From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

Grandma used to say:

A silly thought I know, but in these upside down days.....

Our lives have been turned upside down, truth is fiction, fiction truth. But one thing I know to be true - the Jewish people have survived millennia of oppression and civilizations of great power have crumbled and yet, here we are..



Another challenge has entered our lives. While I know we are all itching to open, to reclaim our religious and spiritual center by returning to TBEI, some of the hardest decisions we have ever been called on to make are sitting in front of us these days.

Please understand, this is NOT repeated as a political statement, but as a statement of hon-

Please understand, this is NOT repeated as a political statement, but as a statement of honoring the Torah and the protections it requires of us. The Torah states: Love your neighbor as yourself - this does not mean "MORE than yourself" Neither does it mean LESS than. We are required as Jews, by Torah, to watch out for each other. Let us travel this road together as the Israelites did following Moses. Not all agreed, but it was the end goal that they were focused on. Let's travel together. We'll get there...







Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow

I wrote this article last month, and then, thanks to "stay-at-home" orders, I have had a chance to do a lot of thinking. I like to keep up with the latest news about the virus (although it is suggested that we don't let the amount of it get out of hand), but it has helped me see a lot of good things going on. I also started to think about Judaism, and how it has helped me cope. We have a tradi-

tion of many sayings that make a great deal of sense and that help us carry on through these difficult times. And what do I find? A book from our temple library called <u>The Wisdom of Judaism</u>, edited by Dale Salwak, which is an inspirational collection of Jewish teachings, many of which certainly pertain to these tough times. Our Judaic tradition provides for us much to think about - sayings from our Bible, from our Oral Law (Talmud), rabbinic stories and legends, and the Legal Code.

The Wisdom of Judaism is organized into chapters such as "The Nature of God", "God's Commandments", "God's Promises", "Praise Be to God", "Our Relationships With God" (human nature, Repentance and prayer), "Wisdom for Living" (marriage, children, work, study, kindness and charity, harmony and humility).. As the book cover states: "Intensely religious, yet firmly rooted in the challenges of everyday life, this superb compilation of quotes is a powerful and inspirational summation of the Jewish tradition's wisdom and insight."

I thought I would list some of the quotes, and then give the sources from which they come. (in italics) If you have some free time (and you have plenty of it), now is the time to read, think about, and appreciate our Judaic wisdom and what it has to offer to help us contemplate all that is going on now, and how we will be able to deal with what is happening. Here then, are some words to consider.

All men are responsible for one another. - Babylonian Talmud, Sanhedrin 27B

The Jewish nation is distinguished by three characteristics; they are merciful, they are modest, and they perform acts of loving-kindness. - Babylonian Talmud, Yebamot 79A

Separate not yourself from the community. - Mishnah, Abot 2:4

You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against your countrymen. Love thy neighbor as yourself: I am the Lord. - Leviticus 19:18

A gentle response allays wrath; A harsh word provokes anger. - Proverbs 15:1

You shall have one standard for stranger and citizen alike. - Leviticus 24:22

From all toil there is some gain but idle chatter is pure loss. - Proverbs 14:23

You shall rise before the aged and show deference to the old. - Leviticus 19:32

Do not be sad, for your rejoicing in the Lord is the source your strength. - Nehemiah 8:10;

Lazybones, go to the ant; Study its ways and learn. - Proverbs 6:6

Let not your prayer become a matter of routine, but let it be a plea for mercy and compassion - Babylonian Talmud, Berakhot 29B

First improve yourself, then improve others. - Babylonian Talmud. Bava Meziz 107B

The Lord is near to all who call Him, to all who call him with sincerity. - Psalms 145:18

If there is anxiety in a man's mind let him quash it, And turn it into joy with a good word. - Proverbs 12:25

The above quotations numerous sources are a very small part of what the book contains. Our Jewish tradition, over the centuries, presents us with so much more. I'll conclude with some words that have been written in more recent times that present you with something to think about.




