

In keeping with the recent articles in the Shofar over the past few months this is from the ADL:

More than 30 ADL recommendations shaped strategy, which addresses broad range of antisemitism from all sides of the political spectrum.

New York, NY, May 25, 2023 – ADL (the Anti-Defamation League) today welcomed the release of the first-ever comprehensive U.S. National Strategy to Counter Antisemitism and announced commitments to support the White House in its execution. ADL also welcomed the adoption of the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA) definition of antisemitism as part of the plan. "As the U.S. Jewish community is experiencing antisemitism at levels not seen in generations, we deeply appreciate that the White House has stepped up and delivered this significant, comprehensive strategy," said Jonathan Greenblatt, ADL CEO. "It's particularly notable that this approach recognizes that antisemitism is not about politics – it's about principles. We are pleased that this strategy comprehensively addresses hate and antisemitism on campus, online, and from extremists on both the far-right and the far-left."

ADL actively assisted in the development of the White House strategy, contributing more than 30 distinct policy recommendations. ADL also organized grassroots advocates to urge Congress and the Biden Administration to develop a unified national strategy to monitor and combat antisemitism. The foundations for these policies were set in part by ADL's COMBAT Plan, a proposed set of government initiatives to fight antisemitism, which ADL originally released in June 2022. The COMBAT Plan articulated several of the key policies that were ultimately included in the White House strategy, such as efforts around education, community safety, hate crimes, and online hate.

In remarks at ADL's National Leadership Summit in May, Ambassador Susan E. Rice, Assistant to the President for Domestic Policy, noted that in developing this strategy, "I reviewed closely ADL's recommendations and found them to be helpful, creative, and smart."

In conjunction with the White House strategy, ADL is committing to strengthen cross-community engagements to fight antisemitism, including initiatives to convene community dialogues with diverse partners to build mutual understanding, and to combat antisemitism on college and university campuses. ADL will also support Jewish Employee Resource Groups (ERGs) in the government and private sector to promote a diverse and inclusive workplace where Jewish employees can be their authentic selves. Finally, ADL will partner with the Interparliamentary Task Force to Combat Online Antisemitism for an effort to address the challenges and opportunities presented by the use of AI and other new technologies.

This strategy comes amid real concern about antisemitism among the American Jewish community. In January, ADL released topline survey findings showing the highest percentage of respondents harboring extensive antisemitic prejudice in decades. Antisemitic incidents also surged to historic levels in 2022, with a total of 3,697 incidents reported across the United States, an increase of 36 percent compared to 2021.

Today's announcement comes after several productive collaborations between ADL and the White House. Last September, the Biden Administration brought together diverse communities to stand together against violent extremism at the historic United We Stand summit, which came about after ADL partnered with several leading anti-hate organizations to call for such an event. And in June 2021, the Biden Administration released the first-ever National Strategy to Counter Domestic Terrorism, incorporating recommendations from ADL's PROTECT Plan.

ADL is the leading anti-hate organization in the world. Founded in 1913, its timeless mission is "to stop the defamation of the Jewish people and to secure justice and fair treatment to all." Today, ADL continues to fight all forms of antisemitism and bias, using innovation and partnerships to drive impact. A global leader in combating antisemitism, countering extremism and battling bigotry wherever and whenever it happens, ADL works to protect democracy and ensure a just and inclusive society for all.





PROJECT LIFESAVER

Last month Chief Gene Saunders, founder and CEO of Project Lifesaver International, spoke to our Sisterhood about this wonderful program. Project Lifesaver is a non-profit 501C3 Public Safety program designed to protect and, when necessary, quickly locate "at risk" individuals who are prone to the threatening behavior of wandering.

The method relies on proven radio technology and specially trained search and rescue teams. Citizens enrolled in Project Lifesaver are outfitted with a radio frequency transmitter to be worn on the wrist or ankle at all times. Each transmitter emits an individualized frequency signal that is unique to the client.

If an enrolled client goes missing, the caregiver will notify the certified Project Lifesaver Member Agency, and a trained emergency team will respond to the wanderer's area with specialized receivers that will help triangulate the direction of the signal and help locate the client. Project Lifesaver is now proud to manage the world's leading system for the search and rescue of wandering victims of Autism, Down Syndrome as well as Alzheimer's and all related mental disabilities for people of all ages.



Stamp Of the Month: The Israeli Knesset Elects Yitzhak Rabin Prime Minister (For the First Time) 49 Years Ago

With all the turmoil and controversy Israel has experienced in selecting its prime minister over the past few years, this month we look back 49 years ago, to June 2, 1974, when Yitzhak Rabin, a man best remembered for his efforts to secure peace for Israel and its neighbors, was first appointed Israeli Prime Minister.

Born in Jerusalem on March 1, 1922, during the British Mandate over Palestine, Rabin had a distinguished career as Israeli Military Chief of Staff, Ambassador to the United States, and Israeli Minister of Labor before becoming Prime Minister.

As his country's leader, Rabin placed a special emphasis on improving the economy, solving social problems, and strengthening the Israel Defense Forces (IDF). With American mediation, Rabin concluded an interim agreement that led to peace between Egypt and Israel; the First Memorandum of Understanding followed between Israel and the United States, with the U.S. agreeing to help promote full observance of the Egypt-Israel Treaty of Peace.



In June 1976, the Rabin government ordered Operation Entebbe, the IDF mission that resulted in the rescue of 102 hostages held at Entebbe Airport in Uganda by the terrorist Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine.

Rabin's Labor Party was defeated in the May 1977 elections, but he served as Minister of Defense for much of the 1980s. He was once again elected Prime Minister in June 1992 on a platform embracing the Israeli-Palestinian peace process, and some of his greatest achievements occurred during this second term in office. In September 1993, Rabin and Palestine Liberation Organization Chairman Yasser Arafat signed the Declaration of Principles, outlining proposed interim self-government arrangements for the Palestinians. The Gaza-Jericho First agreement, signed in May 1994, addressed the implementation of the first stage of the Declaration. Following the progress in negotiations with the Palestinians, Rabin received the 1994 Nobel Peace Prize together with Arafat and Israeli Foreign Minister Shimon Peres. Then, in October 1994, Rabin and King Hussein signed the Israel-Jordan peace treaty.

On November 4, 1995, Rabin addressed a large peace rally in Tel Aviv's Kings of Israel Square, where he joined with singer Miri Aloni in a rousing rendition of her work "The Song For Peace." Minutes later, as he was leaving the event, a right-wing Israel extremist, Yigal Amir, jumped out of the crowd and shot Rabin two times from near point blank range. Less than two hours later Rabin was pronounced dead at a Tel Aviv area hospital.

Amir was later tried and convicted to serve a life sentence for Rabin's murder, in addition to six more years for injuring one of Rabin's bodyguards. Amir has never voiced any regrets for his actions and is still serving his sentence.

Rabin was laid to rest on Mount Herzl in Jerusalem. Hundreds of world leaders attended the funeral, including U.S. President Bill Clinton, Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak, and Jordanian King Hussein. Clinton's eulogy included this passage: "Legend has it that in every generation of Jews from time immemorial, a just leader emerged to protect his people and show them the way to safety. Prime Minister Rabin was such a leader." The square in Tel Aviv where he was assassinated was renamed Rabin Square in 1995.

Upon Rabin's death, Israel honored him with this month's featured stamp. It includes a portrait of Rabin that extends into the tab, the label below the stamp.

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



Unique. In some way, that is what describes the book I am reviewing this month. Its name is Voices and Visions, and it is an impressive collection of posters by talented graphic designers, and quotes from "Jewish Sages" throughout time. The readers are told in the Forward, written by Tom Teicholz, a journalist and film producer, that "combining these two things calls to mind the Jewish concept of hiddur mitzvah, of how a good deed of ritual observance, can be enhanced by its beauty or aes-

thetic." We are treated to 36 works which are in this book's collection of posters (striking ones at that). We are also told that "the challenge these posters address is an age-old one: how to affirm Jewish values while educating, informing, stimulating thought, and inspiring in a relevant manner." We give thanks to Harold Grinspoon, who commissioned three poster series. You will find that "each poster features a noted quote by a talented and celebrated graphic artist, further amplified with commentary and discussion questions by a leading current thinker." What makes this book unique is that "the pairing of images and words combine in ways that hold deep meaning." There is one description in this Introduction that helps us appreciate the book's approach. It was said by Tom Teicholz: "It is as if each quote ... is a beautiful flower on display and grown to hold our attention a little longer, to draw our understanding, to seed its language in our thoughts and emotions allowing it to continue to bloom throughout our lives. Likewise, the commentaries offer a current, accessible view for each quote with questions to expand our understanding."

Remember, as I share some of the book's contents, each saying has an explanation by another individual and then contains a visual of some sort. Due to space limitations, I will only be able to give you a small part of what appears within these pages.

Here are some examples:

- "Most of the things worth doing in the world were declared impossible before they were done." by Louis Brandeis."
- "A miracle cannot prove what is impossible. it only confirms what is possible." by Maimonides
- "From every human being there rises a light." by Baal Shem Tov
- "A human being is like a letter of the alphabet: to produce a word, it must combine with another." by Benjamin Mandelstamm
- "If you believe breaking is possible, believe fixing is possible." by Rabbi Nachman of Breslau
- "Silence remains, inescapably, a form of speech." by Susan Sontag
- "Once I had tasted the fruit of the tree of knowledge, there was no going back." by Blu Greenberg
- "The pursuit of knowledge, for its own sake, an almost fanatical love of justice, and the desire for personal independence-these are the features of the Jewish tradition which make me thank my lucky stars that I belong to it." by Albert Einstein
- "How wonderful it is that no one has to wait but can start right now to gradually change the world!" by Anne Frank
- "A life without a dream is not a life. But a dream without limits is an illusion." by Rabbi Yitz Greenberg
- "We must believe not only that all people are created equal but also that all peoples are created equal."

You may notice that after you read a quote, the discussion is brief, but add on a graphic and you will be impressed with the result. A little bit together creates a big punch. Because I have only shown you a portion out of the 36 quotations, I think it is worthwhile to look at the entire book - there is so much to think about! VOTER ALERT

Florida canceled all standing requests for mail-in ballots effective January 1, 2023. Florida law SB-90, passed in 2021, imposed new rules on mail-in voting, effectively wiping out all existing applications for absentee ballots.

If you are a Florida resident who wishes to vote by mail in upcoming elections, you must now re-apply to receive a mail-in ballot, you will not automatically receive one. And you will have to renew your request with every new election cycle.

Online Voter Registration (OVR) is now available in Florida.

You can register to request an absentee ballot or update your voter registration information online from any computer or handheld device by logging on to: www.slcelections.com and follow the prompts.






