From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

March is here and we are quickly moving towards the spring holidays. Time seems to be passing by so quickly.

This month we have the reading of the Megillah. This year we are reading the story of Esther, Mordechai and the saving of the Jews. Although I would prefer you not follow ALL the traditions of the holiday, tradition says this is one of the holidays in the Jewish calendar when you're supposed to get so "tipsy" you don't know the difference between Mordechai and H-----, (the name that shall not be uttered without word drowning, grogging, yelling and generally behaving badly with approval!).

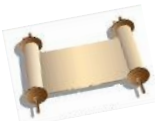

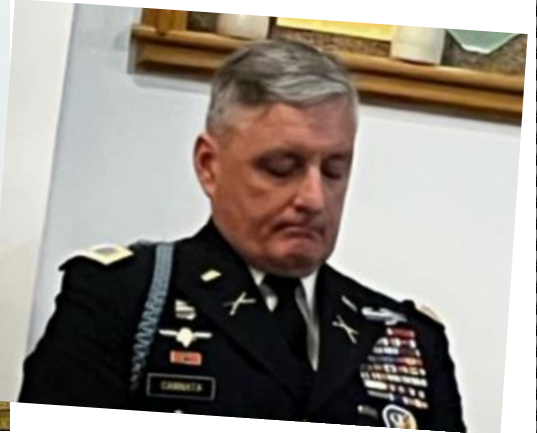

PURIM MERRYMAKING!

Purim, the holiday that commemorates the saving of the Jewish people in the 5th century BCE from annihilation at the hands of an official of the Persian Empire named Haman, and the liberation of the Jews of Persia, is celebrated on the 14th day of the Hebrew month of Adar; in 2025, Erev Purim falls on the evening of March 13. This month's featured stamp, valued at 1.20 new shekels, is one of 12 different stamps issued by Israel in 2002 to mark the 12 months of the Hebrew calendar. The multicolored issue depicts several items that represent Purim, the most important holiday during Adar.

The story of Purim is recounted in the Book of Esther found in the Ketuvim in the Hebrew Bible. Haman was the royal vizier to the Persian king Ahasuerus. His plans were foiled by Mordecai and Esther, Mordecai's cousin and adopted daughter who became queen of Persia after her marriage to Ahasuerus. The day of deliverance became a day of feasting and rejoicing among Jews, and continues to be celebrated in that way today. As it is written in the Book of Esther: "the days wherein the Jews had rest from their enemies, and the month which was turned unto them from sorrow to gladness, and from mourning into a good day, that they should make them days of feasting and gladness, and of sending portions one to another, and gifts for the poor." (Esther 9:22)

Traditionally, Purim is celebrated among Jews by: exchanging gifts of food and drink; donating charity to the poor; eating a celebratory meal with wine; reciting the Scroll of Esther, also called the "reading of the *Megillah*," usually in synagogue; and presenting a Purim spiel, a comic dramatization of the Book of Esther. The Stamp of the Month features other customs of the holiday: wearing masquerade costumes; eating three-cornered filled pastries called *hamantaschen* (translated as "Haman's ears"); and rattling a gragger, a noise making device, whenever the name of Haman is read during the recitation of the *Megillah*.

The label beneath the stamp, known as a tab, features shadows of two fish in addition to a *hamantash*. Fish are associated with Adar and Purim because the zodiac sign for the month is Pisces (fish); in Jewish tradition, fish symbolize fertility, blessing, and abundance, and in the Talmud, they are often mentioned as an essential menu item of holiday meals. This stamp, and the others in the series representing the other 11 months on the Hebrew calendar, were designed by students in the Bezalel Academy of Art and Design in Jerusalem.

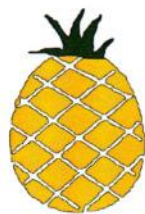

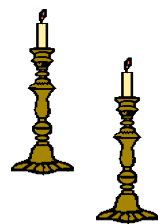

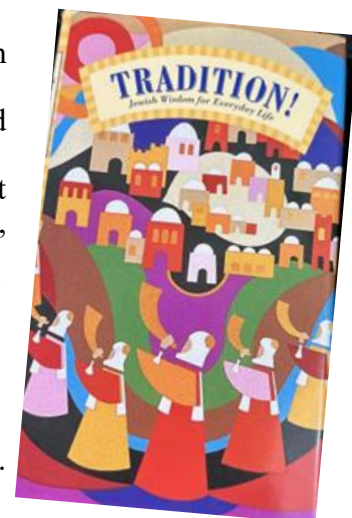


Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow

This year we have been through some trying times -with a presidential campaign and election, political upheaval, and trouble in the Middle East, it seems like constant negative news. As a result, I've changed my book review to a more non-stressful experience, where you might feel some solace in a world of confusion. The book I am reviewing is ***Tradition -**

Jewish Wisdom For Everyday Life,* edited by Suzanne Siegel Zenkel. It is made up of different aspects of Jewish life - prayer, family, holidays, peace, love ethics and more. All of these use examples from a wide range of Jewish thought. You will find quotes from the Torah, the Mishnah, Pirke Avot and the Zohar, plus other sources of information. There is a vast array of people whose words appear in this book - many well-known and other not-so-familiar. Some names that appear include: the Ba'al Shem Tov, Albert Einstein, Anne Frank, Hillel, Golda Meir, and Elie Wiesel. The quotes in the book are also grouped according to certain topics. Here are a few examples from the book. You might have to think about them, but it should be a positive experience.

- Days are scrolls. Write on them only what you want remembered – Bachya Ibn Pakuda, 11th century
- Do you know where the Lord is to be found? He is in the place where He is invited to enter. Hasidic Saying
- A religious man is a person who holds God and man in one thought at one time, at all times, who suffers harm done to others, whose greatest passion is compassion, whose greatest strength is love and defiance of despair. - Abraham Joshua Heschel
- There is no room for God in someone who is filled with himself. - Ba'al Shem Tov
- Let other people's dignity be as precious to you as your own. – Rabbi Eliezer

In 1916, Maxim Gorky, a non-Jew, wrote: "I believe that Jewish wisdom is more all-human and universal than any other: and this is not only because of its immemorial age, not only because it is the first born, but also because of the powerful humaneness that saturates it, because of its high estimate of man." This leads us to appreciate the collection of riches of this heritage. People from all walks of life give us words that link us with what came before, words that concern how you live a "good" life. The editor closes by saying ***Tradition*** is an anthology of Jewish wisdom, past and present, that provides enduring inspiration for the future.

I want you to know that this book is a small one, only 63 pages. But as you know, big things come in small packages. And this is certainly one of them!
