

Presumably, we are there now. Some of us will be happy, some not so. That is the ruthless act of democracy. Democracy challenges our vision of our lives and faith. It is the act of working, within structure, to address or advance, the outcome of requests for citizen input. The act of voting itself is an act of intrinsic faith, no different than accepting the word of God, the belief that the joining of visions makes a vision greater. Having to join, through negotiation, polar opposite ideas, makes us stronger, but only if we agree to the concept of a middle where all get something, and no one gets everything.





Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



I can't believe it's already Fall. With the pandemic, it just seems like one day flows into another and we lose track of time - we even forget what day it is! With the High Holidays behind us - with all of it's solemnity, I thought I would change direction this month and review a "light-hearted" book". Of course in Judaism, that means it must be about Jewish humor. With the seriousness of events all

around us, perhaps we all need to laugh a little. I found a book in our library called <u>Old Jews Telling Jokes</u>, by Sam Hoffman with Eric Spiegelman. As Mel Brooks once said, it's "chock full of funny stuff."

This book was born in an abandoned warehouse in Highland Park, New Jersey, with twenty of the author's father's friends and relatives. There was even a set, and nobody could be a joke-teller under sixty years of age, thus making sure the joke-tellers had a lifetime of experiences to use for their jokes. Later the jokes actually went "viral" and were heard six million times! The idea spread and more people joined and were even filmed in New York City and in Los Angeles, and there were plans to shoot in Florida and London.

The book has been categorized into chapters concerning topics relevant to Jewish life. Some of these topics that are included are: The Jewish Mother, Who are the Jews, Coming to America, Moving to the Suburbs, the Rabbi, Food, Husbands and Wives, Illness and Doctors, Getting Old and more. Please note that <u>some</u> jokes are "adult in nature", but they are really quite "tame" as compared to some of the jokes floating around today.

Humor is a large and necessary part of Judaism. With so much *tsores* in Jewish history, once in a while we need to include a little humor - something that makes us release some of our tension.

I'm going to give you a few examples of what is in the book. If you smile even a little, and for a short time you are in another world, then here's the book you need to check out of the library.

Joke #1, "Kleptomaniac" submitted by Harry Macklowe, a real estate developer who said: "I grew up listening to my parents' generation of comedians, Jack Benny, Henny Youngman, Myron Cohen, instilling in me a lifelong appreciation of a well-told joke."

A couple is in a supermarket. She has a problem, though. She steals; she's a kleptomaniac. She steals a can of fruit and is taken before the magistrate.

The magistrate says, "Sarah, how could you do something like that? What did you take?"

She says, "Well, I just took one can of peaches."

"Peaches you took? How many peaches?"

"I think there were six peaches in the can."

"Sarah. You are going to go to jail for six nights. That's it, it's final."

"Oh my God."

Her husband stands up. "Your honor, she also stole a can of peas."

Joke #2, "My Son, the President", submitted by Dennis Spiegelman, a man who deals in antique and collectible objects. Subject-wise, this is a very timely joke!

It's the year 2016, and a Jew has been elected president. He calls his mother and says, "Ma, I'm the president of the United States! Are you coming to the inauguration?"

She says, "Eh, well, I've got nothing to wear."

He says. "Ma, I'm gonna be the president. I can get you a dressmaker."

She says, "Eh, well, I only eat kosher."

"Ma, I'm gonna be president! I can get you a kosher meal."

She says, "Eh, well, how am I gonna get there?"

"Ma, I can get you Air Force One. Come to the inaugural."

She ends up at the inaugural and they're on the reviewing stand.

On the left side of her are all the Supreme Court justices; on the right side is the president's cabinet.

She nudges the guy to her right and say's, "you see that guy with his hand up? His brother's a doctor!"

Just to let you know, to get the most from these jokes, it helps to read them aloud, or even better, to someone else if they are around. Use the inflection of your voice as if the words were said by your grandparents or anyone else who might have spoken Yiddush.

To take out this book from the library, when the temple re-opens, you will find them on the left side of the room on a shelf that also has a small wooden box. Remove a slip, fill it out and return it to the box. When you return the book, just put it back where you found it.

For Thanksgiving, many of you might be sitting around your table, and joining friends and family over the internet,, zooming and enjoying the holiday together. I know I am thankful for the technology we have so that we can do this! Please, have a Happy Thanksgiving and stay safe!




