
BROTHERHOOD NEWS :



YOM HASHOAH

Seventy-seven years have passed since the Nazi concentration camps were liberated and the Holocaust that claimed the six million Jewish lives came to an end. To ensure that the six million did not die in vain and that the Holocaust never happens again, Temple Beth El Israel once again will join Jews throughout the United States and around the world by participating in the **Yom Hashoah Yel-low Candle Holocaust Commemoration** to keep alive the memories of the Six Million who per-ished.

The Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle is modeled after a traditional Jewish Yahrzeit memorial candle that burns for 24 hours during periods of mourning. The wax reminds us of the yellow arm bands that Jews were forced to wear during the Nazi regime.

As the years pass, the memories of those who were victims in this ultimate hate crime must not diminish. We encourage your family to light a yellow candle on the night of Wednesday, April 27, 2022, and join as thousands of Jewish families light their Yom HaShoah candles. This action will continue to increase the awareness of the Holocaust and help perpetuate our commitment to our people – particularly, since recently, with the marked increase of anti-Semitism.

The memory is important! The number of Holocaust survivors is rapidly diminishing with each passing day. As we lose this precious link, those who deny that the Holocaust happened gain strength. Sadly, a study conducted last year reported that 22 percent of millennials (23 to 38 years old) say they haven't even heard of the Holocaust.

Temple Beth El Israel Brotherhood will distribute a Yom HaShoah yellow candle to each Temple family. Please join us in lighting this candle in memory of our six million brothers and sisters who perished. In addition, we encourage you to attend our Holocaust Memorial Yizkor Service led by Rabbi Benson on Friday, April 29th, 2022, at 7:30 p.m. Please mark your calendar and save the date.







THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ By Ellis Bromberg

"This day shall be to you one of remembrance; you shall keep it as a feast to God throughout the generations...forever" (Exodus 12:14). With these words, God commanded Moses and the Israelites to celebrate their deliverance from 400 years of slavery. Now, more than 3,300 years later, the night of the 14th of Nisan sees Jews the world over ushering in Passover, the seven-day Feast of Unleavened Bread, with the traditional Seder. This year, Passover begins the evening of Friday, April 15.

This month's stamp set is a beautiful 1972 issue from Israel that highlights three important aspects of Passover (*Pesah*, in Hebrew, on the stamps): the Exodus from Egypt; the baking of unleavened bread; and the Seder. Pertinent biblical verses are printed on the tabs.

The 18 agorot stamp (left) depicts the Israelites being led out of Egypt by Moses, with his staff in hand. The tab on the bottom of the stamp is inscribed: "...for in the month Abib you came out from Egypt" (Exodus 34:18). Abib was the first month of the ancient Hebrew calendar corresponding to Nisan.

The 45 agorot stamp (center) documents the baking of matzah in medieval times. The tab is inscribed: "Seven days you shall eat unleavened bread..." (Exodus 12:15).

And the 95 agorot stamp (right) shows a Jewish family conducting the Passover Seder: the table is set with wine and matzah as the Haggadah, which relates the story and the meaning of the Exodus, is recited. The tab is inscribed: "...according to all the statute for the Passover they shall keep it" (Numbers 9:12).

The significance of Passover is threefold: the biblical command to remember the Exodus from Egypt; the identification of every Jew with the Jewish people; and the praise of God in the spring as the earth awakens to new life. It is our holiday of freedom and thanksgiving.

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



Passover is fast approaching. You know that your "always used " recipes are good, but wouldn't it be enjoyable to search for some new and different ones which have never appeared on your Passover table in the past. Our library is home to a number of Jewish cookbooks of all sorts. They contain some interesting Pesach recipes. I'll give you one book - *L'Dor V'Dor* (From Generation To Generation), which appears in a cookbook from Temple Beth Tikvah of Madison, Connecticut. It has several recipes I am going to share

with you. You might also enjoy looking through the rest of the cookbook for year-round recipes you find interesting. Let's start now.

Many of us use the same charoset recipe every year. But what do Israeli Jews use? Let's take a look at it. For variety's sake, why not try this one in 2022?

Israeli Charoset (pareve)

1 apple, chopped 1 tsp. cinnamon 15 dates, chopped 1/2 cup sweet wine 1 cup almonds or peanuts, chopped Sugar or honey, if desired Matzah meal, if needed

Combine the fruit, nuts, cinnamon, and wine. If it is more liquid than you like, add meal until it is the consistency you wish.

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Cook spinach for about 10

minutes In a bowl, break up matzoh, place in colander. Spill off excess water and mix spinach. In another bowl, mix egg

yolks, cottage cheese, sour cream and salt. Fold in stiffly

Passover Spinach Square (dairy)

It seems that whatever event you attend, spinach squares are popular. But what about spinach squares for Passover? Here, then, is a Passover spinach square recipe.

1 1b spinach, fresh or frozen 3 Tb. sour cream 5 squares matzoh 1 lb cottage cheese 5 eggs, separated 1/2 lb Edam cheese, sliced Salt to taste

Raspberry Chocolate Passover Puffs (pareve)

Now for the dessert. Plan to use the time you are cleaning off the table to pop these into the oven because it is recommended, they be served right away.

PUFFS 1 Cup water 1 Cup matzo cake meal 1/2 Cup vegetable oil 4 eggs

FILLING 1/4 Cup raspberry jam 1/2 pint fresh raspberries

TOPPING 3 or 4 oz. melted pareve chocolate

In a medium pan, bring water and oil to boil. Take off heat, add matzo meal. Mix briskly with a wooden spoon until blended. Add eggs, one at a time, still off heat, beating well after each addition. Drop ping-pong ball sized blobs onto lightly greased sheets about 2" apart. Bake 10 minutes at 450 degrees: reduce heat to 400 degrees and bake 15-20 minutes longer. They will be puffy and golden, and hollow inside. When completely cool, slice open: fill with 1 teaspoon of jam and a spoonful of berries. Replace top of puff and drizzle with melted chocolate. Serve right away so puffs will not get soggy.
