From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

Grandma used to say:

A silly thought I know, but in these upside down days.....

Our lives have been turned upside down, truth is fiction, fiction truth.
But one thing I know to be true - the Jewish people have survived
millennia of oppression and civilizations of great power have crum-
bled and yet, here we are..

Another challenge has entered our lives. While I know we are all itching to open, to reclaim
our religious and spiritual center by returning to TBEI, some of the hardest decisions we have
ever been called on to make are sitting in front of us these days.

Please understand, this is NOT repeated as a political statement, but as a statement of hon-
oring the Torah and the protections it requires of us. The Torah states: Love your neighbor as
yourself - this does not mean "MORE than yourself" Neither does it mean LESS than. We are
required as Jews, by Torah, to watch out for each other. The wearing of masks and other
protections deemed necessary by the medical professional has to take precedence over our
own egos and we must all be respectful of each other. Decisions must be made that are diffi-
cult which ever way they go. Please understand, the leadership is doing its best under the
most trying of circumstances and we greatly appreciate your support as we try to steer this
ark through the troubling waters we are floating in at the moment.

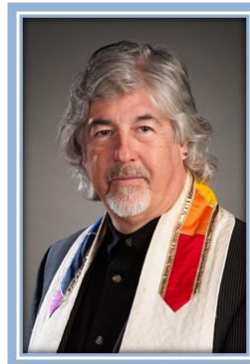
I am, this month going to share with you a letter from Rabbi Rick Jacobs, President of the

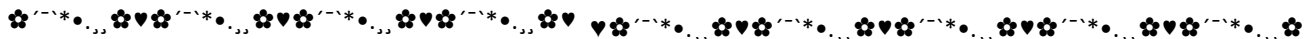

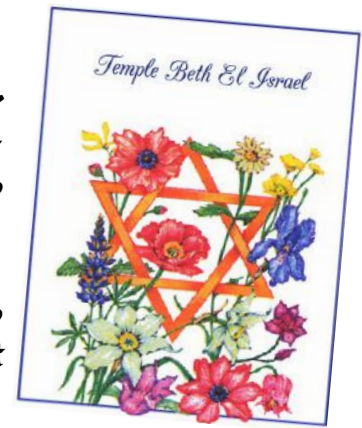

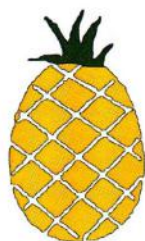

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow

I wrote this article last month, and then, thanks to "stay-at-home" orders, I have had a chance to do a lot of thinking. I like to keep up with the latest news about the virus (although it is suggested that we don't let the amount of it get out of hand), but it has helped me see a lot of good things going on. I also started to think about Judaism, and how it has helped me cope. We have a tradition of many sayings that make a great deal of sense and that help us carry on through these difficult times. And what do I find? A book from our temple library called The Wisdom of Judaism, edited by Dale Salwak, which is an inspirational collection of Jewish teachings, many of which certainly pertain to these tough times. Our Judaic tradition provides for us much to think about - sayings from our Bible, from our Oral Law (Talmud), rabbinic stories and legends, and the Legal Code.

The Wisdom of Judaism is organized into chapters such as "The Nature of God", "God's Commandments", "God's Promises", "Praise Be to God", "Our Relationships With God" (human nature, Repentance and prayer), "Wisdom for Living" (marriage, children, work, study, kindness and charity, harmony and humility). As the book cover states: "Intensely religious, yet firmly rooted in the challenges of everyday life, this superb compilation of quotes is a powerful and inspirational summation of the Jewish tradition's wisdom and insight."

I thought I would list some of the quotes, and then give the sources from which they come. (in italics) If you have some free time (and you have plenty of it), now is the time to read, think about, and appreciate our Judaic wisdom and what it has to offer to help us contemplate all that is going on now, and how we will be able to deal with what is happening. Here then, are some words to consider.

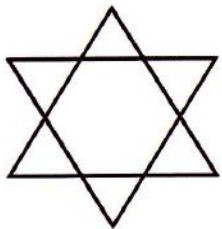
