



The Jewish Calendar...

The Jewish calendar revolves around the moon. At the beginning of each month the moon appears as a thin curve. Over the next two weeks it grows daily. Once it hits its zenith in the middle of the month it begins to diminish until it can no longer be seen. After two days of invisibility it reappears as a thin crescent and the cycle begins again. The entire process takes 29.5 days. As a month must comprise of full days, the months are sometimes 29 days and sometimes 30.

The Torah schedules the Jewish Holidays according to the days of the month. For many centuries Jewish rhythm and law were not governed by a set calendar. Rather, the month's duration would be determined by the Sanhedrin (the Jewish Supreme Council). Based on when the following month's new moon was sighted, an intricate process involving witnesses who came from anywhere in the country, the Sanhedrin would determine the month's length.

In the 4th century CE the sage Hillel II realized that change was necessary. Recognizing that the Sanhedrin would be dissolved, he and his rabbinical court established the fixed calendar in a 19 year cycle which is used to this day.

The Torah states, "Guard the month of spring and make the Passover offering" so Passover must be observed in the spring. To this end, the Jewish lunar calendar must synchronize with the seasons, which are regulated by the sun. While a lunar year is approximately 354.4 days, a solar year is eleven days longer. If no adjustment is made, Passover would occur eleven days earlier each year, shifting into winter, fall, summer, and then spring again. The solution is to add an extra 30 day month into 7 of the 19 years, creating a 13-month year. This is called a shanah meuberet in Hebrew and in English a leap year.

This month is added to the final month of the year, Adar, so that in leap years we observe two Adars. As Adar is traditionally the most joyous month, the extra Adar is a gift of more happiness in the year. This year happens to have Adar I and Adar II.



THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ REMEMBERING THE FIRST ISRAELI ASTRONAUT





Last month's column featured a postage stamp of the first Jewish woman in space, Judith Resnik, who perished in the catastrophic 1986 *Challenger* Space Shuttle disaster. This month, we relate the disturbingly similar story of the first Israeli astronaut, Col. Ilan Ramon, who was killed when the *Columbia* Space Shuttle, carrying him and six American astronauts, exploded in the atmosphere above Texas, 19 years ago this month, February 1, 2003. The tragedy occurred during reentry after 16 days of flight, just minutes before the shuttle's planned landing; all seven on board died. Ramon is remembered on this 2004 Israeli stamp.

Ramon was born, as Ilan Wolfferman, in 1954 in Ramat Gan, Israel; he grew up in Beersheba, and graduated from the University of Tel Aviv with a degree in Electronics Engineering. He was a fighter pilot in the Israeli Air Force with thousands of hours of flying experience, served in the Sinai during the Yom Kippur War, was the youngest pilot who participated in Israel's 1981 air strike on Iraq's unfinished nuclear reactor, and participated in the 1982 Lebanon War.

The *Columbia* project had numerous ties to Israel. One of the scientific experiments on the flight -- research into the difference between the size of crystals on earth and their size in space -- was planned and prepared by Israeli school children. In experiments prepared by scientists from the University of Tel Aviv, the *Columbia* crew also investigated dust particles over the Mediterranean Sea, and looked at "sprites," a type of lightning that had not previously been studied.

Israelis and Jews around the world followed Ramon's flight with pride. Although personally non-religious, Ramon ate kosher food and observed Shabbos while in orbit, saying "I feel I am representing all Jews and all Israelis." He took with him into space a number of meaningful items, including flags of the Israeli president, the Israel Air Force, and the Israel Space Agency (ISA). Ramon, whose mother and grandmother were Holocaust survivors, also took along a drawing of the moon by a young Jewish boy who was murdered in Auschwitz, and a mezuzah made of barbed wire, another reference to the Holocaust. In a live broadcast, Ramon also described the symbolism of taking a miniature Sefer Torah on board. It was given to him by a survivor of the Bergen Belsen concentration camp who also worked with the crew on several of its scientific projects; Ramon described it as a symbol of rebirth of the Jewish people, from the ashes of the Holocaust to the splendor of space. A photo of Ramon in *Columbia* with the Sefer Torah hovering near him is deeply moving.

Ramon is the only foreign recipient of the U.S. Congressional Space Medal of Honor, which was awarded to him posthumously.

He was 48-years-old when he died, and was survived by his wife Rona and four children. Rona Ramon died in 2018 after battling pancreatic cancer, and was posthumously awarded the Israel Prize, the country's highest cultural honor, for her own achievements as the founding CEO of the Ramon Foundation, which encourages youth academic excellence and social leadership through science and technology.

The stamp features a portrait of Col. Ramon in his space suit surrounded by depictions of: the view from space of Israel and the Sinai peninsula; a map of the stars; the *Columbia* Space Shuttle; and the emblem of the ISA. The *Columbia STS-107* mission patch, a picture of sunrise as seen from space, and Ramon's years of birth and death are found on the tab, the postal label attached below the stamp.





Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow

Continued from last month.....

. "COMMUNITY - The Journey from Self to Others"

In this chapter, we think about moving beyond oneself and the importance of community. Community is the need for others, because, after all, we are social creatures. Do we not give meaning to our lives through the relationship with others? Isn't our pain lessened by talking with others, helping us to become whole again? Also, isn't the community a source of "pleasure, fellowship and sharing"? At celebrations like weddings, bar/bat mitzvah and birthdays, don't we enjoy them by sharing them with others we care about? Unfortunately, we have a problem. Our modern Western culture is one of the loneliest in human history. Leaving hometown neighborhoods and living in gated communities are two examples of this. And we tend not to join things such as houses of worship (people may fear them as "service stations" rather than as communities and organizations. Individualism is "the hallmark of American culture" in which we do not need others to fulfill our dreams. But don't forget, human beings need to be connected with other human beings. Without that, there are problems. Rabbi Gold has many interesting things to say about this - all to help us think about the negative effects we see when people have little connection with others, things such as antisocial behaviors like road rage, serial killers, and computer viruses. We have to remember, Gold adds, that what we need is to think about all those people that helped us and made us who we are: parents, teachers, rabbis, youth leaders, bosses, families and friends, to name only a few. We have to remember; we cannot do it alone.

Rabbi Gold discusses the Golden Rule. He also stresses that community is about reaching out and helping others, instead of just avoiding harm. We also need to be proactive to help others in need. Another idea brought up is that community is a series of concentric circles of taking care of one's

own needs, first our family and then our community. Many good suggestions are given in the Guideposts" section such as: to avoid gossip, avoid ethnic jokes and hateful speech. Shift to taking proactive actions such as smiling to strangers, become a joiner, and work to make this a better world.

9. "RECOVERY - The Journey from Sin To Atonement"

If we seem to go down a wrong path in our life, this chapter discusses the journey of recovery back to the proper path. The fact is, we can change. Even the Cheshire Cat, Rabbi Gold tells us, taught Alice -"only if we know our destination can we find our way to the proper path." Of course, we all sometimes make mistakes and "miss the mark", but we have the ability to change our behavior. This differentiates us from the animal kingdom in which, as they say, you cannot teach an old dog new tricks. We, on the other hand, always have the potential to change.

The author then discusses "The Seven R's of Repentance" which discusses the steps we must take as we strive to follow the correct path. They are Recognition, Responsibility, Remorse, Restitution, Resolve, Recovery, and Repentance. A meaningful explanation of these is given, one by one. I highly recommend looking at this discussion. The next section deals with: "Should we forgive?"

10. "MORTALITY - The Journey from Temporal to Eternal Life"

After an interesting discussion of the story of offering Isaac as a sacrifice, this chapter talks about the extreme value of life - that it is not to be sacrificed (except, of course the limited conditions of war, self defense, capital punishment and martyrdom) - all having extreme limits. The Torah stresses the "infinite worth of every human life." But as Rabbi Gold explains, this leaves the difficult question of why we must die. He discusses the two aspects of our existence: a material one and a spiritual one. He suggests we think about the importance of a limited time on earth and its influence on our accomplishments. The author has an amazing discussion of how life is not a circle, with one thing following another in a repetitive manner - as in the animal world. In the human path of life, we rise above the circle and break out of it to find something new. The human path is using links, each generation adding on new things as life continues. Isn't that why the Bible is so interested in who begat who? Each generation takes the knowledge of the past generations and adds on to it while having a vision of the future. We certainly can see this in Medicine and Science, and in whatever else human hands have touched.

I cannot express in words how much I have enjoyed reading this book. It helps us think about our lives and the many ways we can take action. Using interesting examples from the Bible, stories, words of authors, movies, thoughts of numerous individuals, and even Broadway musicals, this book aids us to think about our own journeys in life, helping us to steer in the right direction and feel satisfied with what we have done and will do. Rabbi Gold helps us to accomplish this in an "easy to understand" way. You

will not feel weighed down in any way and are made to feel the ease in which you go from one page to another in an effortless manner. It is a book "heavy" in meaning, but in no way "heavy" to read. I hope that as you read *The Ten Journeys of Life, *you will come to appreciate it in the same way as I did. 




