Ingredients

½ cup pareve margarine

8 ounces semisweet chocolate, chopped

5 eggs, separated.

3/4 cup white sugar

1 cup ground almonds

PASSOVER CHOCOLATE TORTE



Directions


Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Line bottom and sides of a 9 inch springform pan with foil. Grease foil. Melt margarine and chocolate over low heat. Stir until smooth and let cool.

In a medium-size mixing bowl, beat whites until stiff; about 2 minutes. In a separate bowl, beat together yolks and sugar until thick and pale; about 1 minute. Blend in chocolate mixture and stir in almonds. Fold in beaten whites, 1/3 at a time, into chocolate until no streaks of white remain. Scrape into prepared pan.

Place an 8 inch baking pan with 1 inch of water in it on the bottom rack of the oven (to make the torte more moist).

Bake torte on center rack at 350 degrees for 45 to 50 minutes, or until sides begin to pull away from pan and top is set in center. Cover the torte loosely with foil for the last 20 minutes of baking. Note: Don't worry if the cake cracks because the top will be on the bottom later. Cool on wire rack for 10 minutes and then carefully remove sides of pan. Invert onto a serving plate and cool completely.

Seventy-six years have passed since the Nazi concentration camps were liberated and the Holocaust that claimed six million Jewish lives came to an end. To ensure that six million did not die in vain and that the Holocaust never happens again, Temple Beth El Israel will join Jews throughout the United States and around the world by participating in the **Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle Holocaust Commemoration.** To keep alive the memories of the Six Million who perished.

The Yom HaShoah Candle is modeled after a traditional Jewish Yahrzeit memorial candle that burns for 24 hours during periods of mourning. This reminds us of the yellow arm bands that Jews were forced to wear during the Nazi regime.

As the years pass, the memories of those who were victims in this ultimate hate crime must not diminish. We encourage you family to light a yellow candle at

Sundown, Friday, April 9th, 2021

and join us in our actual Holocaust Memorial Yizkor Service that same night so that we will continue to increase the awareness of the Holocaust and help perpetuate our commitment to our people - particularly, since recently, there has been a marked increase in incidents of anti-Semitism.

The memory is important! The number of Holocaust survivors is rapidly diminishing with each passing day. As we lose this precious link, those who deny that the Holocaust never happened gain strength. Sadly, a study conducted reported that 22 percent of millennials (23 to 38 years old) say they have not even heard of the Holocaust.

Once again, please join us in the lighting of the enclosed candle in memory of our six million brothers and sisters and responding to our request for *Tzedekah*.







"A picture is worth a thousand words". We've all heard that at one time or another, and I'm sure we know it to be true. So many ideas, even complex ones, can be triggered by looking at a picture or photograph. In fact, many times these images can give us more information than any verbal description can provide. By looking at a photo, it's possible to discover a stronger meaning or emotions than any words we read. For example, if we

are reading an article about the dangers of smoking, nothing can "hit" us more than a picture of diseased lungs. If we are trying to figure out how a machine works, it's easier to understand more about it if an illustration is included with the text. Put both together - words and pictures, then you will have something even more monumental and meaningful. That is exactly what Elie Wiesel did when he wrote the book I am reviewing here - <u>After The Darkness</u> (Reflections on the Holocaust), a timely book because Yom Hashoah is on April 8th this year.

In the past, Wiesel has written about his experiences as a survivor of the Holocaust, as in his well-known book, Night. In the book I am reviewing, he writes directly about the Holocaust that is "lavishly illustrated" with many photographs, most of which I and probably you, have never seen before. He starts with the creation of the Third Reich, and includes specific topics such as the war, the gas chambers, liberation, and finally, a memory of what was. He criticized Western leaders such as Churchill and Roosevelt for what they knew and unfortunately chose to ignore. He praises the heroes, even if they are not well-known. And we hear from the testimonies of the survivors including important information about Hitler's rise to power, Kristalnacht, life in the ghettos and in the concentration camps, the liberation of those camps and then the displaced persons camps. We learn from the introduction to the book what made us stand out as victims - after all, other groups were put in concentration camps. However, Wiesel stated: ""But if not all the victims were Jews, only the Jews were all victims." You should know that because Wiesel uses words and photographs, he is setting us up for an emotional roller coaster ride.

The book is set up according to different years, starting with 1933 and ending in 2002. Underneath the year are the words of a survivor -that alone takes you on an emotional journey. These appear on a flap which, when opened, completes the photograph beneath it. Beside the photograph(s) appears Wiesel's words which make up the text and fills us in on the background of what is going on during that time period. We read information that gives us a clearer picture of the horrors of that time - for example, in 1937, Hitler had ordered his medical service to eliminate the mentally handicapped and people with severe illnesses. And not a single doctor objected. (Remember, this pertained to all handicapped Germans). This operation stopped only when a courageous German bishop spoke against it in 1941 from his pulpit. But the method of using gas was perfected and ready when it came time to kill the Jews.

Let me mention the photographs. There is so much to be learned from them - we see the contentment of faces before Hitler began his Final Solution. We see female friends together, smiling, we see a photo of a Zionist youth group in Czechoslovakia in 1932 - with its young, smiling faces. We then see the pictures which are tormenting to see - a woman holding onto an outdoor balcony as the SS soldiers wait below for her, a man coming out from his hiding place below the floor of a bunker in Warsaw, Jews from the Lodz ghetto boarding deportation trains bound for a death camp, children in Auschwitz, wearing adult-size prison jackets - looking out through the barbed wire fencing, a warehouse in Auschwitz overflowing with clothes taken from prisoners, and Jewish prisoners from Buchenwald taken to the woods awaiting their execution - some are holding hands. I found two photographs troubling, if not mind-boggling. They were of the time after Liberation. One was of survivors of the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp, peeling potatoes - yet in the background are corpses piled up.

Second is a picture from 1945 of a British soldier driving a bulldozer, clearing corpses in Bergen-Belsen. Where is the sanctity of life? With these photos, the saying "A picture is worth a thousand words" applies over and over again. Thankfully, when the book moves on, we see the joy in the faces of survivors at Dachau as they celebrate the arrival of American troops, Kibbutz members dancing the hora in a displaced persons camp, and survivors on a train, "experiencing" the feeling of freedom after having read the sides of this train which said, "Hitler Kapout".

As Wiesel writes and we look at the photographs, our minds are forced to do a lot of thinking. This is not a long book, yet it contains so much! While both reading this book and viewing its photos, you are bound to feel so many emotions. Wie sel is really the best person to take us through both the horrible and happy times. His talent is both memorable and remarkable. Of all the books I have reviewed, this one should not be missed. As is written within its pages, it is "a fitting memorial to those who suffered and perished."




