The President's Communication Corner

Temple life is not what it was a month ago. In our attempt to help prevent the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19), in-house temple life as we knew it is suspended for the time being. Rabbi Benson is conducting Friday evening and Shabbat morning services via the internet so we may "attend" services. And we are communicating through email and phone calls.

Our home and social lives have also temporarily changed. Social and physical distancing, while we hope will help minimize or contain the virus, can create a certain amount of stress. How do we deal with it? I don't have all the answers, but one way might be to take heed of the following lesson from Mrs. S (excerpt taken from *I Believe*):

Mrs. S is 92 years old, petite, well posed, and proud. She is fully dressed each morning by 8:00, with her hair fashionably styled and her makeup perfectly applied, in spite of the fact she is legally blind.

Today she has moved to a nursing home. Her husband of 70 years recently passed away, making this move necessary. After many hours of waiting patiently in the lobby of the nursing home, she smiled sweetly when told her room was ready. As she maneuvered her walker to the elevator, the assistant provided a visual description of her tiny room, including the eyelet curtains that had been hung on her window. "I love it!" she stated with the enthusiasm of an 8 year old having just been presented with a new puppy.

"Mrs. S, you haven't seen the room ... just wait," the assistant said.

Then Mrs. S spoke these words: "That does not have anything to do with it," she gently replied. "Happiness is something you decide on ahead of time. Whether I like my room or not, does not depend on how the furniture is arranged. It is how I arrange my mind. I have already decided to love it. It is a decision I make every morning when I wake up. I have a choice: I can spend the day in bed recounting the difficulty I have with the parts of my body that no longer work or I can get out of bed and be thankful for the ones that do work. Each day is a gift, and as long as my eyes open, I will focus on the new day.

I believe that we are responsible for what we do, no matter how we feel.

I believe that either you control your attitude or it controls you.

I believe that sometimes when I'm angry I have the right to be angry, but that does not give me the right to be cruel. I believe that heroes are the people who do what has to be done when it needs to be done."

Let's "arrange our minds" like Mrs. S, accept this different lifestyle for the time being, stay connected via the internet and/ or phones, stay healthy, and remember to smile.



PASSOVER OR PESACH is a major Jewish spring festival holiday, commemorating the Exodus from Egypt over 3,000 years ago. The ritual observance of this holiday centers around a special service called the Seder (meaning "order") and a festive meal; the prohibition of *chametz* (leaven); and the eating of *matzah* (an unleavened bread). On the fifteenth day of Nisan in the Hebrew calendar, Jews traditionally gather with family and friends in the evening to read from a book called the *Haggadah*, meaning "telling," which contains the order of prayers, rituals, readings, and songs for the Passover Seder. Today, the holiday is a celebration of freedom and family.

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review......by Sheilah Korinow



t was not too long ago that our library received a number of books that Richard Schnabolk had owned. It seems that he enjoyed to create loose-leaf notebooks full of recipes from the internet. One happens to be a timely one - it's title is "Matzoh Balls and Matzoh Brei". Because Passover is around the corner, I thought some of you might enjoy looking through it. I must warn you that there are numerous recipes about both, so I have chosen to limit this book review to the recipes about

Honey for serving

Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

Matzoh Brei, knowing there would be something in this collection that you would enjoy trying. In the past, for Passover, I have usually chosen desserts or main dishes as examples, but I thought that people might want a food dish which is already made by numerous individuals, but was not usually a part of a "main " meal. After all, we eat breakfast, brunch and lunch too! Also, I have chosen some recipes that are "unique" - not your "usual" matzoh brei. I hope you enjoy them.

MATZO BREI TEAMS UP WITH LOX AND EGGS - yields 4 servings

4 matzos

1 large red onion, halved lengthwise and thinly sliced

4 0z lox or smoked salmon, cut into 1/2-inch-wide strips2 Tbs freshly chopped dill, more for garnish

mushrooms

3 Tbs. unsalted butter or olive oil

1/2 tsp salt, plus a pinch

8 large eggs

1/4 tsp black pepper

1. Put the matzos under a running faucet for about 15 seconds or until really wet. They should start to soften but not fall apart. Break them into rough 1 1/2 inch pieces.

2. Scatter the onion in a large dry skillet over high heat. Cook for 1 to 2 minutes until it turns dark golden brown on one side, then stir in the butter and a pinch of salt and cook until golden all over and dark in spots, about 3 to 5 minutes. If the butter starts to become too brown, lower the heat.

3. While the onion is frying, whisk the eggs in a medium bowl with 1/2 tsp salt and the pepper. Stir in the matzo pieces and let them soak.

4. Reduce the heat under the skillet to medium-low and add matzo-egg mixture to the onion. Cook, stirring, as you would with scrambled eggs. When the eggs are two-thirds of the way cooked, stir in the smoked salmon and dill.

Serve immediately with honey and dollop of sour cream on the side.

CARAMELIZED ONION AND MUSHROOM MATZOH BREI - Serves 2

- 3 Tbs unsalted butter
- 1/3 cup diced onions

2 boards (about 2 ounces) matzoh, broken into pieces

5 large eggs, lightly beaten

- 1/2 cup sliced mushrooms
- 1.In a skillet over low heat, melt 2 Tbs of the butter.

2. Add the onions and cook, stirring until caramelized, 5 to 7 minutes.

3. Add the mushrooms and raise the heat to medium-high. Continue to cook, stirring, until the are soft, about 5 minutes.

4. Season with plenty of salt and pepper.

- 5. Add the remaining Tbs. of butter to the pan and let it melt.
- 6. Add the matzoh and cook, tossing to coat the matzoh in butter, for 2 minutes.

7. Pour the eggs into the pan and season them generously with salt and pepper.

8. Cook, scrambling the mixture, until the eggs are set, about 2 to 3 more minutes.

9. Season with salt and pepper and serve.

I know you might be tempted to look at the other recipes in the notebook. You will find unusual ones such as **Matzoh Brei with Caramelized Apples, Honey Vanilla Sauce, and Mascarpone** and other sweet versions you might want to place jam, powdered sugar, or cinnamon on top. Make sure you read any of the texts that go with the recipes. They could give you quite a bit of interesting information. Our library also contains other notebooks that Richard had concerning the topics of Kugel and Jewish Apple Cake. Those are located for now on the left a you enter, 4 sections over, 5th shelf down. But don't forget to fill out a slip of paper for them too. Directions to follow below.

If you would like to take the <u>Matzoh Balls and Matzoh Brei home</u>, you will find this notebook in the third bookcase on your left, 3rd row down. Remove a slip from the small box, fill it out, and replace it back in the box. When you have finished, return it to the shelf where it was located..

You will be amazed at the number of recipes in this collection. I hope you enjoy them!





The Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle is modeled after a traditional Jewish Yahrzeit memorial candle that burns for 24 hours during periods of mourning. The wax reminds us of the yellow arm bands that Jews were forced to wear during the Nazi regime.

As the years pass, the memories of those who were victims in this ultimate hate crime must not diminish. We encourage your family to light a yellow candle after sundown on **Monday, April 20, 2020**, the start of Holocaust Remembrance Day, and join with thousands of other families lighting their Yom HaShoah candles. This action will increase awareness of the Holocaust and help perpetuate our commitment to our people—particularly as a response to the recent marked increase of anti-Semitism.

The memory is important! The number of Holocaust survivors is diminishing with each passing day. As we lose this precious link, those who deny that the Holocaust happened gain strength. Sadly, a study conducted in 2018 found that 22 percent of millennials (23 to 38 years old) say they haven't even heard of the Holocaust.

The Temple Beth El Israel Brotherhood is mailing a Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle to each temple family. Please join us in lighting this candle in memory of our six million men, women, and children who perished. In addition, we encourage you to attend our **Holocaust Memorial Yizkor Service** led by Rabbi Benson on **Friday, April 24, 2020, at 7:30 p.m**. Please mark your calendar and save the date.


