From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson


As you receive this, we will be at the end of the High Holiday season. Hopefully, it was a good one for you and your family. So now the Jewish year is afoot.

HONEY BUN CAKE

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (18 ounce) package yellow cake mix
- ²/₃ cup vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 1 (8 ounce) container sour cream
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup chopped pecans
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 tablespoon milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

DIRECTIONS:

Add cake mix, oil, eggs, and sour cream in a large mixing bowl.

Beat with an electric mixer on medium speed until well mixed.

Spread half of the batter into a greased 13x9 inch baking pan.

In a smaller bowl, add the brown sugar, pecans, and cinnamon; stir to mix.

Sprinkle mixture evenly over the batter.

Spread the remaining batter over the pecan mixture.

Bake at 350 degrees for about 45 minutes or until golden brown.


In a bowl, stir the powdered sugar, milk, and vanilla until it is thin enough to spread.

Take a toothpick and prick the surface of the warm cake several times.

Spread the sugar glaze over the cake.

Let cool for 1 hour.

THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ ISRAEL'S NATIONAL FLAG CELEBRATES ITS 74TH BIRTHDAY

This month's stamp is an early commemorative from Israel that features the first appearance of the Israeli flag on a postage stamp. The flag's design was officially adopted by the country's Provisional Council of State on October 28, 1948, six months after the establishment of the modern state of Israel.

The design -- a white rectangle with two blue lines across the entire length and a Magen David occupying the center -- had been long familiar to Jews around the world as the flag of the Zionist movement. At the ceremony for the declaration of Israel's establishment -- before the fledgling nation had adopted an official flag -- the dais was decorated with a picture of Theodor Herzl, the father of modern political Zionism, flanked on either side by the flag of the World Zionist Organization (WZO). Adopted in 1897 by the first Zionist Congress meeting in Basel, Switzerland, that flag had become accepted by Jewish communities throughout the world as the emblem of Zionism, and it was thus natural to use it at the official proclamation of statehood.

And yet, in May 1948, only a few days after the Zionist dream of a Jewish state became a reality, some raised the question about whether the Zionist banner should be designated Israel's official flag, or whether it should be replaced. Interestingly enough, concerns for the Jewish Diaspora led to the announcement of a national competition to design the new flag. Since the Zionist banner had come to be regarded as the international flag of the Jewish people, some thought that adopting a different design for the State of Israel was important to ensure that Jews in other countries would not be subject to charges of "dual loyalties" by flying a flag of a state of which they were not citizens.

Zionist tradition credits the design of the Zionist flag to David Wolffsohn, the second president of the WZO. During a meeting in Basel, Herzl raised the question of a Zionist flag and proposed a white banner with seven gold stars. Wolffsohn responded, "Why do we have to search? Here is our national flag!" Displaying his tallit, he pointed to the white field and blue stripes upon it, and suggested adding the Magen David. And so, the Zionist flag was born!

The national competition for the new Israeli flag attracted many new design proposals. A number included variations utilizing blue and white stripes and Magen Davids while others depicted the Tablets of the Law, the Lion of Judah, or Herzl's original "seven stars." Still, the historic Zionist flag was favored by most. So, to address the lingering "dual loyalty" question, Israel's Minister of Foreign Affairs (later Prime Minister) Moshe Sharett decided to ask Jewish leaders in the Diaspora about their concerns. American Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, who was a key figure in the mobilization of U.S. support for the founding of Israel, told Sharett: "We would prefer to leave the Zionist flag as the national flag of Israel, with a minimum of changes. We feel that the fear of complications as a result of the flag at Zionist gatherings overseas has been somewhat exaggerated." Other Jewish leaders responded similarly, and with the fears of "dual loyalty" alleviated, the Provisional Council of State voted unanimously to adopt the Zionist flag as that of the State of Israel 74 years ago this month.

The other proposals for the design were not completely discarded. Some were incorporated into other official symbols: the Lion of Judah is the emblem of Jerusalem; Herzl's seven stars are prominently featured in the emblems of Tel Aviv and Herzliya; and the Tablets of the Law appear on the emblem of the Chief Rabbinate of Israel.

The design of blue and white stripes married with the Magen David conveys a strong and appropriate statement about Israel. The stripes, taken from the tallit, symbolize a life guided by the precepts of Torah. The Magen David, meanwhile, originally had no religious, political, or social connotations, but attained wide circulation among Jewish communities in the 19th century after Jewish emancipation in European countries; Israeli historian Gershom Scholem wrote that it came to be a symbol which represents Jewish identity in the same way that the cross identifies Christianity. Nevertheless, because of its terrible abuse by the Nazis, in the 20th century, the Magen David became a symbol of rebirth and new life for the Jewish people. In this way, the two design features tie the State of Israel, through its flag, to the past, present, and future.

The stamp itself was issued on March 31, 1949. It is displayed here with "full tab," the philatelic phrase for the two labels (one blank) attached to the right side of the stamp.

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



Words are the center of our lives. We know we use them all the time, but so many of them can be interpreted in different ways - we are able to look at one word from many different angles and hopefully learn something new every so often. A recent bestseller states: "Words are only of value if we remember how to feel what they mean." Because we are in the middle of the High Holydays, there are certain words we read that we are familiar with, but perhaps because of time limitations

during the worship services, we

just don't have the chance to mull over just what meanings a specific word might have. That's why I am reviewing *The Book Of Words* written by Rabbi Lawrence Kushner, at this time of year. He tells us that according to the Hebrew Bible, God made the world with words. God spoke and the world was created. It's interesting that the Aramaic for "I created as I speak" is *avana k'davara*, which in magician's language is *abracadabra!* Rabbi Kushner tells us that the Hebrew word for *"*word" is "*davar", *which means "thing". The word does not need to be made real. it already is. It needs only to be read, spoken and interpreted. To know the word, therefore, is to know reality itself. We know that words are often overused in religious tradition. When spoken too often, "even the holiest reality begins to sound hollow and loses its ability to create anew," feeling like "sawdust in our mouths no longer able to instruct, chasten, or nurture." We need to know what they originally might have meant. Rabbi Kushner reminds us that the 30 Hebrew words in this book describe "the spiritual dimension of life." But their definitions are not complete. They might not even run in parallel lines with a dictionary. But he hopes they will "offer a way back to the spiritual reality of the words themselves."

Rabbi Kushner sets up this book in the following way. He starts each short chapter with a Hebrew word and his provocative English translation. There is a transliteration of the Hebrew at the bottom of the page, along with its usual English translation that we commonly use. The author then includes a Biblical example which relates to the word, then a more recent text showing how the word has evolved. At the end of the chapter, the author gives us a section called "Living Spiritual Talk" which he describes as "a *kavanah"*, or personal, meditative exercise designed to enable the reader to "live in the world." At the end of the book, biographical sources are listed by phrase and page.

Let's take a look at one of the words in the book: T'shoovah - the usual translation is "repentance", but Rabbi Kushner's translation is "coming home". He talks about the yearning to return to our Source, that "through apology, repair and attempting to heal damage done, we effectively rewrite the past. What was once some thoughtless or even wicked act, when set within the present context of meaning, becomes the commencement of greater healing." The biblical reference he takes from Deuteronomy 30;1-3. The more

recent text is from Abraham Isaac Kook (1865-1935), and the "Living Spiritual Talk" or "*Kavanah*" in which the author suggests looking at a photo of you as a child. He asks you "what would you tell your child in the photo who once was you?...Just looking at who you were seems to awaken the possibility that you could go back to that time and, if not relive your life, at least begin again. This is the beginning of the return."

Truthfully, looking at the book as a whole, it is this section at the end of each chapter that is extremely interesting and useful. It uses ideas that are helpful to guide you through the thinking process. In case you prefer to pick and choose the words you would like to consider; I'm going to create a list of some of the words contained in the book. Reading from left to right, I will give you first the Hebrew word, then its commonly used translation, and finally Rabbi Kushner's "re-translation" of that same word.

b'rah khah blessing awakening
*shabbat *the Sabbath Day being
*ha shem * the Name of God breathing

mah ah seh story life

ts'dah kah charity money

*say der *order remembering

mitz vah divine commandment response

*t'fee lah *prayer script

*eh moo nah * faith secrecy

eh'met truth vision

*toh rah *the law the way

*mo shee'ahkh *messiah yourself

Interesting? Don't forget, there are even more words in the book.

Reading about Rabbi Kushner will tell you that he writes books concerning Jewish spirituality. This book, therefore, looks at commonly used Hebrew words, and helps you to see more than you are used to. It's an interesting approach to words that we are now able to view differently, squeezing out every bit of meaning we can from those words we used to think about only through its narrow translation we had been using. The author truly expands upon many more facets than we are used to. Again, his *kavanah* section at the end of each chapter should not be missed.




