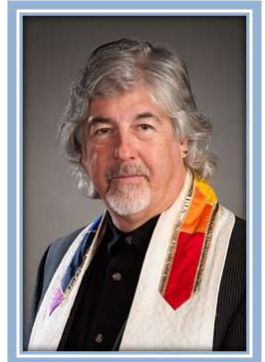

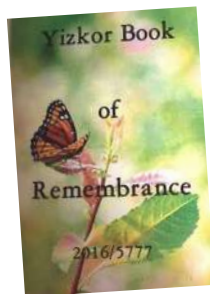

### *Rosh HaShanah Honey Apple Cake*

#### **Ingredients:**

##### **CAKE**

2½ cups flour  
2 heaping teaspoons baking soda  
3 eggs, beaten  
1 cup sugar  
2/3 cup honey  
1¼ cup brewed coffee  
6 tablespoons canola oil  
Salt  
Pinch cinnamon

##### **APPLE CONFIT**

3 apples, peeled and sliced thinly crosswise  
1 cup sugar  
1 vanilla bean, split  
2 cinnamon sticks  
1 tablespoon honey  
3 cloves



#### **Directions: For the Cake**

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Combine the flour and baking soda in a mixing bowl and whisk well. Set aside. Combine the eggs, sugar, honey, coffee, canola oil, ½ teaspoon salt, and cinnamon. Mix on low speed until blended. Add the flour mixture and continue mixing just until combined. Divide the batter evenly between two pans. Bake until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 30 minutes.

#### **For the Apples**

Preheat the oven to 275°F. Toss the apple slices with sugar, vanilla, cinnamon, honey, and cloves. Arrange in a single layer in an ovenproof skillet or a baking pan. Add enough water to just cover the apples. Press a sheet of parchment onto the surface of the water.

Put the skillet over medium-high heat and bring to a simmer, cover tightly in foil, and transfer to the oven. Bake until the apples are just tender, about 1 hour. Cool to room temperature, transfer to a lidded container, and chill until cold. Serve apples on top of a slice of honey cake.

It's hard to believe, but by the time you read this article, it will already be summer! Sometimes, I introduce you to a collection of books in our Temple library for your summer reading. This year, I have chosen to concentrate on novels recently donated within the last few years. Some of you have told me there is a need in our library for more books of fiction.

It's certainly a good time of year to sit down and relax with a good novel, and our library's fiction is growing! May I interest you in any of the following?

*\*We Were the Lucky Ones\** - by Georgia Hunter, includes an author's note. This is an historical novel based on the experiences of Hunter's family during WWII. They had lived in Radom, Poland, and the book follows her grandfather Addy, his parents and four siblings - along with their spouses. It's recommended that you keep a "character chart" to keep track of the many individuals in the book. We see them struggle to survive the Holocaust and then reunite after the war. Each chapter is written from the perspective of one of the family members. You even get treated to some brief historical information prefacing some of the chapters, and there is also timeline data from the war. This book contains the themes of fear, survival, prejudice, hardship and family (with its inclusion of religion as an important part of family life). This is a meaningful read and well-researched. It is a compelling read, especially because it relates to the family of the author. It was also a national bestseller, well-worth your time!

*\*The Librarian of Auschwitz\** - by Antonio Iturbe. This book is based on the experiences of real-life Auschwitz prisoner Dita Kraus and In the last section of the book, you have an interesting explanation of what happened to ten of the notable characters. The book deals with the life of a fourteen-year-old girl who is asked to protect volumes of hidden books. It was "a glimpse of hope and humanity" that was preserved by the prisoners of building 31. Extensive research was done by the author, including information taken from the interviews with "the librarian of Auschwitz", Dita Kraus. It was "an incredible story of a girl who risked her life to keep the magic of books alive during the Holocaust."

*\*Karolina's Twins\** - by Ronald H. Balson. Some of the comments about this book were: "A heart wrenching but ultimately triumphant story", "a heartbreaking tale of a mother's love, friendship, and family in the face of increasingly brutal conditions and the constant threat of imminent death in Nazi-occupied Poland", "Balson kept me on the edge of my seat, wondering what the next chapter would reveal", and "a novel of survival, justice and redemption ...riveting". This book of historical fiction is the story of a Holocaust survivor, Lena Woodward, who enlists the help of a pair of private investigators to trace the twin daughters of her friend, Karolina (who died at a Nazi death camp), to fulfill a promise made in the past. The book also involves Arthur, Lena's son, who is an "aggressive, bullying character." He launches proceedings against his mother and claims she is mentally incompetent, and that the two private investigators are out to "fleece her of her considerable wealth." Again, as in the other two novels in this review, extensive research was done to gather information. The courtroom scenes are authentic. One remark about the book is noteworthy: "The writing itself is immaculate, the story gripping, with impeccable characterization and believable, realistic dialogue. And the surprise at the end is worth waiting for." The book comes highly recommended.

## THE IMMORTAL WORDS OF EMMA LAZARUS

Born on July 22, 1849, in New York City, Emma Lazarus, the Jewish American author of poetry and prose, has never appeared on a postage stamp. But immortal words from her sonnet, "The New Colossus," grace a 1978 U.S. definitive that depicts the head of the Statue of Liberty and pays tribute to immigrants. It was part of the Postal Service's Americana series that celebrated the culture and history of the country.



"I lift my lamp beside the golden door" is the last line from the sonnet, which is inscribed on a bronze plaque on the pedestal of the statue. Lazarus wrote the poem in 1883 as a donation to an auction of art and literary works conducted to raise money for the construction of the pedestal.

Although the statue, a gift to the United States from France, was originally intended as recognition of the values shared by the two republics, the incorporation of "The New Colossus" on the pedestal led to a reimagining of Liberty's purpose, turning her into a welcoming symbol of hope to the outcasts and downtrodden of the world. Beginning in the late 19th century, the statue became a

touchstone of the immigrant experience, as ships carried the newcomers past Lady Liberty's torch as they entered New York harbor.

Emma Lazarus was part of a large Sephardic family whose ancestors were among the very first group of Jews to settle in America. The first collection of her poetry, verses she wrote as a teenager, was published in 1867. Numerous plays, novels, poetry, and translations followed, and Lazarus was recognized for her work in Europe as well as America.

She became interested in her Jewish ancestry as she learned of the pogroms in Russia that followed the assassination of Tsar Alexander II in 1881. As a result of that anti-Semitic violence, thousands of Russian Jews fled to New York, and Lazarus began to advocate on their behalf. She helped establish the Hebrew Technical Institute to provide technical training to Jewish immigrants, and founded the Society for the Improvement and Colonization of East European Jews. Many of her poems (including "By The Waters of Babylon"), translations (Hebrew poets of medieval Spain), and articles ("An Epistle To the Hebrews") had Jewish subjects. She was a supporter of Jewish repatriation in Israel.

Lazarus died in 1887 at the age of 38, likely from Hodgkin's lymphoma. She never married. She is buried in Beth Olam Cemetery in Queens, New York.

## SIMON BAR KOKHBA AND HIS REVOLT AGAINST ROME



This month's featured stamp is a lilac colored 1961 commemorative depicting one of the legendary heroes of Israel, Simon bar Kokhba (spelled "Barcochebas" on the stamp) who led a 1st century rebellion against the Emperor Hadrian in what was then the Roman province of Judea. A traditional fast day, Tisha B'Av -- which begins this year at sundown on Saturday, August 6 and ends at nightfall on Sunday, August 7 (the 9th of Av) -- commemorates the crushing of the Bar Kokhba Revolt, which resulted in the deaths of over half a million Jewish civilians. The revolt, in 135 CE, was one of the most serious and protracted in the history of the Roman Empire.

Tisha B'Av is regarded as the saddest day in the Jewish calendar because it marks not only the defeat of Bar Kokhba's rebels but also the destruction of Judaism's First Temple, by the Neo-Babylonian Empire (in 586 BCE), as well as the Second Temple, by the Roman Empire (in 70 CE).

Bar Kokhba, whose given name was Simon ben Kosevah, was the Jewish military leader of the revolt, circa 132-135 CE, the last of three major Jewish-Roman wars. It had erupted as a result of religious and political tensions in Judea related to an expanding Roman military presence in the province. Rome had begun to construct a new city, Aelia Capitolina, over the ruins of Jerusalem, and to erect a temple to the Roman god Jupiter on the Temple Mount. In addition, according to Jewish and Roman texts, bans had been put in place on circumcision, the reading of the Torah, and observation of Shabbat.

A leading sage of the era, Rabbi Akiva, regarded ben Kosevah as the anointed warrior who would lead the Jews to redemption. Akiva declared him to be the Messiah promised in the Bible and, referring to a passage in Numbers 24:17, renamed him Bar Kokhba, "Son of a Star." Writings from the period, found in caves in the Judean Desert during the 1950s and 1960, reveal Bar Kokhba to have been a charismatic leader, a devout Jew, and a brilliant tactician.

Bar Kokhba waged a guerilla war against the highly trained, professional Roman army. His militia was armed with bows and arrows, slings, swords, and spears. Their strategy was to ambush Roman troops on the march, emerging from hiding places in underground caves and tunnels and then disappearing just as quickly.

Bar Kokhba was initially quite successful, taking control of towns and villages across Judea, uniting the Jewish population, and briefly establishing an independent nation. By mid-133 CE, Roman control of the region had ceased, and Roman law had been replaced by Jewish religious law. Bar Kokhba referred to himself as *nasi* (president), and he called his country Israel.

Hadrian was greatly angered by the losses in this relative backwater of his empire, and he dispatched his best commander, Sextus Julius Severus, to the area. Severus had recently put down a rebellion in Britain, then a part of the Roman Empire, and brought with him handpicked officers and troops to retake Judea. They adopted a scorched earth policy that slowly ground down Jewish resistance. Bones and coins found at the archeological site Hurvat Itri attest to the brutality of the Roman policy of visiting terrifying vengeance on its enemies. As the war progressed, the fortunes of rebel-held Israel deteriorated as their casualties mounted.

During the final phase of the war, Jewish militia and civilians fled to Betar, a town in the Judean mountains southwest of Aelia Capitolina, and it is there that Bar Kokhba made his last stand. Archeologists believe that the modern village of Battir, on the West Bank near Bethlehem, is the most likely candidate for this place; remains of a hastily built wall have been found there. The Imperial Roman Army destroyed Betar and killed Bar Kokhba in 135 CE.

The stamp includes a stylized portrait of Bar Kokhba with a bow and arrows realized in a stained glass-like design. It is one of a three-stamp set depicting "heroes of Israel"; the other two issues feature Samson, a judge of ancient Israel, and Judas Maccabeus, who led the revolt against the Seleucid Empire from 167-160 BCE. The Lion of Judah, a Jewish national and cultural symbol, appears on the tab, the label attached to the bottom of the stamp.

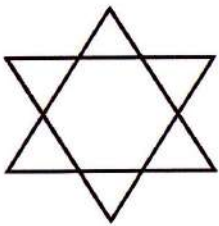
