



THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ REMEMBERING ISRAELI DIPLOMAT ABBA EBAN by Ellis Bromberg

This February 2 marks the 108th anniversary of the birth of Israeli statesman and diplomat Abba Eban; his portrait appears on this month's featured stamp, a 2006 Israeli issue.

The New York Times obituary of Abba Eban, written upon his death in 2002, called him the "shaper of Israeli destiny in (its) early years...the erudite diplomat whose oratory and wit gained admiration and sympathy for Israel during the perilous first 30 years of its independence." In his day, Israeli Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion had put it more succinctly: he called Eban "the voice of Israel."

He was born in 1915 in Cape Town, South Africa, to Lithuanian Jewish parents. After his father died when Abba (his birth name was Aubrey Eban) was a young child, he and his mother moved to England where he was raised and educated in a Jewish and Zionist milieu.

Upon completing his education at Cambridge University, where he specialized in Semitic languages, he was appointed a lecturer there. In addition, he became active in Zionist groups in London. During World War II, he served as an officer in British Intelligence, attaining the rank of major, and also became the British Intelligence liaison with the Zionist leadership in Mandatory Palestine.

After his release from the British army at the war's end, Eban immigrated to what is today the State of Israel and began working in the political department of the Jewish Agency for Eretz Israel. He assisted Zionist patriarch Chaim Weizmann in the political and diplomatic struggle leading up to the 1947 United Nations decision to partition Mandatory Palestine, and helped arrange a critical meeting between Weizmann and President Harry Truman in the weeks before the U.S. would recognize Israeli independence in 1948.

With the establishment of the State of Israel, Eban was named the country's representative at the U.N., and thereafter its ambassador to that body. In 1950, at the age of 35, he became, additionally, Ambassador to the United States, holding both offices until 1959. In the dual roles, Eban largely determined the pattern of activity of all Israeli diplomats who followed him.

He helped negotiate a critical security guarantee for Israel following the 1956 British-French-Israeli invasion of the Sinai. The first U.S. aid for Israel was attained during his tenure, and the Israel Bonds venture was established. At his initiative, the American Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC) advocacy group was formed, and the activity of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations was institutionalized.

Upon his return to Israel, Eban was elected to the Knesset, and served in Ben-Gurion's government, first as Minister without portfolio and later as Minister of Education and Culture. In 1963, with the election of Levi Eshkol as Prime Minister, Eban was appointed Deputy Prime Minister.

From 1966-1974 he served as Foreign Minister in the governments headed by Eshkol and Golda Meir. As part of his duties, he led the government's political and diplomatic activity, acting as Israel's main contact with President Lyndon Johnson on the eve of the Six-Day War of June 1967. The following year he conducted some of Israel's earliest secret contacts with King Hussein of Jordan. He fought for the wording of Security Council Resolution 242, which stipulated "no withdrawal without peace," and became the cornerstone in the peace process between Israel and the Arabs. As Foreign Minister, Eban headed the Israeli delegation to the Geneva Conference in December 1973, which was, in effect, the first peace conference.

He served as a member of the Knesset and its Foreign Affairs and Security Committee from 1974-1988, chairing the committee from 1984-1988.

This month's featured stamp



A brilliant speaker, he was considered one of the best orators in the world. It was the paradox of Eban's career that his eloquence made him more popular with Jews abroad than with Israelis, who came to judge him as pompous and, eventually, isolated from the political mainstream. In the last years of his life, Eban devoted himself to teaching at various universities in the U.S., and to producing several fascinating TV series on the Jewish contribution to civilization, the history of the State of Israel, and the peace process. These series were screened widely and made an important contribution to the projection of Israel's image throughout the world. He also wrote books on the subjects of diplomacy and Jewish heritage. His point of view reflected his vision of the centrality of Jewish history to world civilization and a need to engage Palestinians in the search for peace; but he also wrote about the many mistakes and shortcomings he saw in the careers of other Israeli leaders.

The Stamp of the Month features a portrait by famed Israeli painter Amnon David Ar; the stamp was designed by Moshe Pereg. Last month, I had an opportunity to speak with Mr. Pereg, who has designed dozens of Israeli stamps.

I wondered about the colorful horizontal bars on the left side of the stamp and tab. Mr. Pereg told me that these were added to represent generic flags of various countries, suggesting that in Eban's role as an Israeli diplomat and U.N. ambassador, he had dealings with many nations all over the world. (Placing specific flags of other countries on a stamp of Israel would have been politically problematic.)

I also wanted to know if the photograph on the tab (the label on the bottom of the stamp) represented some specific event at which Eban had spoken. No, said Mr. Pereg. The addition of the photo was meant to convey the notion that during his years on the international scene, Eban was, as Ben-Gurion had said, "the voice of Israel."

No other foreign minister ever gained such world recognition, and no other diplomat could represent Israel's position as skillfully as Eban did. In 2001, he was awarded the Israel Prize for his life's work and his contribution to society and the state. Abba Eban died on November 17, 2002.

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



The Terezin Concentration Camp, outside of Prague, was the place that was created to cover up the Nazi genocide of the Jews. Within the ghetto there, we find culture flourishing - with a high proportion of artists and intellectuals - a "model ghetto" for the American Red Cross which came to visit in 1944. But it was not lacking in disease and starvation. Transports from there went to the death camps in the east.

The expanded version of this month's review, I Never Saw Another Butterfly, gives us a look at what life was like in Terezin - through the eyes of children living there. Between 1942-44, 15,000 children under the age of fifteen came there, but less than 100 survived. What they tell you is so true and honest. It is in the form of poems they wrote and drawings they made. I offer you several examples in this book review so you can get an idea of their daily misery and their "hopes and fears, plus their courage and even optimism."

THE BUTTERFLY


The last, the very last, So richly, brightly, dazzling yellow. Perhaps if the sun's tears would sing against a white stone....

We pick up the feeling of isolation, trying to find out what there is to love, the awareness of being watched, the relationships of adults as they talk about their old homes, arguing amongst themselves, struggling over what will be, the yearning to be free - basically the feelings of what was, what is and what might be.

The thoughts these children put on paper make us realize that they provide us with an insightful look at life in this concentration camp. Here we see a maturity level among them that is admirable for children so young. Did they know the horrible ending to the story that would apply to them? With everything they saw, they still held on to hope!




