From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

The year is flying by. Here we are getting ready for Thanksgiving. Judaism requires each of us to see the concept of giving thanks as an extraordinary opportunity to help another person and offer thanks to God for the chance to perform the mitzvah.

In truth, performing a true mitzvah that you can place in your account of "good deeds" vs. things you might not want to put on any list at all. Consider the length of your lists since Yom Kippur, which seems like a very long time ago even though we're only 4 weeks away from the apex holiday of our people. How are your lists growing so far?



The Torah parasha for Shabbat Lech-Lecha, which falls on Nov. 4 & 5, uses a phrase which is quite challenging to parse. Lech-Lecha, at best translates to "Go unto yourself". What exactly could that mean? In fact, the suggestion is that on our life's journey, we are constantly striving to find ourselves. Torah suggests we are sojourners constantly trying to find our true, authentic selves. This would give us the challenge of defining exactly who our true, authentic selves are and whom we strive to be.

If that is the case, we become that which we choose ourselves to guide ourselves to be. What is it your eyes see when they look out at the world? Positivity or negativity? Kindness or disdain for others? A self-aggrandized vision or self loathing? Do you see yourself equal to, above or beneath others?

Start out each day with a vision of who you want to be for that day. Torah will lead if you will listen, life will take you to many places if you let it. Let go a little bit-see where the winds of God push you too. You might be very surprised. Go out and find yourself. That what God is asking of us this month. See if you can surprise God and yourself. Take the risk. So many of our ancestors did and look how that worked out for them and, ultimately, us.

May your day of Thanksgiving be one of great blessing and joy. Try and make every day a day of Thanksgiving. Hug your loved ones and make each day unique and special, like you.



THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ THE 84th ANNIVERSARY OF KRISTALLNACHT

November's featured postage stamp comes to us from Germany; it was issued in 1988 to mark the 50th anniversary of Kristallnacht, "the Night of the Broken Glass," the first nationwide Nazi pogrom.

On the night of November 9, 1938, mobs went on a rampage throughout Nazi Germany in the severest eruption of violence perpetrated against the Jews of Germany until the onset of the deportations and annihilations during the war. The riots were to have far-reaching consequences for the status and conditions of German Jews.

The year 1938 was a calamitous one for Germany's Jewish community. It was then that Adolf Hitler's drive for political and territorial aggrandizement reached its peak with the annexation of Austria and the Sudetenland, and the most sweeping anti-Jewish edicts were promulgated in a continuing campaign of discrimination and persecution. Under the Names Decree, every Jew had to assume, in addition to his or her first name, the identifying name of Israel or Sarah. Passports of Jews were stamped with the letter "J" in red, signifying "Jude." Jewish property was expropriated by various laws and regulations, and official recognition of the public standing of the Jewish communities was annulled.

On November 7, a Jewish youth named Herschel Grynszpan, whose parents had been expelled from Germany to Poland, shot and killed an official in the German embassy in Paris. The assassination served as the pretext for Kristallnacht, organized by the Nazi Party and the Storm Troopers with the concurrence and encouragement of the Nazi leadership. The signal to start the operation was given by the Minister of Public Enlightenment and Propaganda, Joseph Goebbels.

During the night, 171 synagogues were set ablaze and many others destroyed; 7,500 shops and businesses of Jews were ransacked and vandalized; 91 Jews were murdered; and some 30,000 were deported to concentration camps. The events of Kristallnacht were a watershed in the history of German Jewry; it marked the Nazis' shift from discrimination through legislation and decrees to brutal street violence, a portent of what lay ahead.

The stamp includes an image of the synagogue in Baden-Baden, in southwestern Germany, set ablaze on Kristallnacht. Before the building was destroyed, members of the congregation were forced to recite passages from Hitler's *Mein Kampf* and other antisemitic writings from the pulpit. The city's Jewish men were arrested and paraded through the town streets under Nazi guard to watch the destruction of the synagogue and its furnishings, and then many were sent to Sachsenhausen and other concentration camps.

The stamp also includes a phrase translated as "Remembrance is the secret to redemption" ("Das geheimnis der erlösung heisst erinnerung"), a saying attributed to the Baal Shem Tov, the Jewish mystic regarded as the founder of Hasidic Judaism. Those words are also written on the gates of the Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial Museum in Jerusalem.





Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



Israel Baal Shem Tov, Ahad Haam and others. But it is a gift to have all of these within the pages of one book - *A Treasury of Judaism*, compiled and edited by Philip Birnbaum, a religious author and translator. This book is like a present all tied up with a bow, including so many works presented in an organized way with helpful information and meaningful explanations.

Birnbaum places each chapter of the Bible into Torah (first 5 books), Former Prophets, Major Prophets, Minor Prophets and Sacred Writings. He then goes on to discuss the Apocrypha, Josephus, the Mishnah, the Talmud, the Midrash, the Zohar and the Siddur. As he does with each one of his chapters, Birnbaum gives a general explanation at the beginning of the chapter, and then gives specific examples of what is in it. He then goes on to include many individuals who contributed much to literature throughout Jewish history, giving us excellent short summaries about their lives and then sharing with us some of their writings. You may know a little or a lot about them, but there is always room to learn more.

Do any of these following individuals sound familiar? - Saadyah Gaon, Eliezer the Great, Solomon Ibn Gabirol, Bahya Ibn Pakuda, Yehudah Halevi, Judah Ibn Tibbon, Moses Maimonides, Abraham Maimonides, Moses Nahmanides, Yehudah Hehasid, Elazar Rokeah, Rabbi Asher-Rosh, Israel Al-Nakawa, Judah Ibn Kalaaz, Joseph Karo, Leon of Modena, Glueckel of Hameln, Moses Hayyim Luzzatto, Jacob Emden, Elijah Wilna-Gaon, Jacob Krantz, Israel Baal Shem Tov, Nahman Bratzlaver, Samson Raphael Hirsch, Israel Salanter, Abraham Isaac Kook, Herman Cohen, Solomon Schechter, Ahad Haam, Hayyim Nahman Bialik, Simon Dubnow, Louis Ginzberg, and Rabbi Israel Meir Ha-Kohen. You will read interesting articles by these individuals, topics such as: Moral Qualities, Duties of the Heart. Guide for the Perplexed, The High Ways to Perfection, Right Conduct, Shulchan Aruch, On Gambling, Eretz Yisrael, A Letter of Advice, Hasidism, Eretz, Ethical Will, Precepts of Jewish Living, the Moralist Movement, the Philosophy of Jewish History and so much more.

In this book, the editor's aim was to include a variety of material that would suit everyone's taste "in terms of enlightenment, guidance and interesting reading, and make it all intelligible to the ordinary reader without the aid of footnotes and commentaries," There are books that, for the most part, have "obscure and difficult passages", but yet made it possible to be understood by the average individual because of the elimination of whatever is unclear and of "doubtful meaning". The retranslation of passages are so that we read the English that everybody understands.

In his forward, Birnbaum writes that he hopes this book will awaken the readers' interest and "stimulates their thinking", and he ends by stating: "May this book enlighten the minds of all those who strive to make this world a better place to live in; May it be an inspiration to those who seek knowledge and truth." If one looks up the word "treasury" in a dictionary, he or she will read that it is "a story or collection of valuable or delightful things". Certainly *A Treasury of Judaism* fills that definition. There is much to be learned, sometimes introducing us to what we consider to be new and interesting knowledge of what Judaism holds. Rabbi Judah Ibn Tibbon once wrote that perhaps this book can be a part of your "treasury of Jewish knowledge that will light up your soul."




