From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

So, it's summer. I feel the heat and envision the sight of our ancestors trekking across the desert, carry the emotional and physical weight of the commitment to the exodus from an underprivileged existence, being driven to the mountain to receive the commandments which will be protected in the cocoon of the ark of the covenant. They are hot, tired, unclear as to where they are actually going or the route to take them there.

They are, however, clinging onto the hopes and nascent dreams of a people attempting to visioning a new existence, a new future.

Apple Honey Muffins for Rosh HaShanah

Filling:

2 tablespoons butter or margarine

4 Granny Smith apples, diced

4 tablespoons sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

Batter:

2 cups prepared tea, lukewarm

2 cups sugar

2 cups oil

2 cups honey

12 eggs

6 cups flour

2 tablespoons baking powder

1 teaspoon baking soda

2 heaping tablespoons cinnamon



In a saucepan, melt butter over a medium-low flame. Add apples, sugar, and cinnamon; cook until apples are fragrant and soften a bit, about 15 minutes. Set aside to cool.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a muffin pan with cupcake liners.

Mix on medium speed, combine tea, sugar, oil, honey, and eggs. Mix until smooth. Reduce speed; gradually add flour, baking powder, baking soda, and cinnamon. Scrape down sides of bowl as needed.

Fill each muffin cup halfway with batter. Top with a teaspoon of prepared apples.

Bake for 15-20 minutes, or until an inserted toothpick comes out almost dry with some moist crumbs attached.





THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ By Ellis Bromberg

Stamp Of the Month: AN INTERNATIONAL AFFIRMATION OF
A RIGHT TO A NATIONAL HOME FOR THE JEWISH PEOPLE

The Balfour Declaration was a public statement issued by the British Government in 1917, during the First World War, announcing its support for the establishment of a "national home for the Jewish people" in Palestine, then a region controlled by the Ottoman Empire. The Declaration was contained in a letter from the United Kingdom's Foreign Secretary and former Prime Minister Arthur Balfour to Lord Rothschild, a leader of the British Jewish Community, for transmission to the Zionist Federation of Great Britain and Ireland. Britain was at war with the Ottoman Empire at the time, and sought the support of its Jewish citizens in its efforts.



The historic event we commemorate this month was the ratification of the Balfour Declaration on July 24, 1922, by the League of Nations. The Declaration was the first recognition of the Jewish people's right to a national homeland, and the support from the League of Nations, the worldwide intergovernmental organization that preceded the United Nations, was considered a key official step toward achieving a Jewish state in the Middle East. After the defeat of the Ottoman Empire in World War I, the League of Nations granted the British Empire the mandate to the area that would eventually encompass Israel and Jordan: it was designated Mandatory Palestine.

The Balfour Declaration was seen by many Jews as a historic, almost messianic, event that created a new future for the Jewish people. It is cited in Israel's Declaration of Independence which states that "the right of the Jewish people to national rebirth in its own country...was recognized by the Balfour Declaration"; today it remains an influential and meaningful, if controversial, political document.

The Balfour Declaration Centennial was celebrated in this month's featured multicolored stamp, issued by Israel in 2017. The tab, the label attached to the stamp, makes this reference to the League of Nations' historic re-affirmation of the Declaration: " [it] gave international sanction to the Historic Connection between the Jewish People and Eretz-Israel and to the right of the Jewish People to rebuild its National Home."

The stamp features two sentences, the first from the Balfour Declaration itself and the second from Israel's Declaration of Independence, which appear in the form of the infinity symbol, expressing the unbreakable bond between the two documents and the eternal connection between the Jewish people and the land of Israel. The tab also includes two portraits: Arthur Balfour on the left; and Chaim Weitzmann, leader of the British Zionist Federation and later the first president of Israel, on the right.

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow



Summer. In South Florida that means days of extreme heat and humidity with thunderstorms at almost any time. Some of us may choose to leave our homes less often. So what is the perfect indoor activity here? Reading of course! To help us, our library has a book which reviews many other books from all walks of life. It does this by including 2-3 pages that describe each book,

convincing you it is just waiting to be read. It makes you feel like you have just walked into a candy store! It is even better than a library in some ways, providing the reader with information right at their fingertips, without having to look through many books on shelves. The name of the book I am reviewing is 100 Essential Books for Jewish Readers by Rabbi Daniel B. Syme and Cindy Frenkel Kanter. If you've run out of books to read, then this book under review is worth exploring.

In order to create the above book, the authors asked many Jewish readers to submit their personal "top ten" lists. There were thousands of titles submitted, finally leading to the top 100 -both fiction and non-fiction. The authors then summarized the contents of each book, "its relevance at the time of publication and its contemporary significance". Please remember that I am reviewing the major book, 100 Essential Books for Jewish Readers, not the individual books it reviews, but it will give you an idea of the numerous types of books included in the list of 100.

The individual books are from every subject imaginable, and the authors have made it possible to make it easier for you to find some you might be interested in. They have organized the book into six major topics which are: Jewish Texts of Belief and Thought and Their Interpretation, Jewish Observance and Jewish Values, Jewish Philosophy and Theology, Jewish History and Anti-Semitism, Israel and the Holocaust, and Fiction and General Works on Jewish Themes. Each of these topics includes a group of books that relate to the topic in which it was placed, with a summary of the individual book, its relevance at the time of publication and its significance. Facts about the author are often included. Even though the review is short, it hits all of the important information you might like to know. Now let us take a look at some of the books that appear on the 100 list.

<u>The Hebrew Bible</u> - Of course, this is a must. It is a brief but concise review of the three major sections, how it is set up, and its importance.

<u>Legends of the Bible</u> by Louis Ginsberg - gives us examples and explanations of some of the famous and not so famous stories our Bible contains.

New Reform Responsa by Solomon B Freehof - a book in which the author applies Jewish law in a rapidly changing world.

<u>Does God Have a Big Toe?</u> by Marc Gellman - a book which tells stories about the stories in the Bible. Rabbi Gellman's sense of humor is apparent in his writing. Each story teaches us a lesson from the Bible. Easy to understand.

The Book of Miracles by Lawrence Kushner. In it, we are told that as children grow up, their early beliefs in miracles turn to a feeling of betrayal and cynicism not just about miracles which they believe were taught as facts, but to Judaism in general. But Rabbi Kushner presents Biblical miracles as legends in which God is present and plays a role. He is really talking to children in this book.

<u>Forty Things You Can Do to Save the Jewish People</u> by Joel Lurie Grishaver -the author suggests simple things you can do to incorporate Judaism into your life even if it means filling our homes with Jewish aromas and lighting Shabbat candles in, of all places, Disneyworld.

<u>Bubby</u>, <u>Me</u>, and <u>Memories</u> by Barbara Pomerantz - The author received the National Book Award. It shows us how children may go through the grieving process. This one is about the relationship with her grandmother.

<u>The Jewish You Wouldn't Believe It Book</u> by M. Hirsh Goldberg - This is an extremely interesting book, full of tidbits of information you would love to know: the origins of the Star of David, inventions created by Jews, Jewish word phrases and more. We will see how Jews have impacted human history.

<u>Hitler's Willing Executioners</u> by Daniel Jonah Goldhagan - a bestseller in the U.S. The objective of the author was "to explain why the Holocaust occurred, to explain how it could occur." The emphasis is on the ordinary German rather than on the Nazi Party and its leaders - people who thought what they were doing was right.

<u>The Drama of Albert Einstein</u> by Antonina Vallentin - Here is a biography about a man who could not hold a job, gave interviews that were a disaster, would never wear socks and who urged President Truman to drop "the bomb" in a neutral area rather than on Hiroshima. Just when you thought you knew everything about Einstein!

The authors of 100 Essential Books For Jewish Readers have been diligent about informing us concerning the necessary information needed to give us a good idea of whether or not we would like to read any specific books on the list. We have been introduced to 100 books which differ in so many ways - there are bestsellers and then hidden jewels. You will, from time to time, see the same authors, their names appear more than once - names such as Lawrence J. Kushner, Harold Kushner, Elie Wiesel, Simon Wiesenthal and Chaim Potok. But you will also find names you have never heard of before.

Thanks to Amazon and in a few cases, our Temple library, we now have two ways in which to find some of the books in the 100 list. 100 Essential Books for Jewish Readers - what a helpful and great gift this book is for all of us!
