From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

September brings us to a yearly juncture in our lives. It brings us to the cusp of spiritual renewal and reflection. VOTER ALERT

Florida canceled all standing requests for mail-in ballots effective January 1, 2023. Florida law SB-90, passed in 2021, imposed new rules on mail-in voting, effectively wiping out all existing applications for absentee ballots.

If you are a Florida resident who wishes to vote by mail in upcoming elections, you must now re-apply to receive a mail-in ballot, you will not automatically receive one. And you will have to renew your request with every new election cycle.

Online Voter Registration (OVR) is now available in Florida.

You can register to request an absentee ballot or update your voter registration information online from any computer or handheld device by logging on to: www.scelections.com and follow the prompts.

Remember the MST 860 lesson: Indifference to government actions is the same as approval.

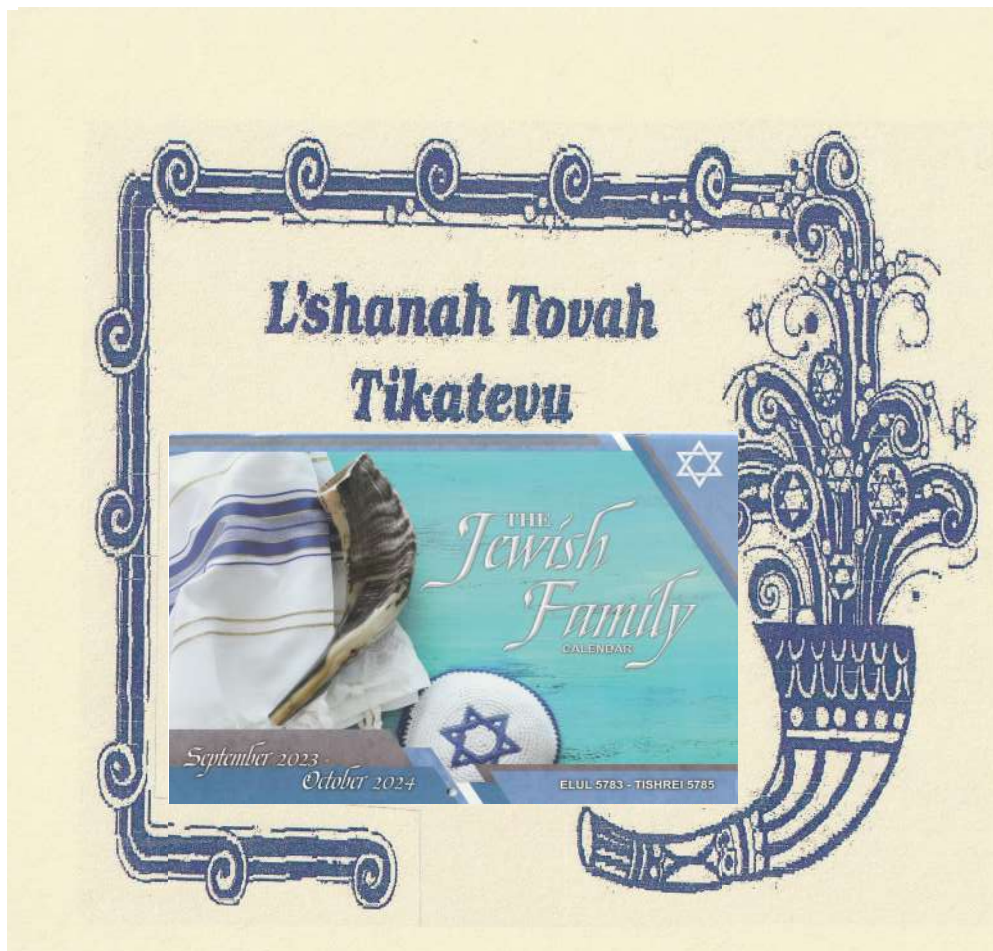
We wish all members of TBEI a healthy and productive New Year!

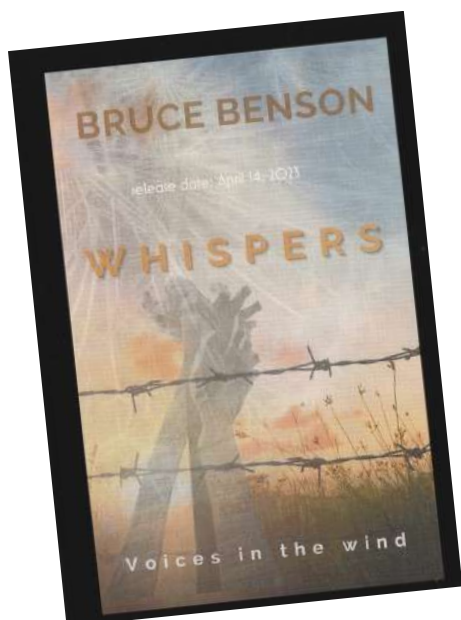

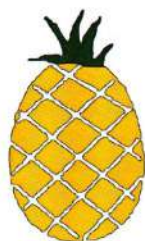

THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ By Ellis Bromberg

Stamp Of the Month: A ROSH HASHANAH FEAST!

The onset of the New Year brings with it the hope of rectifying past problems and the anticipation of fulfilling achievements and wishes. These feelings are expressed through New Year's greetings and by performing actions symbolizing renewal and hope for a better future.

One custom associated with Rosh Hashanah is eating foods that serve as good omens or hints of blessing as we end one year and begin the new one. The Talmudic rabbi Abaye suggested that serving these symbolic foods will bring about a positive judgment from God. This month's featured set, issued by Israel in 2011, includes several foods whose natural characteristics serve as good wishes for the New Year, and the blessings to be said over each (with thanks to my Israeli friend Rivka Himmel for her translations):

Apples and honey (1.70 shekels). The plate on the stamp reads: "*Shana tova u'mi-tukah*" (a good and sweet New Year), the blessing said as the sweet apple slices are dipped in the honey.

A fish head (4 shekels). The plate on the stamp reads: "*Shenihyeh l'rosh v'lo l'zanav*" (that we should be heads -- i.e., leaders, or at the head of what we do, or get ahead -- and not tails), the blessing said as a piece of a fish's head is eaten. The saying comes from Deuteronomy 28:13. It is customary to recite additional blessings based on the characteristics of fish, such as "we should multiply as fish" or "that You should watch over us with the open eye of a fish" (fish do not have eyelids so their eyes are always open). Among some Jewish groups, it is customary to eat a piece of a sheep or ram's head, rather than that of a fish, reciting the blessing "and remember the ram of Isaac," alluding to the ram that was sacrificed in lieu of Isaac.

A pomegranate (5.90 shekels). The plate on the stamp reads: "*Sheyirbu zechuyoteinu k'rimon*" (may our merits be plentiful like a pomegranate), the blessing recited as seeds of the fruit are eaten. It is said that under its tough red outer skin, each pomegranate has, on average, 613 berry-like seeds, mirroring the 613 mitzvot we count in the Torah.

The tabs, the labels under all three stamps, read "*Moadim 5772*" (Festivals).

And as we enter this New Year of 5784, we wish the entire TBEI congregation, our families and friends *L'shanah tova tikateivu v'teichateimu*: a good year, and may you be inscribed and sealed for blessing in the Book of Life!

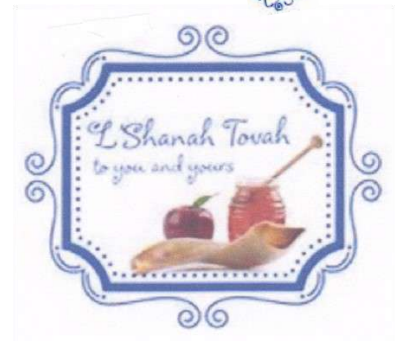

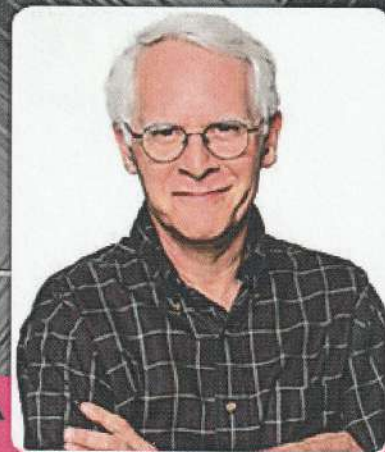

I glanced at my book review article in last year's September Shofar and noticed that I seem to begin with an introduction putting forth the same idea I include almost every year. I wrote that it's that "time of the year" again, the High Holidays, and I always mention that "time flies" since last Rosh Hashanah. Well, this year is no exception! It's difficult to believe that the High Holidays are fast approaching, but they are arriving with new vows, new examinations of our past deeds, new thoughts, and new forgiveness. Along with that, I offer you the topic of new culinary delights - something I have done almost every Rosh Hashanah.

The new culinary delight I am sharing with you this new year is one that appears in the cookbook Kosher Gourmet, by the 92nd Street Y Cooking School. This book had been formerly titled The International Kosher Cookbook and was edited by Batia Plotch and Patricia Cobe. It is a combination of many delicious recipes from all around the world. What dishes are included? Here are the types of food within its pages - French, Japanese, Indian, Moroccan, Turkish, Iraqi-Syrian, Thai, Hungarian, Chinese, Italian, Caribbean, Mexican, Vietnamese, and Russian-Polish (Eastern-European). That's quite an assortment!

The recipe below is an easy Middle-Eastern style one with two ingredients used during Rosh Hashanah - honey and figs. I hope you enjoy it.

Chicken With Figs - (makes 4-6 servings, but can easily be doubled)

One 3-3 1/2-pound chicken, cut into pieces
12 ounces Greek style dried figs, soaked and drained
1 cup dry white wine
1 cup honey
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 teaspoon ground coriander
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.
2. Arrange chicken pieces in large deep roasting pan. In medium bowl combine figs and remaining ingredients, stirring to dissolve honey. Pour mixture over chicken.
3. Bake chicken about 1 hour, or until tender and browned, turning once and basting occasionally with pan juices.

There are other Rosh Hashanah recipes included in this book. They include: Round Challahs, stuffed cabbage, carrot, apple and sweet potato tzimmes, honey cake, and almond bread. Don't forget to look through the rest of the book for "anytime" recipes. You'll find they are somewhat different than the recipes in "temple cookbooks" that many of us own. This particular cookbook is like taking a trip around the world in the luxury of your own home. And it's free!

Why not try a new recipe for your Rosh Hashanah table? It will take its place among all of your "tried and true" older ones that you enjoy! B'Tai Avon (Bon Appetit)!

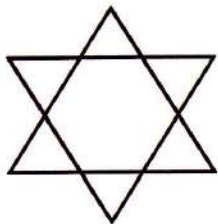
