
As we are planning on integrating screens for the High Holidays this year, we will be offering a class to introduce the new look, feel and translations of many of our prayers we use during the High Holiday season.







YOM HASHOAH

More than seventy-nine years have passed since the Nazi concentration camps were liberated and the Holocaust that claimed the six million Jewish lives came to an end. To ensure that the six million did not die in vain and that the Holocaust never happens again, Temple Beth El Israel once again will join Jews throughout the United States and around the world by participating in the Yom Hashoah Yellow Candle Holocaust Commemoration to keep alive the memories of the Six Million who perished.

The Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle is modeled after a traditional Jewish Yahrzeit memorial candle that burns for 24 hours during periods of mourning. The wax reminds us of the yellow arm bands that Jews were forced to wear during the Nazi regime.

As the years pass, the memories of those who were victims in this ultimate hate crime must not diminish. We encourage your family to light a yellow candle on the night of Monday, May 6, 2024, and join as thousands of Jewish families light their Yom HaShoah candles. This action will continue to increase the awareness of the Holocaust and help perpetuate our commitment to our people – particularly recently, with the marked increase of anti-Semitism.

The memory is important! The number of Holocaust survivors is rapidly diminishing with each passing day. As we lose this precious link, those who deny that the Holocaust happened gain strength. Sadly, a study conducted reported that 22 percent of millennials (23 to 38 years old) say they haven't even heard of the Holocaust.

Temple Beth El Israel Brotherhood will distribute a Yom HaShoah yellow candle to each Temple family. Please join us in lighting this candle in memory of our six million brothers and sisters who perished.

In addition, we encourage you to attend our Holocaust Memorial Yizkor Service led by Rabbi Benson on Friday, May 3rd, 2024 at 7:30 p.m. Please mark your calendar and save the date.





CELEBRATING PASSOVER WITH THE ILLUMINATED BARCELONA HAGGADAH



On Monday evening, April 22, Jews around the world will sit down for the traditional, festive Passover seder meal, and read from the Haggadah, the text that sets forth the order of the seder. The word Haggadah means "telling" in Hebrew and, according to Jewish practice, reading the Haggadah at the seder table is a fulfillment of the mitzvah to tell our children the story, from the Book of Exodus, of God bringing the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt with "a strong hand and an outstretched arm."

The tradition of reading the Haggadah to guide the seder dates back to the Middle Ages, although some of the elements that make up contemporary Haggadot date to the 5th century BCE. The Haggadah includes various prayers, blessings, rituals, fables, songs, and directions on how the seder is performed.

Many Haggadot also include beautiful artwork to augment the Passover story. One known as the Barcelona Haggadah is depicted on a striking souvenir sheet issued by Portugal in 2010; it is this month's featured stamp. The Barcelona Haggadah dates from the mid-14th century, and is now housed in London's British Library where it is recognized as one of the finest illuminated Hebrew manuscripts. It is named after the heral-dic shield it bears, which resembles the arms of Barcelona, Spain. At the time of its creation, the Jews of Catalonia and Aragon formed one of the largest Jewish communities in Europe, and Barcelona was home to a flourishing center of manuscript illustration, influenced by Italian and French styles.

The Barcelona Haggadah is known for its many rich color illuminations: 128 of its 322 pages are illustrated with scenes depicting Jewish cultural and religious life in Spain, as well as the Exodus story. It was printed in 12 colors with hand-applied raised gold metallic leaf, and also features large, clear script, only eight lines per page, probably designed so that it could be easily read by children. In addition to the traditional seder readings, the Barcelona Haggadah also includes sections containing the Laws of Passover, *piyyutim* (liturgical songs), and Torah readings for the Passover festival according to the Spanish custom; and Aramaic *piyyutim* and translations according to French custom.

An inscription confirms that the original was sold to Rabbi Moses ben Abraham of Bologna, Italy, in 1459 for 50 gold ducats, so it left Spain prior to the expulsion of that country's Jews. The British Museum bought it in 1844. In 1992, a meticulously reproduced facsimile was published by the Museum with a limited edition of 550 copies; its price was \$4810.

The souvenir sheet, which includes a 2.50 euro stamp embedded at the upper left, reproduces a page from the Barcelona Haggadah titled "we were slaves to Pharaoh in Egypt" (the Hebrew on the sheet reads "we were slaves"). It shows Hebrew slaves constructing a brick building under the menacing eyes of three Egyptian officers, one with a whip, the other two on horseback.

The Haggadah retells the story of Passover as a festival of freedom, and our people's transition from slavery to freedom. *Chag Pesach sameach!*



Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



One of my favorite Jewish holidays is in April - Passover! I love its story, its symbolism, its joy and of course, its food. Over the years, concerning food, I have heard individuals say that it's not what one cannot eat on Passover - it's all about the new recipes created for this wonderful holiday that makes eating a delight. And what a variety we have! Who would think

there is a "Passover Pizza" or a fancy chocolate roll fit for royalty? I'll be sharing two recipes from a book in our library, The Passover Gourmet, by Nira Rousso. We all know and perhaps use many of the old "go-to" recipes like kneidel and matzo-brei. But the author's purpose in writing this book was "to prove that cooking on Passover would be as varied as the rest of the year and not require more work." She believes that "the different Jewish culinary traditions are as much at home with each other as they are modern kitchen appliances." Let's now take a look at a couple of recipes for this spring holiday.



Zucchini Fritada

There is a "Fritada" which the author tells us is a "vegetable and egg pie unique to the Sephardic kitchen." Among the Turkish and Greek Jews, it has a special association with Passover. It can be used as an appetizer at the night of the seder or as a part of breakfast. Of course, it can be and is eaten at any time of the year. Families have eaten it in different ways: such as: like a pie - with knife and fork, or as a slice of pizza. Many individuals will add some type of topping - with sour cream or yogurt, or with a lemon. And then there are others who absolutely refuse to add anything.

Ingredients:

1 1/2 lbs fresh zucchini

1 onion

3 tbs oil

5 matzah

1 cup cottage cheese

1 tsp salt

5 eggs

1 cup sour cream

1 1/4 cups (5 oz) grated cheddar cheese

Peel and grate the zucchini and onion and saute them in the oil for 10 minutes.

Break the matzah, soak them in warm water for 5 minutes and squeeze them dry.

Mix the zucchini, onion and matzah with all the other ingredients.

Grease a 13x9 inch baking pan, spread the mixture evenly with moist hands and bake at 350 degrees for about 50 minutes or until golden brown.

Serve with yogurt, sour cream or lemon juice.

Cream Cheese Apricot Cake

What about dessert? The following one can be served warm with vanilla ice cream. Ingredients:

4 matzah

1 cup sweet wine

5 eggs separated

1 cup sugar

1 cup dried apricots

1/2 cup hazelnuts

1/2 cup raisins

1/2 cup dried figs, chopped

8 oz cream cheese

1 tsp vanilla

Crumble the matzah. Heat the wine and pour over the matzah. Let stand for 20 minutes.

Separate the eggs: Beat the egg whites until stiff peaks form. Add half the amount of sugar gradually.

Chop all the dried fruits and nuts in a food processor or in a meat grinder.

Mix the dried fruits and nuts with the egg yolks, matzah, cream cheese, vanilla, remaining sugar and egg whites. Grease a 13x9 inch pan and bake at 325 degrees for 50 minutes.

There are so many wonderful recipes in this book. Let me list some which may interest you: Leek-feta patties, sugar-coated matzah from Morocco, Italian-walnut-honey griddle cakes, Passover pizza, sea bass in Sabra and almonds, light borscht with apples, stuffed chicken in coffee glaze, lamb chops in prunes and onions, orange-apple tzimmes, almond spice cookies and more. If you try any recipes from this book, please let me know. If you enjoyed them, I'll share this with our readers.
