### From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

Socrates, the Greek philosopher suggested that "the unexamined life is not worth living".

Using the Socratic method, we are asked to evaluate the statement through our own experiences and road through life. While usually the idea of these columns is to look forward, I'd like to take a moment and look back a bit to help create a fuller vision for the future.

Last week, the larger community joined with us to welcome MST860 to our temple. Between Friday night and Saturday, we had almost 200 attendees sit, walk, stand and pray with us. It was quite heart-rending to see that many people from all stripes of our community standing with us in this apex moment. Clergy from multiple faith communities, law enforcement in many colored uniforms representing local county and more, politicians of all stripes walking to help us make our point.

My heart was warmed by the support of Christians, Moslems and Jews of all visions of Jewish life together on a beautiful morning walking together to stand firm against hate and antisemitism.

My deepest thanks to all who supported our efforts financially or spiritually, who sat on committees, wrote for local newspapers and shared stories on tv segments and elsewhere.

All of that is to say, we are not alone, but our journey has just begun. Now is not the time for us to rest. New members of the Jewish community are moving to our town and need to know we are here.

Join our Yoga classes, a committee, we are beginning to evolve social clubs and more.

The community recognized we are here. Every day someone who was here or heard about the event, has reached out to me to share their enthusiasm for what we have begun.

Let us, however, not look backwards anymore. Let us define who we can be, not who we used to be. Let us build forward from this moment on. Everyone can help a little (or a lot). Take your pick, be a part of the whole. Examine not only what synagogue used to mean, look at what it can mean now....

The sections of Torah that we have been studying and examining these last several weeks have to do with ritual sacrifices and presents the option of many different sacrifices to offer. Not all sacrifices are

overwhelming. Some would only mean helping out in the temple several hours a month. Can you help us grow with that commitment?

Every bit helps and every bit matters. So do each of us. Examine your commitment and share. You, and your Jewish community, including MST860 and its now ghosted town, will remember...

Shavuot occurs Friday May 26 this year. Plan to be here as we celebrate the giving of the law to Moses and the reading of the 10 Commandments. MST860 will remind of our past and lead us into our future. Come, be part of the plan.

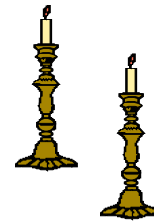

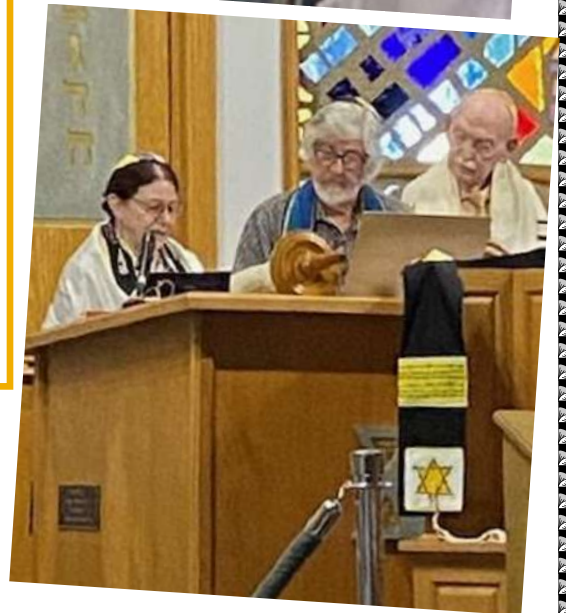

## **THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ By Ellis Bromberg**

### **THE "BRITISH SCHINDLER" WHO SAVED CZECH CHILDREN**

As we at TBEI continue to celebrate the "adoption" of our orphan Czech Torah, this month we tell another Holocaust rescue story that occurred in Czechoslovakia at the outbreak of World War II: the improbable story of a British banker who saved 669 children, most of them Jewish, at risk of being murdered by the Nazis. His name was Nicholas George Winton, born on May 19, 1909, 114 years ago this month, and he was honored on a 2015 stamp issued by the Czech Republic shortly after Winton died at the age of 106.

Winton has been called the "British Schindler" for his organization in 1939 of mass evacuations of children to save them from Nazi concentration camps. He arranged eight trains, known as the *Kindertransports*, to carry the children from what was then Czechoslovakia through Germany, across the English Channel, and finally to the train station in London.

In 1938, following the Nazi government-condoned *Kristallnacht* riots against the Jewish community in Germany and Austria, the British House of Commons approved a measure to allow the entry into Britain of refugees younger than 17, provided they had a place to stay and a 50 pound deposit set aside to enable their eventual return to their native country.

As a young man, Winton had been part of a group opposed to appeasement and alarmed with the dangers posed by the Nazis. After *Kristallnacht*, Winton, now a banker at the London Stock Exchange, received a request from the British Committee for Refugees from Czechoslovakia to assist in Jewish welfare work. He was determined to help some of the children of the families who had fled Germany, Austria, and the Sudetenland, which the Nazis had annexed.

The Nazi occupation of Czechoslovakia was just a few months away when Winton arrived in Prague in late 1938. He assembled a team who set about photographing the children and collecting other details before starting to organize their evacuation. The first group of 20 left in January 1939. Then Winton returned to London with a long list of children who needed rescue.

He proceeded to prepare permits and travel warrants to enable the children to leave Prague and come to England; raised money to fund the transports and cover the 50 pound per child guarantee required to secure their entry into the United Kingdom; and identified British families willing to care for the refugee children. As the situation in Czechoslovakia grew more desperate following the German occupation of the entire country in March 1939, Winton, who was already fighting with bureaucrats to get the children out, began to forge entry permits.

That summer, eight rail *Kindertransports* were conducted. A ninth, which was due to leave on September 1, 1939, with another 250 children, was cancelled by the Nazis; it was the day Germany invaded Poland, initiating World War II. Of the 250 children due to leave on that train, only two survived the war.

Nevertheless, Winton and his colleagues did save 669 children: 561 of them Jewish, 52 Unitarian, 34 Catholic, and 22 others. A statue of Winton, accompanying two children to safety, was erected in 2009 at the main railway station in Prague.

In 2003, Winton was knighted by Queen Elizabeth II for "services to humanity in saving Jewish children," and in 2010, he was named a British Hero of the Holocaust by the British government. In 2014, he was awarded the highest honor of the Czech Republic, the Order of the White Lion, by Czech President Miloš Zeman, for giving Czech children "the greatest possible gift: the chance to live and to be free."

Winton is among those profiled in *Into the Arms of Strangers: Stories of the Kindertransport*, the winner of the 2001 Academy Award for best feature documentary. He was also honored on a stamp issued by Great Britain in 2016.

### ***Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow***

This month's book, "On The Doorposts Of Your House" (Prayers and Ceremonies for the Jewish Home), is a book that I did not know existed, but in fact was really needed. It is from the Central Conference of American Rabbis and dates from 1994. It was edited by Rabbi Chaim Stern, with assistance from Rabbis Donna Berman, H. Leonard Poller and Dr. Edward Graham. This committee has also produced numerous prayer books including Gates of Prayer for Shabbat and Gates of Prayer for Week-days. The one being reviewed is actually a revision of Gates of the House, but has a new name because it is an "expansion that adds substance and a new outlook...so it is to a considerable degree a new creation." In this book, the old has been revised, and there is much that has been added that is new. Also, the language used is gender-sensitive. God is not referred to exclusively in masculine language.

Besides the parts of the prayer service we are familiar with - such as the Morning, Afternoon and Evening services with Aleinu, Kaddish, Kiddush and more, there are then prayers and readings for many other topics. I think this is what makes this book so different. There are Prayer Readings for Everyday, which include evening and morning prayers for children, thanksgiving (even in short form), benedictions of prose and thanksgiving such as on joyous occasions, for a rainbow, for flowers and herbs, on seeing trees in blossom for the first time in the year, and even for lightning or other natural wonders. We can then read praises on seeing a secular scholar, upon recovery from serious illness or upon escape from danger and on hearing good tidings. There are even praises on fashioning or experiencing a work of art. New benedictions include on reaching the age of civic responsibility or before performing a civic duty. The next section includes Prayers and readings for Shabbat, Festivals, and Special Days, which also contains Purim and Chanukah Songs. Another section is called The Path of Life, and includes prayers on learning of a pregnancy, by those seeking to adopt a child, at a birthday celebration, at the beginning of a child's religious education, on entering college, before a journey, on beginning a new enterprise, at a time of achievement or of disappointment, at a time of anxiety, when our burdens seem too heavy, after a trauma, in chronic illness or disability, by a sick child, on hearing of a death, after a stillbirth or upon the death of a young child, upon terminating a pregnancy - and many more. There is also a section of Weekday services - Afternoon, Evening and Morning, Aleinu I and II, Kaddish, and Meditations for Mourners. This section also has prayers for everyday of the week. Psalms, Poems and Readings is the name of the next section. There are parts from the Talmud and Midrash, poems, readings for reflection and study, including topics such as: a New Year, on resolution, God in life and history, spiritual reality, religious experience, worship is not easy, the right attitude in prayers, how to fulfill a commandment, and love is a decision - to name a few. There are also selections from Pirke Avot. At the back of the book is a Table of Scriptural Readings - and the corresponding haftarat, both Ashkenazi and Sefardi.

You might be wondering why I am being so specific by giving you numerous topics contained in this book. I think I am trying to show you how all-encompassing Judaism can be about discussing most every aspect of life. If one is sad, anxious, bursting with joy, feeling thankful - or anything else you feel during your journey on earth, this book makes you realize(if you already haven't) that Judaism touches every facet of your life. Go through the pages of this book and you will always find something meaningful to read - silently or aloud. It's a good feeling to know that so many situations, whatever you have faced in your life, has, in Judaism, been thought about and discussed enough to be able to create a book such as On the Doorposts of Your House.

Florida canceled all standing requests for mail-in ballots effective January 1, 2023. Florida law SB-90, passed in 2021, imposed new rules on mail-in voting, effectively wiping out all existing applications for absentee ballots.

If you are a Florida resident who wishes to vote by mail in upcoming elections, you must now re-apply to receive a mail-in ballot, you will not automatically receive one. And you will have to renew your request with every new election cycle.

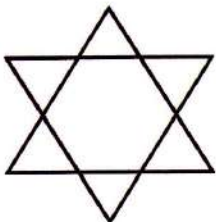
