Make the commitment to be there with us, all together, when it happens.


We'll be at the front door waiting with smiles on (without or under the masks) as soon as it's truly safe for us all to be here.

We are happy to report that Len Epstein is at home recuperating after having broken his leg in a fall last month. Speedy recovery Len!



Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



Here we are, another month with the COVID-19 threat, and I think that might still mean many of you are concentrating on more reading, if not more computer activities as well as TV. So it's a great time to think about checking out one of our library books that has a lot of meaningful ideas we can think about. That book is <u>Torah Dynamics - Pirkei Avot Looks at Life</u>, written by two men - Samson Krupnick, an accountant and descendant of Rabbi Levi Yitchak of Berdichev who has taught *Pirkei Avot* for over 50 years, and Dr.

Morris Mandel, an educator, guidance counselor, and family therapist, as well as a newspaper columnist who wrote in the *Jewish Press*. He is also the author of many books.

I have chosen this book, not only because of its interesting and meaningful content for us and our present lives, but because of the way the writers went about discussing *Pirkei Avot*. Instead of just giving you a copy of it, they chose to divide their book into topics that make it more crucial to our understanding of it - something that will make more sense, is more organized, and helps us think about individual subjects. It seems to be a novel approach - just take a specific topic, and follow it through the *Mishnayot*, adding other sources to enrich the discussion.

Pirkei Avot (Ethics of the Fathers) consists of the five original chapters of the Mishnah Tractate Avot and the added 6th chapter called Kinyan Torah. Pirkei Avot is the most popular and widely known of all the 63 tractates of the Mishnah - recited and studied publicly each Sabbath between Passover and Rosh Hashanah. Sixty-two of the sixty-three short books that make up the Mishnah are legal texts, with topics such as blessings and the laws of the Sabbath. But only Pirkei Avot does not deal with the laws. It is concerned with things based on human experience and is a guide to Jewish ethics. Its contents are practical even though its words are spiritual. Hillel is frequently mentioned in Pirkei Avot, as are many leading rabbinic scholars from different generations who have contributed to the "Oral Law" of Judaism.

I'm going to refer to a few topics and show you how the book is set up. When you read it, you will see the authors use examples from *Pirkei Avot* and combine them with other sources from other places in our bible, then include an interesting and clear discussion. So the main focus of the book are the topics, forcing us to think about each of them and how they may affect our lives. Let me give you a few examples.

Time

This is a topic emphasized in *Pirkei Avot*. We conclude we must use it wisely - making the most out of it when it is available. In AVOT I:14, Hillel asks: "And if not now, then when?" How many of us say " I'll do that tomorrow," but then it never gets done - perhaps due to something else coming up unexpectedly (visitors, a repair in our house that must be done right away, and yes, even Zooming or Facetime!) We can also count a feeling of lethargy or laziness that overtakes us even though we never planned for it.

The authors also bring in other sources such as Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 where King Solomon wrote:" To every thing there is a season and a time for every purpose...." So every point in time has a particular purpose, different for everyone. The discussion in the book says: "It has been wisely said that the future requires the past." Since our use of time will provide concrete illustration to those who come after us, we must set standards and values that are worthy of emulation. Although the past cannot be brought back, if it can teach lessons, then it will shape and mold the future." We can learn from everything - but do we?

Topic - The Futility of Anger

Aristotle once said: "Anyone can become angry - that is easy. But to be angry with the right person, and to the right degree, and at the right time, and for the right purpose, and in the right way - that is not within everyone's power and is not easy." We all know that anger is part of our lives, for some more than others. We can look back on our lives and see where anger played a part. In today's world we see much anger on social media, whether it be tweets or recordings of protesters and wrongdoers, It's frustrating! It seems anger never stops. But it's best to turn to our own religion and see what our people said about anger, and then, of course, think about it. The authors have given us a quote from Avot *V;11*. Here we read "There are four kinds of dispositions: He who is easily provoked and easily pacified - his gain is cancelled by his loss. He who is difficult to provoke and difficult to pacify - his loss is cancelled by his gain. He who is difficult to provoke and easily pacified - is a pious man. He who is easily provoked and difficult to pacify - is a wicked man." Another example is in Avot IV:18: "Do not attempt to pacify your fellow man in the time of his anger." Think about that one. In the time of anger, a person cannot really accept an apology or offer one. This chapter is full of other bits of wisdom found in Proverbs and many stated by rabbis during that time period. The authors also offer a meaningful discussion of what the chapter contains.

So now you've seen a few examples of what the book holds. You might also wonder what other topics the book discusses, so I'll list them below.



This certainly is a great list of topics to take time to contemplate!

The authors also include a helpful section called "Historical Background and Biographies of the Sages in Order of Their Reference in Pirkei Avot." You will also find the English and Hebrew texts of *Pirkei Avot*t. These are both in the back of the book. There is also a glossary.

With a mixture of subjects, Talmudic materials, biblical references, stories from our rabbis, and parables, we find we have an extremely thought-provoking book in our library. For ages, people have been pondering the topics included in *Pirkei Avot* and other historical sources mentioned. Today is no different -we think about and discuss these same topics during much of our lives. Because of present events, we may find even more meaning within its pages. With a little more time on our hands due to the pandemic, why don't we use a book that is a way to help us make more sense out of our lives and what we have to face. I highly recommend <u>Torah Dynamics</u>.


