### *From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson*

The Torah portions coming up in the next several weeks are preparing us for the most important events in the history of the Israelite people.

We are about to embark on the Exodus. Nascent freedom does not suggest that people who have just tasted freedom, who are unsure how to deal with the trials and tribulations of freedom and, even more importantly, how to handle this new skill, who are asked to parse the skills needed to live according to the concepts freedom requires of us.

After 3 years of trials and tribulations in the desert, God points out that structures must be created to elicit stability and so, the Israelites, upon reaching the boundaries of Canaan, are rebuffed by God who feels they are not ready, do not have the necessary skill sets to handle governance and all that entails. God sends them back into the desert to learn what is needed to rule over, defend and, in fact, dominate those who actually already inhabit the land before God suggests they are ready to rule.

That explains the other 37 years of wandering and through necessity building a society with rules and commonality to create consolidated purpose. There is great strength found in those moments of joining together.


Over the next few weeks, we will encounter God in many challenges must surmount, at Mount Sinai, crossing of the Sea of Reeds, building and then destroying the Golden Calf are just some of the most obvious that most of us remember.

It is through those unique moments of vision that we, as people, grew stronger and wiser at the same time.

Let us pray that all can get enough to allow them all to step back and live in their "holy place" remembering one of the most important names of God is "HaMakom" - "the Place". ### The Four Chaplains

The Four Chaplains were United States Army Chaplains who gave their lives to save other civilian and military personnel as the troop ship U.S. Army Transport Dorchester sank during World War II.

They helped other soldiers board life boats and gave up their own life jackets when the supply ran out.

The Chaplains joined arms, said prayers, and sang hymns as they went down with the ship.

This event was the catalyst for Americans to embrace interfaith understanding.

Join us on Tuesday, February 4th at 1 p.m. for a Memorial Service to honor the Four Chaplains.



The four chaplains are Lt. George L. Fox, Methodist; Lt. Alexander D. Goode, Jewish; Lt. John P. Washington, Roman Catholic; and Lt. Clark V. Poling, Dutch Reformed. The four lost their lives trying to aid sailors on the torpedoed troop transport ship *USAT Dorchester* in World War II.

## Celebrate Tu B'Shevat on February 15th during the Saturday morning Service

### What is Tu B'shevat?

**Tu B'shevat** gets its name from the date on which the holiday occurs, the 15th of the month of Shevat. A minor Jewish holiday, it is often referred to as the new year (or "birthday") of the trees. The holiday originated in the Talmud, and was based on the date chosen for calculating the agricultural cycle of taking tithes from the produce of the trees, which were brought as first-fruit offerings to the Temple in Jerusalem.

### How is Tu B'shevat celebrated?

The holiday of Tu B'shevat fell out of practice after the destruction of the Second Temple, but was revived by kabbalists in the Middle Ages. They instituted the practice of the Tu B'shevat seder, a meal that partly mirrors the Passover seder and involves eating biblical foods native to the Holy Land and drinking four cups of wine.

Tu B'shevat has developed into an ecological holiday that reminds Jews of our connection to the earth and to our role as caretakers of the environment. Some modern practices include donating money to plant trees in Israel or planting trees locally. The kabbalistic Tu B'shevat seder has also been reclaimed.

### What kinds of foods are eaten on Tu B'shevat?

As part of the Tu B'shevat seder it is customary to eat from **shiv'at ha'minim** (seven species endemic to the Land of Israel): wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives, dates. Beyond that, there are many possible variations for preparing a Tu B'shevat meal, usually incorporating dried fruit and nuts, and one can be creative in deciding how to plan the menu.

## THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~

### MARKING THE 76th ANNIVERSARY OF THE KNESSET'S INAUGURAL MEETING

Seventy-six years ago this month, on February 14, 1949, the modern Knesset, Israel's unicameral parliament, convened for the first time. Significantly, it was on Tu BiShvat, Israel's Arbor Day. This month's featured stamp was issued in 1966 when the iconic Knesset Building, still in use today, opened its doors for the first time. But on that day in 1949, the body convened at what was the Jewish Agency Building on King George Street in Jerusalem, today known as the National Institutions Building.

The Knesset took its name and fixed its membership at 120 from the *Knesset HaGdola* (Great Assembly), the representative Jewish council convened in Jerusalem in the 5th century BCE by Ezra, an important scribe and priest, and Nehemiah, who had served as governor of Persian Judea.

The modern Israeli Knesset convened for the first time following elections in January 1949. It succeeded the provisional government that had functioned as the Jewish community's parliament during the Mandate Era and the first few months after statehood had been declared. In his speech opening the inaugural session, Israeli President Chaim Weizmann told the Knesset members that the aim of the Jewish state would be, before everything else, "to gather in the exiles from all parts of the world." He emphasized that this was a great day not only in the lives of the Jewish people but also in world history.

To mark the momentous occasion, a procession of school children carrying Israeli flags and huge bouquets marched through the main streets of Jerusalem. It stopped in front of the Jewish Agency Building where Weizmann, Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion, members of the first Cabinet, the newly-elected members of the Knesset, and guests attended a solemn service in honor of the Israel Defense Forces soldiers killed in battle to help establish the State.

The Knesset chose Tu BiShvat for its first meeting partly because of a strange void in the Jewish calendar. Though there are dates recognized for the departure from Egypt, for the receiving of the Torah at Mount Sinai, for the beginning of the siege around Jerusalem, for the fall of the Temples, and much more, there is no day on the calendar that marks the Israelites' entry into the Promised Land after 40 years of wandering in the desert. In the Zionist "reinvention" of the Jewish calendar, Tu BiShvat assumed that role because the agricultural theme of the holiday connects naturally to the story of Israel's rebirth, as referenced in the Book of Isaiah: "In days to come shall Jacob take root, Israel shall blossom and bud; And the face of the world shall be filled with fruitage" (Isaiah 27:6). In just a few words, that verse brings together the three key messages of the day: Tu BiShvat ("take root," "blossom and bud"); the inauguration of the Knesset ("shall Jacob take root"); and how the world would be enriched by the establishment of Israel ("the world shall be filled with fruitage").

The major function of the Knesset is to legislate laws and revise them as necessary. Additional duties include establishing the government, making policy decisions, reviewing government activities, and electing the President of the State and the State Comptroller.

February's featured stamp, a 1 Israeli pound violet blue issue, marked the inauguration on August 30, 1966, of the Knesset's permanent home in the Givat Ram neighborhood of Jerusalem. Polish-born German-Israeli architect Ossip Klarwein designed the building, which was dedicated in a ceremony attended by the heads of 44 parliaments and about 6000 Israelis. Over the years, significant additions to the original building have been constructed, but they were built at levels below and behind the main structure so as to not detract from its original appearance.





***Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow***

In last month's article, I mentioned there would be a Part 2 regarding Rabbi Joseph Telushkin's book **The Book of Jewish Values - a Day by Day Guide to Ethical Learning**. There was so much to know in this book that I needed to extend the article into the February Shofar. If you did not read last month's article, or even if you did, it would be helpful to read it again so you can remind yourself what the book was about. I am now going to continue with the list I already composed concerning the ethical issues we need to study and then practice.

- Don't humiliate the enemy
- Acknowledge your sin and accept responsibility
- Ask for forgiveness, even when you're not fully in the wrong
- Do you scream when you should?
- Read and listen to points of view with which you disagree
- Don't threaten your children with physical punishment
- Schedule kindness into your day
- Don't embarrass your guest or children
- What the Torah says about prevention of cruelty to animals
- Don't bear a grudge
- Start your day with gratitude
- If you have a tendency to complain about others
- Respect your family's privacy
- Questions to ask yourself before you criticize another
- Knowing when to step aside
- When you have judged another unfairly
- Be conscious of the goodness and sweetness in others
- Seek peace and pursue it
- Don't snap at your spouse
- When silence is golden
- Learn even from those with whom you disagree
- The ban on taking revenge
- Who is a hero?
- When you're tempted to do something wrong
- Learning to say "I need"
- You are not as good as you think you are, and the world is not as bad as you think it is
- Learning to keep your envy in check
- Don't get used to other people's suffering.
- Repentance is good - over repentance is not
- Don't stereotype groups
- Never insult another
- One who calls another person a cruel nickname - this is a form of abuse
- Study Judaism fifteen minutes a day...start now
- Don't insult your spouse
- Would Jewish ethics permit a Jew to own a gun store?



You should know that even this long list is not a complete one. Other issues are discussed in the book that you might enjoy examining. Rabbi Telushkin, to complete his helpful book, has used the Bible, the Talmud, and other of Judaism's sacred writings to provide us with a manual on how to live an honest, kind and decent life. The issues he writes about are not only ones that we come across today but have been around since the beginning of human interactions. How fortunate we are to have such an interesting and useful book as this in our library! Rabbi Telushkin provides us with not only a manual for living life, but the inspiration we need to follow it. His stories and descriptions are so meaningful. You might even want to make copies of the pages that are extremely helpful for you, or even purchase the book on Amazon. I know I will want to refer back to it many times in my future!
