From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

2022 has finally disappeared into the rear-view mirror and not a day too soon. Now it's time to look forward to 2023 and the gifts that await us there. The timing couldn't be more perfect.

By the second week of January in the Torah we'll be beginning our journey called the Exodus. The pinnacle event in the life of the Jewish people, it will encompass major definers of our evolution from a subservient people in Egypt, to the carriers of a vision that eventually changes the trajectory of all humanity with a universally altering vision of one God, over all other God's: Monotheism.



We will meet God on the mountain top, receive the law, carry it on our backs and in an arc made with human hands at the direction of God.

We will forever from that moment articulate to the rest of the world, from a scroll given to us and guided by the hand of God, a vision so powerful it will transcend all manners of questioning, challenges and hatefulness. Our job will be defined as God's partners.

Movies, lectures and more, culminating in a walk down the center of Bethany Drive as MST takes a righteous place representing a community somewhere in Bavaria or Moravia that was wiped from the face of the earth. That scroll will remain with us forever. Please watch for news of a pinnacle event in the history of our

congregation. Stand and walk with us as we, with pride, connect with a community torn out of existence by Nazi hate, and now resurrected and remembered by TBEI.

As we welcome 2023, let us look at the New Year as a year of

connecting, of growth, and of great pride in who we are as Jews in a world again not sure who we are or where we belong.

Let us walk and stand together as we say HINENU- Here we are.

May this be a great year for the world, for Jewish life in America and for TBEI. Together, we can change all of them and more. Prepare to walk with us and remember the Israelites who walked with Moshe Rabbenu (Moses our teacher) as we walk in to our future.

Dear Sisterhood ladies,




Dear Members,

THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ THE U.N. AND ISRAEL MARK THE LIBERATION OF AUSCHWITZ ON JANUARY 27 by Ellis Bromberg

On January 27, 1945, 78 years ago this month, Soviet troops liberated the Nazi death camp in Auschwitz-Birkenau, Poland, signaling the beginning of the end of the Holocaust.

In 2005, on the 60th anniversary of the event, the United Nations designated January 27 as annual International Holocaust Remembrance Day. Three years later, Israel and the U.N. released a joint postage stamp issue for the first time to mark the event.

The day honors the victims and survivors of the Holocaust and encourages the people of the world to prevent it from happening again. It stands as a reminder to future generations to never forget the atrocities that took place. U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-Moon called the day one "on which we must reassert our commitment to human rights," and said: "We must also go beyond remembrance, and make sure that new generations know this history. We must apply the lessons of the Holocaust to today's world." That message is reflected in the phrase on the stamps: "Remembrance and Beyond."

The Nazis targeted European Jews and other ethnic groups, including Gypsies, Poles, and Slavs, during World War II. Eliminating the Jews was one of the key steps in Adolf Hitler's plan for world domination. To facilitate this mass murder, the Nazis built concentration camps. At first, these highly organized camps were used to terrorize and intimidate. But in 1941, when Hitler decided to exterminate all the Jews, the camps became killing factories. About 2.5 million people were murdered in Auschwitz alone.

In mid-1944, as the tide of war in Europe turned, the Red Army began approaching Auschwitz through Poland. Aware of the Soviets' impending arrival, the Nazis began to dismantle the camp's crematoriums and convert them into air raid shelters. They destroyed most written records and other evidence of what had occurred there, including many of the buildings; and in late 1944 and early January 1945, they moved 123,000 prisoners to other camps.

Then, on January 27, 1945, the Soviets arrived and liberated the remaining 7,500 prisoners. Though the Nazis had destroyed much of the camp, the liberators were still shocked at what they found there, including the belongings of over a million people. By the end of the war, approximately six million Jews, about 1.5 million of them children, two-thirds of all the Jews in Europe, had been killed by the Nazis. The total number of civilians murdered by the Nazis is estimated to be at least 11 million.

The State of Israel was established after the Holocaust, and Holocaust remembrance has become a central component of Jewish identity both in Israel and throughout the Diaspora. Many countries have instituted their own Holocaust Memorial Day. The United Kingdom also marks the day on January 27, but others, including Israel and the United States, observe the day on Yom HaShoah, usually in April or May (in 2023, Erev Yom HaShoah is the evening of April 17).

The joint issue Holocaust Remembrance stamp design features an illustration of barbed wire, which represents the horror and suffering of the Holocaust, and forms the stem to a tulip flower that honors the victims of the Holocaust. The tab (the label under the stamp) on the Israeli stamp repeats the phrase "Remembrance and Beyond" in English, outlined by horizontal strips of barbed wire.



TBEI CZECH HOLOCAUST TORAH



On April 15, 2023, a piece of history will be coming to TBEI. We will welcome a Czech Holocaust Torah to our Temple designated MST860. This is one of 1,564 scrolls that the Nazis took from the synagogues in Bohemia and Moravia in 1942. The Torah scroll is the most important document in Judaism and has been the "spiritual glue" that has held the Jewish people together through the centuries. The TBEI Holocaust Torah is on loan from the Memorial Scrolls Trust in London.

They have cared for them since 1964 and loan these scrolls throughout the world. We know that the scrolls are rare not just because many in the collection are hundreds of years old, but because they were rescued from the terror and destruction of the Holocaust. While many of the scrolls have a known provenance, no such data exist for MST860. Truly, MST860 is an "orphan." It will become a member of our TBEI family.

The fostering of the TBEI Holocaust Torah has been made possible by the efforts of Rabbi Benson and the generous donation of \$5,000 from several Temple members. The Torah comes to us without the usual ritual accoutrements accompanying it, so we will be purchasing a Torah Mantle, Wimple and Yad since the Torah will be used periodically for services.

The Torah will be housed in a separate display case in the lobby so it can be shared with all who enter the Temple. This display case will be constructed of materials that will assure its security and preservation.

A special *Holocaust Torah MST Fund* at TBEI is ready to accept donations in order to give MST860 a welcome presence. Check the TBEI website, Shofar, and Connections for future updates concerning MST860 related activities. If you know someone outside the TBEI family who would be interested, please let us know by calling the office and leaving a message.



Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



<u>Spiritual Trails of Happiness</u> by Rabbi Solomon Foster, is a book which is described as one in which "in undenominational terms, with positive and practical convictions, in clear and optimistic affirmations, the author presents a philosophy and program to organize our thought, our habits and our characters to earn the most precious of life's blessings happiness and peace of mind as the natural and inalienable rights of

the human family." It was interesting to read that the author was in the first class of the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati, Ohio. He served 57 years as an active and then retired rabbi at only one place - Congregation B'Nai Jeshuran of Newark, New Jersey, and was a chaplain during the world wars and during the Korean Conflict. But he was also a poet, and because of that talent, we now have a beautiful collection of poems which he created.

What assortment of subjects are used in Rabbi Foster's book that would deal with our spiritual trails to happiness? In only 96 pages with 8 chapters, he refers to God, the foundations of humanity, personality, the calendar, love, duty, memory and hope and "the trail". Digging deeper, some of the more specific topics listed under the chapters deal with love of fellowmen, Abraham Lincoln, valiant Jewish women, Sarah, Miriam, Ruth, the coat of many colors, our link to God, our spiritual calendar, Atonement Day, a clean heart and spirit, the essence of true love, loyalty, serenity, some keys to success, hope, the shortest distance to spirituality, plus more.

Let me share with you some examples of his poetry. The last poem in his book is "The Shortest Distance to Spirituality". Before this poem he gives you a quote from Isaiah 28:13 - "Such is the word of the Lord, precept...line by line... Here a little, there a little." Another quote he shares is from Psalm 5:9 - "O Lord, make Thy way straight before my face." Now you are ready to read the poem. Please do so by reading the whole left-hand column before the one on the right.

> Two points in space that we unite Need straightest line that we can draw To radiate Creation's Light And vitalize man's moral law.

> Alone we stray; apart we waste Our health and life; we choose detours To peace and right, and lose the taste For happiness which love procures.

Until mind sharpens mind to merger The heart and hand in fair exchange. To rid the world of mad discord That threatens world felicity.

Our thoughts possess a latent urge, But never reach an orbit's range, Until mind sharpens mind to merger The heart and hand in fair exchange.

When parents' faith wins child's accord, The home entreats society To rid the world of mad discord That threatens world felicity.

Good teachers must have more than rule And texts to serve our ardent youths Whose future joys stem from the schools And fruitful seeds of lasting truths. If ministers with flocks combine As one to study, serve and pray To lead the world to the Divine. Serenity will come to stay

True friendship needs more than a name To fuse two souls in amity, Enkindling the ennobling flame Of mutual integrity.

All else is froth, or hate or sin, Which God expects us to defy. Our thought and toil for human good Will gauge the happiness we earn.

The true, the brave, the wise must win, Because on God we can rely. All else is froth, or hate or sin, Which God expects us to defy.

This is the law of brotherhood Which every age anew must learn: Our thought and toil for human good Will gauge the happiness we earn.

In scaling heights at breathless speed And searching for uncharted space, Remember, our supremest need: Keep Faith In God, in every place.

Do not hesitate to zero in on one poem at a time and re-read it over and over. You will gain even more insight that way. What is wonderful about this poem is the positivity it exudes. It's interesting that even though this book was published in the 1950's, its similarities to the fears and hopes of the present is noteworthy, making the poems extremely meaningful for us today.


