Jew who went west shown on his peddler's wagon, grand Jewish structures such as The Jewish Theological Seminary in New York, Yeshiva University of New York and a synagogue in Montana, a Lower East Side street in 1910, a Jewish family doing lowwage government "piece work", and finally photos of Jewish Gangsters such as Meyer Lansky, Nathan Kaplan, Louis "lepke' Buchalter and more.

While dough is rising, make filling.

Combine all filling ingredient in a saucepan over medium heat. Bring to a boil, then reduce for 10 minutes, until liquid has reduced to slightly more than half. Allow to cool slightly. Place in food processor and pulse.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Cut dough into two parts. Roll out each section of dough until it is a rectangular-like shape. Spread with filling. Working from the shorter side, roll up dough using quick fingers, like you would in order to make cinnamon rolls.

Once the dough is a long log, cut it straight down the middle so the filling is exposed. Secure the ends on one side, and twist both the pieces. Pinch and secure at the other end.

Place in a greased loaf pan. Allow to rise another 10-20 minutes. Sprinkle top with slivered almonds if desired (this step is optional).

Bake for 30-35 minutes.

Top with date honey if desired.





<u>Chapter 5</u> - "The Community Finds a Voice"

- There are photos of family gatherings and holiday celebrations such as: a cooking class for girls and a printing class for boys, both in community-run trade schools for poor Jewish youths, and a gathering in a beautiful sukkah.

Chapter 6 - "The Jazz Age"

- This chapter contains photos of Al Jolson in the film "The Jazz Singer", Jews who went into the music field such as songwriter George Gershwin of "Rhapsody in Blue" and "Porgy and Bess" fame, and Sophie Tucker of "My Yiddisha Mama" fame.

The film industry is represented by photos of David O. Selznick, son-in-law of L.B. Mayer, Jack Warner (the youngest of the four Warner Brothers, originally Eichelbaum), and Louis B. Mayer, founder of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer studios. Don't forget the Yiddish Theater which flourished between 1880 and WW II, with movie posters of Yiddish plays.

TV was also transformed into a major industry by small groups of Jewish entrepreneurs. With photos of William Paley - founder of CBS, Milton Berle (Mendel Berlinger), and Ethel Merman (Ethel Zimmerman). Also, there are photos of the time before WWI, including that of Leo Frank who was lynched by a Christian mob in 1915.

Chapter 7 - "Mr. Roosevelt and Mr. Hitler"

- Photos of this time period include one of Albert Einstein, sworn in as a U.S. citizen, Jews marching, rallying and fasting to end Nazism (1930's and 1940's), a march through downtown Chicago with 25,000 Jews, and a group of Orthodox rabbis march on Congress demanding U.S. military action to save European Jews.

The results of the war are also shown through photographs - as Viennese children enter New York harbor, and President Truman with a Torah scroll presented by Chaim Weizmann, Israel's first President. The last photo in 1949 is an impressive gathering of 150,000 Jews in New York City on the first anniversary of Israel. Chapter 8 - "At Home at Last"

- In this chapter, we see Jewish activism at work. There are photos of Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel joining with Martin Luther King Jr. in a 1965 "freedom march" in Alabama, a Washington rally in 1987 of 250,000 people to demand freedom for Soviet Jews, Ethel and Julius Rosenberg - charged in 1951 on passing atomic secrets to the Soviets, and Albert Einstein presents the "Albert Einstein Award" - just two decades after Harvard and Princeton had dropped their "Jewish quotas". Other photos show us how Hollywood no longer avoided openly Jewish images such as anti-Semitism, the birth of Israel, and Jewish families. The 60's include photos of Bob Dylan, of three Supreme Court Justices (Goldberg, Frankfurter, and Fortas), but of course the book needs updating due to its statement: "no Jewish justices have been appointed since then." The 80's have photos of Henry Kissinger, and a New York Salute to Israel parade on 5th Ave. Jews were leaving their mark everywhere. Open the pages and you will see photos of Woody Allen (Allen Koenigsberg), Mel Brooks (Melvin Kaminsky), Ed Asner, Henry Winkler Edward Koch, Bella Abzug, and Nobel Prize winner Elie Wiesel.

By now, your heads must be full of faces and places. But so is our story in the history of America. Why did I list so many photographs in the book? Perhaps because they are able to relate even more information than words in the accompanying text. But it is helpful to read the text of the book - it not only organizes the information, but it is able to help you relate this information with many of the photos. Please remember, the book includes many more photos than I have mentioned.

I know that many of you, like me, enjoy the experiences of viewing more than just words, as helpful as they may be. Nothing says more than the photo on page 9. What are these children thinking about while waiting in Ellis Island? What are their feelings? It's the photograph that helps you digest the information you've been given in the text and transform it into a better understanding of what is going on in this photo and in others.

If you would like to take out this book from our library, it will be located in the third section, fourth shelf down of the bookshelves on the left as you enter. Take a slip from the wooden box beside the book, fill it out, and return it back into the box. When you return the book, place it on the same shelf.
