From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

L'Shana Tova Tikateyvu - May you be written in the book of life. We are about to enter into the High Holiday "season". We start our "New Year" with a wish that the person we are speaking to will, hopefully, let us be written in the Book of Life for another year.



We spend our holidays reawakening our hearts to the fulfillment of that wish yet, what do we Do with that wish? For others - do we take advantage of the next year and perform mitzvot of caring, sharing and doing? Or is it more talking about, passing stories about, watching from a distance when another needs help. Some-

times what they need is peace and solitude - do we see that or are we inserting ourselves in their lives for our own needs? Perhaps it's possible for us this year to learn the Art of Selfless Giving.

A Mitzvah a Day - looking around for a way to be helpful without intruding, a way to support those in spiritual need, being helpful to one with a physical need, being an ear to those needing emotional support. Play a bit of a game - a challenge if you will - this year. Your actions - your doing, (forgive me - your Jewing) that will allow God to consider you for induction into the 36...If you start, just start, to come close, at the end of Yom Kippur, when the words: May you be written in the book of Life are uttered; you will notice one word is changed - written is changed to the more important and lasting inscription: May you be INSCRIBED in the book of life. Your deeds will be the arbiter of whether or not you are being considered for membership. And remember little mmmmmmmmm's add up.

Let us change our wishes to actions!! One a day.... L'Shana Tova Tikateyvu - May you be inscribed this year..... It'll take a little more work, but it's worth it...




BROTHERHOOD NEWS:





This month's Stamp Corner features a set of three postage stamps issued by Israel in 2012 that mark the High Holy Days with depictions of key events that occur during Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, and Sukkot. This year, all three holidays fall in September (during the month of Tishrei on the Jewish Calendar).

The Rosh Hashanah stamp features the act of Tashlikh. On the afternoon of the first day of Rosh Hashanah (this year, September 7), it is customary to go to the seashore or some other body of water and symbolically cast away any sins that have accrued during the past year. Tashlikh means "cast off" in Hebrew, and the practice stems from the biblical verse, "You shall cast all their sins into the depths of the sea" (Micah 7:19). Some participants throw breadcrumbs they bring in their pockets into the water and then shake out their clothing as a symbol of shaking off or renouncing their transgressions.

The Yom Kippur stamp depicts the recitation of the Kol Nidrei prayer, which opens services on Erev Yom Kippur (this year, September 15). Kol Nidrei, which means "all vows" in Aramaic, expresses repentance for all vows, oaths, and promises made to God, but unfulfilled, during the year. In a unique and moving ceremony, the cantor, rabbi, and musicians repeat the prayer three times, chanting it with a special melody. Worshippers wrap themselves in their tallit prayer shawls; it is the only time during the year that the tallit is worn during an evening prayer service. The Sukkot stamp shows a worshipper "bearing the lulav (palm frond)." During the Sukkot morning prayer (this year, the first day of Sukkot is September 21), worshippers bless four plants mentioned in the Torah: "On the first day you shall take the product of citron trees, branches of palm leaves, boughs of leafy trees, and willows of the brook" (Leviticus 23:40). The custom is called "bearing the lulav" because the palm frond is the largest and most prominent of the four species. The palm branches, braided together, are held in the right hand, and an etrog (citron) is held in the left hand; the two are brought together and shaken in unison.



Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



This has been an unbelievable year. It seems to have flown by quickly -

I can't fathom that the High Holydays are almost here. From all of the problems we have faced over the past 12 months dealing with Covid, two good things have come out of them. We are fortunate to have the vaccine to better protect us and we are now able to worship in our sanctuary in person on Shabbat with proof of the COVID vaccination and masks and social distancing.

In a way, we are also fortunate that this season provides us with the sweetness from the many foods we will eat. As a result, this month's book review will provide the possibility of adding more sweetness into our lives.

The recipe below is from Richard Schnabolk's second three-ring binder full of recipes which is named Jewish Apple Cake* (you might remember his delicious collection of kugel recipes I shared with you for Shavuot). Actually, his notebook contains not only "Jewish Apple Cakes", but also "Apple Cakes". You might ask: what's the difference between the two? Easy answer! "Jewish Apple Cake" is pareve and can be used with both meat and dairy meals, but an "Apple Cake" contains dairy ingredients and is not used with meat meals if you are more traditional. Variations of both kinds of cake are found in this book.

Let me give you a recipe which uses two symbols of the New Year – apples and honey. It appears in Richard's binder and was originally printed in *The Washington Post*.

*Apple Cake with Honey Sauce *

1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees 2. Lightly grease and flour a 10-inch tube pan. 4-5 firm apples, peeled and cut into 1/4-inch slices 3. In a medium bowl, combine the cinnamon and 1/41 cup of canola oil cup of the sugar 2 tsp cinnamon 4. Add the apples and toss to combine. Set aside 4 large eggs 5. In a large bowl, using an electric mixer on medium 2 1/4 cups sugar speed, combine the remaining sugar, flour, baking pow-1/3 cup of orange juice der, oil, eggs, orange juice, salt and vanilla extract 3 cups flour, plus more for dusting the pan 6.Beat just until the batter is smooth 1/2 tsp salt 7. Pour an inch of the batter into the prepared pan and 1 Tbs of baking powder top it with a layer of apple slices, taking care not to let 2 1/2 tsp vanilla extract the apples touch the side of the pan: then add alternating layers of apple slices and batter, ending with the batter. You should have 4 layers of batter and 3 of apples. 8. Bake for 1 1/2 hours, or until a toothpick inserted in the cake comes out clean *Ingredients for the honey sauce*: 9. Cool in the pan for 30 minutes on a wire rack, then turn the cake out onto the rack to cool thoroughly

1 cup honey 1 cup apple juice or cider

For the honey sauce:

1. In a medium saucepan over medium-high heat, combine the honey and apple

juice or cider and bring to a boil.

2. Stirring constantly, continue boiling until the mixture thickens, 1 to 2 minutes.

3. For a thicker sauce, reduce the heat to low and cook, stirring a few minutes more, until it reaches the desired consistency

Serve the cake with the warm honey sauce on the side or with whipped cream.

Here are a few other examples of what is included in the binder. I give both summary statements and specific examples. 1. Cakes using alcohol such as rum brandy or bourbon

2. Many are Bundt or tube cakes

3. Some mention specific types of apples to use, and one even uses apples and pears

4. Some cakes have glazes, such as maple glaze, cider glaze, and one that uses a sauce made up of butter, brown sugar and cream

5. There are cakes that use additional ingredients such as pumpkin pie spice, raisins, currants, coconut, and even cream cheese.

The photos are great, guaranteed to make you want to start baking. These cakes are perfect to make for Rosh Hashana, for the Yom Kippur break-fast, or for any time of the year. There are so many different varieties of cakes to look at which will ensure what we yearn for - a sweet(er) New Year!


