

BROTHERHOOD NEWS :



THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ ALLIES LIBERATE AUSCHWITZ CONCENTRATION CAMP


It was 79 years ago this month, on January 27, 1945, that the Allies -- specifically Soviet soldiers -- liberated Auschwitz, the largest World War II concentration and extermination camp, located in Oświęcim, Nazi-occupied Poland. This month's stamp is from Poland, issued in 1975 to mark the 30th anniversary of the liberation. In stark red and black, it features a chain of severed barbed wire and a red P triangle badge, which was worn by non-Jewish Polish prisoners, in front of a background in the distinctive vertical stripe pattern seen on prisoners' uniforms.

In mid-January 1945, as Soviet forces approached the concentration camp complex, the Nazi SS began evacuating Auschwitz and its subcamps. SS units forced nearly 60,000 prisoners to march west from the camp. When the soldiers arrived, they found several thousand emaciated survivors left, and the smouldering remains of gas chambers and crematoria after the Nazis attempted to destroy evidence of their crimes. Thousands were killed in the camps in the days

before the death marches began.

Auschwitz-Birkenau was the killing center at Auschwitz. Almost all the deportees who arrived at the camps were sent immediately to death in the gas chambers. It is estimated that the SS and police deported a minimum of 1.3 million people to the Auschwitz complex between 1940-1945. Of these, the camp authorities murdered 1.1 million men, women, and children. Over 90 percent of them were Jewish.

Auschwitz remains today a symbol of the horror of industrialized murder, and what can happen when hatred is left unchecked.

IRS Issue Number: 2023-235

Get ready to file in 2024: What's new and what to consider

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service today urged taxpayers to take important actions now to help them file their 2023 federal income tax return next year.

Here's what's new and what to consider before filing next year.

IRS Online Account enhancements

Taxpayers and Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) holders can now access their <u>Online Account</u> and view, approve and electronically sign power of attorney and tax information authorizations from their tax professional.

With an Online Account, individuals can also:

- •View their tax owed and payment history and schedule payments.
- •Request tax transcripts.
- •View or apply for payment plans.
- •See digital copies of some IRS notices.
- •View key data from their most recently filed tax return, including adjusted gross income.

•Validate bank accounts and save multiple accounts, eliminating the need to re-enter bank account information every time they make a payment.

Avoid refund delays and understand refund timing

Many different factors can affect the timing of a refund after the IRS receives a tax return. Although the IRS issues most refunds in less than 21 days, the IRS cautions taxpayers not to rely on receiving a 2023 federal tax refund by a certain date, especially when making major purchases or paying bills. Some returns may require additional review and may take longer to process if IRS systems detect a possible error, the return is missing information or there is suspected identity theft or fraud.

Also, the IRS cannot issue refunds for people claiming the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) or Additional Child Tax Credit (ACTC) before mid-February. The law requires the IRS to hold the entire refund – not just the portion associated with the EITC or ACTC. The IRS expects most EITC and ACTC related refunds to be available in taxpayer bank accounts or on debit cards by Feb. 27, 2024, if the taxpayer chose direct deposit and there are no other issues with the tax return.

Gather 2023 tax documents

Taxpayers should develop a record keeping system – electronic or paper – that keeps important information in one place. This includes year-end income documents like Forms W-2 from employers, Forms 1099 from banks or other payers, Forms 1099-K from third party payment networks, Forms 1099-NEC for nonemployee compensation, Forms 1099-MISC for miscellaneous income or Forms 1099-INT for interest paid, as well as records documenting all digital asset transactions

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



Yiddish. We know it's a language which was formed between the 10th and 12th centuries in Germany and is based on German dialects and much Hebrew, but also contains Ukrainian, Polish and Russian. As Jews moved to other countries, they spoke Yiddish in

societies where they did not have equal rights. For example, the Jews of Poland and Russia spoke Yiddish, while the overwhelming majority of Jews in 19th century France and Germany spoke French and German. When Jews migrated to countries where they had equal rights, they usually spoke Yiddish for the first generation. In more recent times in New York, over 200,000 Yiddish newspapers were sold in the 1920's. Today, certain Hasidic sects speak Yiddish as their primary language. Even though many have predicted the death of Yiddish, that language seems to still cling to life. And what about the many Yiddish words that have entered the vocabulary of non-Jews? We all are familiar with many of them - words such as shlep, maven, kibbitz, shlemiel, meshuga, bagel, pastrami, mensch, chutzpah and Yenta. You can probably think of more, some of which I cannot print here due to their inappropriate nature.

I am reviewing the book Yiddish Wisdom. I realize there are some of you who know practically no Yiddish at all, or know enough to understand a limited amount of Yiddish words, and there are others who can recognize the gist of what someone is speaking, and probably fewer who can understand as well as speak Yiddish. But no matter what your level of Yiddish is, this book is for all of you.

The book's pages contain over 100 Yiddish folk sayings. Each one is written in English, with the Yiddish underneath it in italics. Paintings adorn the pages all illustrated by Kristina Swarner.

I am now going to include some examples of the sayings. I will type the saying in English with the Yiddish next to it in italics:

- A fault finder complains even that the bride is too pretty
- No answer is also an answer
- A half truth is a whole lie
- A liar must have a good memory
- When one must, one can
- Suspense is worse than the ordeal itself
- He who has not tasted the bitter does not understand the sweet

- A chissiren di kallah iz tsu shain
- Nit kain entfer iz oich an entfer
- A halber emes iz amol a ganster ligen
- A ligner darf hoben a guten zickorin
- Az me muz, ken men
- Der Inn-hadin iz erger vi der din alain
 - Der vos hot nit farzucht bitterch,vaist nit voz zies iz

As I mentioned before, Yiddish is a colorful language. It is lively and also humorous and will make you think deeply about the meanings of the folk sayings displayed on its pages. You may be left with a thoughtful look on your face, or you may even laugh a little. No matter what your reaction is, it is a book to sit and ponder. Have a meaningful and enjoyable experience!






