

High Holiday Schedule of Services 2020/5781

Our High Holiday services will be pre-recorded and details will be sent to our membership when available. Your safety and health are of utmost importance to us and we are taking these precautions so that when this pandemic is over, we can all return to TBEI and resume our "normal" lives

This re-enforces our decision to just use restrooms at the back of the sanctuary when we re-open

Q: How safe are public restrooms?

A: "If you don't have to use the public restroom, don't," said microbiologist Ali Nouri, president of the Federation of American Scientists. But he acknowledged that's not always possible: "Sometimes when you gotta go, you gotta go."

Close contact with others is the most significant risk in a public restroom, Nouri said. So if there's a single-person bathroom available that doesn't have multiple stalls, using that might be best. If you do use a multi-stall public restroom, Nouri offers the following tips:

- Use paper towels to dry your hands, not the hand dryer.
- Use a paper towel to turn off the water and open the bathroom door. Throw away the paper towel immediately afterward.
- Wear a face mask.
- If the restroom looks crowded, wait until it clears out, if you can.

Rosh HaShanah Honey Apple Cake

Ingredients:

CAKE 2½ cups flour

2 heaping teaspoons baking soda

3 eggs, beaten 1 cup sugar 2/3 cup honey

1¼ cup brewed coffee 6 tablespoons canola oil

6 tablespoons can Salt

Pinch cinnamon

APPLE CONFIT

3 apples, peeled and sliced thinly crosswise

1 cup sugar

l vanilla bean, split

2 cinnamon sticks

1 tablespoon honey

3 cloves



Directions: For the Cake

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Combine the flour and baking soda in a mixing bowl and whisk well. Set aside. Combine the eggs, sugar, honey, coffee, canola oil, ½ teaspoon salt, and cinnamon. Mix on low speed until blended. Add the flour mixture and continue mixing just until combined. Divide the batter evenly between two pans. Bake until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 30 minutes.

For the Apples

Preheat the oven to 275°F. Toss the apple slices with sugar, vanilla, cinnamon, honey, and cloves. Arrange in a single layer in an ovenproof skillet or a baking pan. Add enough water to just cover the apples. Press a sheet of parchment onto the surface of the water.

Put the skillet over medium-high heat and bring to a simmer, cover tightly in foil, and transfer to the oven. Bake until the apples are just tender, about 1 hour. Cool to room temperature, transfer to a lidded container, and chill until cold. Serve apples on top of a slice of honey cake.

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



<u>Invisible Lines of Connection</u> is a unique kind of book. It was written by Rabbi Lawrence Kushner, who is an author, lecturer, and past Rabbi of Congregation Beth El in Sudbury Massachusetts. Perhaps a number of you have already heard of him. Through his works, he helps the reader and/or listener find inspiration and strength, something which we could definitely use today. What's interesting about this particular book is that it talks about his everyday encounters with people close to

him and others, and somehow gains spiritual insight. We are helped to learn that there can be a new meaning in such common moments such as fighting with his children or watching a movie. Finally, the title of his book starts to make sense.

His stories fall into four categories: Reverence, Inheritance, Responsibility, and Connection. I'll give you a few examples of what he has written. The titles of the stories are italicized.

Ability to Respond

The author uses the movie "A Clear and Present Danger" in which Harrison Ford plays the acting director of the CIA caught and nearly murdered in a secret war between the President of the US and the Colombian drug cartel. His enemies believe there are only shades of "moral gray" and that Ford is just a "boy scout". But Ford believes that you can know the difference between right and wrong. He and a friend go into the Colombian jungle and search for survivors of an American commando team, wanting to save them even though their existence and betrayal has been hidden from him. Only one survivor remains and the commando asks: "Who is responsible for this?" Ford steps forward and says "I am." That is what the author believes is the importance of his story - the words "I am responsible." Ford takes responsibility even though he was not responsible! He is risking his life to try to fix what others have done. That's heroism! He is forgetting about his own self-interest. The rest of the story discusses the word "responsible" which really has two different meanings. One is about "guilt, blame and punishment, as in "Who's responsible for this mess?" The second meaning is about moral maturity as in "She is a very responsible person." So the first means "blame", whereas the second refers to "able to respond. But conversely, one who is not guilty nevertheless might still be responsible. Everyday, situations arise which require the action of a responsible person." How true!

Stamp Collecting

The first story in the book is actually the Introduction. Rabbi Kushner talks about his uncle's love of collecting stamps, and then the author, as a young boy, started to collect them - first commemoratives, then topical stamps with a common theme (his were trains). Of course, with his father, he would sit and track the value of his "investments" in the Scott's catalogue. But what the author loved the most was the "aesthetic" joy of arranging and rearranging the stamps into many different designs in his stamp album. He said that "each new configuration gave another nuance of meaning to every individual stamp." After 40 years and having forgotten about his childhood hobby, Rabbi Kushner eyed a display of US commemorative issues in the post office. As he mailed his package, he bought a half sheet of stamps featuring different jazz musicians. What's the meaning of all of this that the author arrived at? He wrote: "The stories in our lives are like the pages of a stamp album. We find ourselves collecting and reassembling ordinary, even trivial, pieces of our childhood, trying through different rearrangements, to comprehend their meaning. Perhaps if I put these on this page and move those to another, then add one from the stamp book, the page will look right and finally make sense. That's what we do. We take memories which are only distilled stories, add new ones, and, in so doing, redefine their meaning and the shape of our lives." Actually, Rabbi Kushner felt one of the reasons he became a rabbi was he was with people "during the most transformative moments of their lives, and expected to help them make those moments coherent and meaningful." Sometimes we do much the same thing - moving thoughts around in our minds, just to make sense of numerous things that have happened in our lives.

There are quite a few stories in this book. As the front flap of the book cover states: "Kushner ties together the stories of our lives into a roadmap showing how everything 'ordinary' is supercharged with meaning - if we can just see it ." There really are "invisible lines of connection"!

To check out this book from our library, it will be located in the third section of bookcases, third shelf down on the left.. Here you will also find a small wooden box and the other books I have reviewed since Passover. Remove a slip from the box, fill it out and put it back in the box. When you decide to return the book, just place it back on the shelf where it was originally located.

The following are excerpts from an article by *Aiden Pink, who is the deputy news editor of the Forward*:

Dr. Anthony Fauci, the director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, recently made the following comments in a conference call organized by an organization of Orthodox rabbis:

"There will almost certainly be virus around in the fall and winter," Fauci said. "Whether there's a second wave or not will depend on our prepared-

ness and our ability, when infections reappear, if we can put the lid on them by identification, isolation and contact tracing. If we have that in place in September, October, November, even though there could be cases, we should be able to handle it."

Fauci also answered several questions about how synagogues could transition to opening up safely. Most states have still banned synagogues and other houses of worship from opening, and in states where they are legally allowed to do so, literally no shuls have opened their doors.

OU executive vice president Rabbi Moshe Hauer, who moderated the discussion, said that their synagogues were already planning on having people wear masks, hold multiple services with stagger start times so as to limit attendance to 10, and have people stand eight feet apart — farther than the recommended six feet, because with Jews, "eight feet becomes six feet."

"The kind of social interaction that is the core of the beauty of your culture has unfortunately led to a situation of higher risk," Fauci agreed.

The doctor also recommended that elderly people and others with high-risk factors should be "the last people" allowed to return to synagogues as part of their phased re-openings.
