


From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

Todah the Hebrew word for "thanks". An easy word to throw around, without much thought. But what is true thankfulness? Is it seeing what your life contains and saying thanks to those around you who helped create that thankful

needed sight to find the way to that end goal?

I once spent several months asking people of many different nationalities, jobs, lifestyles if they were "happy" with how there lives were going. I still ask people in different professions a similar question: "Is it what you hoped it would be - this job you have?" Are you happy and does that happiness translate into thankful?



Our tradition teaches many answers. Many of our ancestors had deeply held and connected relationships with their (and subsequently, our) God. Being chosen for a task, while almost never easy, was filled with honor and commitment. Moses only reticently went to Pharoah and, even then, only after begging God NOT to send him! Far too many of our teachers were, and are, far too overwhelmed by living as we have chosen, as God's frontline, as the receivers of Torah, as the "Chosen Ones" to consider all that we have to be thankful for. It's true that anti-semitism has always been the shadow that has followed us where ever we have lived. We are usually welcomed when we are fairly quiet in our Jewish heritage.

I am thankful for so many things I don't speak of every day. During this month, when we are notified, as Americans, that November 25 is THE day to give thanks, that there are 364 other days that matter as well.

Our ancestors shouldered the burden of living in a "right way" and were thankful for the pressure that opportunity brings. Let us do the same. There are many ways to do that... Abraham argued with God, Lot simply said "OK" and complied with God'srequests.

Perhaps those requests were the answer to humanities quest to be. Right, do it right, and look for other chances to be the people we imagine ourselves to be.

May we all be thankful every day and use November 25 as only a reminder that there are 364 more to go as we continue to carry that weight.

Enjoy your repast, give thanks not only for one meal, but for our lives. Add 1 small mitzvah a day, or if that's too many - 1 a week will be great. Let's make this the year of Mitzvah madness and show our incredible gratitude for what we have, and more importantly, who we have in our lives. Todah (thanks) Rabbah (great or many)

This month, we feature a 1996 "joint issue" from Israel and the United States that celebrates Hanukkah. The holiday commemorates the victory of the Maccabees, a family of Jewish patriots, over Greek-Syrian oppressors in 164 B.C.E. This year, Hanukkah begins at sundown on Sunday, November 28, and ends at nightfall on Monday, December 6 (Kislev 25-Tevet 2, 5782).

Each Hanukkah, we light candles for eight days, beginning on the first evening, adding one light each night on the hanukkiah, the nine-branch Hanukkah menorah (the ninth candle, the shammes, is used to light the other eight). In purifying the Temple in Jerusalem, after it had been liberated by the Maccabees, the priests found just one night's worth of oil for the only menorah that had not been rendered impure by the Greeks. But the oil lasted for eight days and nights -- the miracle of Hanukkah! The lighting of the Hanukkah candles today represents a victory of light over darkness, of bravery of the few against the many, and the struggles for freedom of faith and national liberty of a people in their own homeland.

The two stamps, which feature nine colorful Hanukkah candles, have some philatelic significance. They were the first stamps to be jointly issued by Israel and the United States; the Israeli stamp was the country's first self-adhesive issue; and the U.S. stamp was the first to recognize a Jewish holiday. In creating the artwork, American graphic designer Hannah Smotrich paid special attention to the colors "to emphasize the upbeat nature of a playful, joyous holiday." The tab at the bottom of the Israeli stamp also depicts three sides of a dreidel and the phrase, in Hebrew, "a great miracle happened here."

This year marks the 25th anniversary of America's first Hanukkah stamp. There have been seven succeeding designs since 1996; the most recent stamp, issued last year, featured a girl and a boy lighting a hanukkiah.

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



The Book of Psalms holds much meaning for many individuals – myself included. Take a Bible, sit down and turn to them. You will find they bring you comfort, hope and solace - all that make up spiritual healing. Our library has a book titled *Healing of Soul, Healing of Body*, edited by Rabbi Simka Y. Weintraub, CSW. This book is intended to help those people struggling with illness or helping someone who is ill. It is a book meant to provide the reader with some sort of "spiritual healing". Within its pages, you will find 10

of the 150 psalms which were designated by Rabbi Nachman of Breslov as "the healing psalms". How welcome something like this is in a world that suffers both physically and mentally in the age of Covid -19 and other events that test our sanity! These are the poems of "pain and praise, of humility and hope".

This book begins with a section - "How to Use This Book", made up of suggestions of how to approach these 10 Psalms. It discusses the real difficulty of translating them and why this happens. After all, there are so many words, phrases, and usages that are "downright obscure if not impossible to grasp."

Next there is an Introduction which you should read. Included in it are things such as:

- Who was Rabbi Nachman of Breslov?
- The Ten Kinds of Song: Prayer as Dialogue How should we recite these Psalms? Mere recitation is not enough. To answer this question, ten spiritual leaders from different denominations, personalities, and

backgrounds shared their "bridge" to the Psalms. Their approaches are different. They offer introductions, commentaries, and personal statements - all to discuss how to seek meaning and healing from the Psalms (each of their backgrounds are found in the back of the book, pp. 105-107). Guidance for your reading of this book is in the section "How to Use This Book. Some of its topics are:

- What is Tikkun?
- The Ten Psalms as a Unit To explain this, the author lists all of the healing Psalms and what each offers. For example, the beautiful Psalm 42 stresses how we yearn for God, and Psalm 41 speaks about sickness and its accompanying suffering endured by many. Psalm 150 is described as; "a paean and musical symphony of praises."
- Tzedakah: Elevating the Material as Part of the Tikkun where the reader realizes that those that are ill can still reach out to others in need, providing concern. For example, those that were or are ill can repair the world with such things as volunteering in shelters or in fundraisers for medical research. Doing these activities then brings new meaning to their own lives.

The book concentrates on one Psalm per chapter. You may read the Psalm in Hebrew located at the top of every page. On the top of the page on the right, you will find the Psalm's translation. On the bottom of the page are the author's remarks. The chapters are short, but long enough to convey important ideas. To see the different ways each of the writers deals with his or her Psalm is interesting, and the reader is sure to end each chapter with emotions quite high.

At the conclusion of the book, there is a helpful list of suggested reading. This includes not only books about the Psalms, but sources including resources related to Jewish Spiritual Healing in times of illness, and even books to further explore the life, stories, and teachings of Rabbi Nachman of Breslov.

To conclude, I felt I had to include a poem submitted by Rabbi Sheldon Zimmerman, a former president of Hebrew Union College -Jewish Institute of Religion. It should help all of you during this stressful time period, and hopefully will prepare you to contemplate reading this book.

Here's an easy recipe for a great Pumpkin pie...

1 8oz package of cream cheese 1 1/4 cups pumpkin

1/4 cup sugar 1 teaspoon flour

1 teaspoon vanilla 1/4 teaspoon ginger 1 egg 1/4 teaspoon nutmet

1 8 inch unbaked deep dish pie crust 1/2 teaspoon salt

1 can evaporated milk


Combine softened cream cheese, sugar & vanilla 2 eggs 2 tablespoons water 1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Combine the remaining ingredients in a blender, carefully pour over the cream cheese mixture.

Bake at 350° for an hour until set.

Cool, Brush with maple syrup or top with whip cream.
