


#### From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

#### THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ REMEMBERING THE FIRST JEWISH WOMAN ASTRONAUT

The postage stamp for this month, depicting astronaut Judith Resnik, was issued by the Central African Republic after the Space Shuttle *Challenger* was destroyed during its launch on January 28, 1986. Resnik, in 1984 the first Jewish woman in space, was one of the seven crew members who perished when the shuttle experienced a hydrogen leak and broke apart 73 seconds into its flight; it disintegrated over the Atlantic Ocean off the coast of Cape Canaveral. The disaster resulted in a 32-month hiatus in the Space Shuttle program as a commission, created by Pres. Reagan, investigated the fatal incident, eventually recommending new safety features on the shuttles.

The 36-year-old Resnik was the second American woman in space, after Sally Ride, and the fourth woman overall. She grew up in Akron, Ohio, the daughter of Jewish immigrants who were originally from Ukraine. An outstanding student, she attained a perfect score on her SAT college admissions test, the only young woman in the country to do so that year. She earned a B.S. degree in electrical engineering from the Carnegie Institute of Technology (now Carnegie Mellon University), and a Ph.D. in the same subject from the University of Maryland. She was also a classical pianist and gourmet cook.

In 1978, Resnik was recruited at age 28 into the NASA Astronaut Corps, one of only six women selected out of 8000 applicants. At the time of her death, she had logged almost 145 hours in space. She helped engineer and fabricate the shuttle's robotic arm, used to capture solar power, which she was responsible for operating on the maiden voyage of the Space Shuttle *Discovery* in 1984. The fateful 1986 mission was to be Resnik's second in space.

Judith Resnick's legacy continues to inspire people from all walks of life. She has had several schools, lecture halls, and landmarks named for her since her death. The Society of Women Engineers has also recognized women innovators in the space industry with their Resnik Challenger Medal.

Her funeral, at Temple Israel in Akron, attracted 1000 attendees, including astronauts and other dignitaries. She is buried in Arlington National Cemetery.

The Central African Republic has issued a number of stamps, popular among collectors, depicting astronauts and spacecraft from different countries. To date, Resnik has not appeared on a U.S. stamp.



### Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow

Welcome back to Part 2 of my review of \*The Ten Journeys of Life\* by Rabbi Michael Gold. Just to refresh your memory, we took a look at four of the Journeys: Identity, Maturity, Family and Property. Now let's move on to the remainder of the book.

5. "Anatomy - The Journey from Frailty to Health" Rabbi Gold has written: "Our bodies make us mortal. How we treat and understand ourselves as physical beings is the fifth journey of life." He discusses this by emphasizing that we are spiritual beings, part of which is "eternal and unchanging." Then, as physical, material beings, we are subject to the natural laws of biology and physics - and will eventually die. And we are the ones who "occupy our bodies and are responsible for their maintenance and well-being" while we are living. They are, so to speak, "given to us on loan." As temporary occupants, our bodies belong to

God, as undamaged as possible. This idea helps us to deal with some of life's perplexing problems such as abortion, euthanasia and experimental medical procedures. We need to care for our bodies, but do we do it less than caring for our homes and cars? Do we eat too much, eat the wrong foods, fail to exercise, not sleep and practice bad habits such as drinking? Do we allow stress to overtake us? Why is it easy to ignore the warning signals of our bodies? Do we take the easy way out? We are more apt to treat our bodies properly if we believe they are on loan, belonging to God, and something to be returned in the best shape possible.

Another idea Rabbi Gold brings up is the worship of "youth" in today's world. We learn that the older body should be respected -after all, it has survived, but it has also accumulated wisdom throughout the years of living. The author also writes that we dwell too much on "the perfect body" - looking like athletes, supermodels, etc. God created a variety of bodies, none of them perfect in the way we define perfection. The author concludes this chapter with a discussion about why we need our bodies, as fragile as they are, as he wrote: "the spirit needs the body, and the body needs the soul." Rabbi Gold's "Guideposts" for the fifth journey are extremely helpful. They need to be read and followed!

### 6. "ADVERSITY - The Journey from Pain to Healing"

Every life has some pain - it may be death of the body, divorce, illness, bankruptcy, the loss of dreams - to name only a few. The results are the feeling of being alone. In this chapter, the author traces our journey toward healing and wholeness - how we are able to cope, to continue and to move beyond the loss. These losses make us who we are, even when there is some pain left. " 'What makes me stronger' " are the words of the philosopher, Friedrich Wilheim Nietzsche, that the author included. Rabbi Gold reminds us that "there is a difference between healing and a cure. With healing, we live with our losses but find a sense of wholeness and purpose in our lives. One can experience joy, even after a loss. Rabbi Gold then discusses five necessary activities that lead us from pain to adversity - action, time, people, good deeds and faith. The majority of what follows are an explanation about those five activities, giving

meaningful examples along the way. Refer to the "Guideposts" list for helpful suggestions. For example, one suggests writing feelings of being overwhelmed. We also read the words; "This too shall pass." Time is a healer!

### 7. "SPIRITUALITY - The Journey from Doubt to Faith"

The author believes there is a spiritual force in the world even though it cannot be proven in a laboratory. We know the universe and everything in it is dying - all material things do. But there is a force in the universe that seems to create life. That is the spiritual. It is around us at all times. When we tune in to it, that is spirituality. Here is where religion comes in: it is to "develop methods of relating to the spiritual force."

Different faiths have different paths. Rabbi Gold then examines four different, but congruent, paths to spirituality -cultivating deep gratitude, spiritual disciplines, acts of separation and acts of loving kindness. In this section, we find out the following: how spirituality begins with a "thankyou" to the universe, the spiritual discipline includes prayer, ritual, meditation, song or dance, all allow us to cease

our everyday lives and "tune into" the spiritual world, why Shabbat has evolved, and we have a "rhythm of rest" when one is able to connect to God as easily in their community as on a mountain top. Once again, the suggestions in the Guidepost section are reliable and meaningful. Don't skip them!




