From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

It's summer - again. It sounds so obvious, almost silly. But - the Talmud speaks of a concept of a Ma'agal chozer - A circle without End. (Look at your wedding ring). It traditionally is a circle with no interruptions (stones or such, and no clear beginning or end. Again, think of the simple gold wedding band.



So, here we are again. Heading into summer, a time to

sit and relax a bit, everything has slowed down, the snowbirds are up north checking on family and here at the temple we are already working on the coming year's calendar, festival events, High Holiday services, fundraisers, special events, and so much more. We're planning a very special year with so much more being added to our offerings. Keep a watch out.

THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ By Ellis Bromberg Stamp Of the Month:

THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE AND ITS MEANING FOR AMERICAN JEWS

On July 4, this month, the United States will mark the 249th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the nation's founding document which explained its decision to end British rule over the 13 American colonies. While it is not a "Jewish document," the 1,320-word Declaration holds significant meaning for us Jews as it embodies the core principles of freedom, equality, and the pursuit of happiness that are central to both American and Jewish values.

This month's featured set is a se-tenant of four 13-cent blue and multicolored stamps, issued in 1976, that replicates a John Trumbull painting of the Declaration's five-man drafting committee presenting the draft to the U.S. Continental Congress at the Pennsylvania State House, later renamed Independence Hall, in Philadelphia. The committee, shown standing in front of the central table, includes two men who would later become U.S. presidents, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson; seated at the table is John Hancock, who was president of the Congress when the Declaration was adopted and signed.



The painting was placed in the rotunda of the U.S. Capitol in Washington in 1826, but it is not an exact recreation of the event. Trumbull did not complete the original oil on canvas until 1818, 42 years after the signing of the Declaration, and it shows only 42 of the 56 signers (Trumbull originally intended to include all 56, but was unable to obtain the likenesses of all). In addition, all the men were never in the room at the same time, and the meeting depicted actually occurred on June 28, 1776 -- not July 4 (the Congress, however, did officially approve the wording of the text on July 4).

There were no Jews among the signatories; to be sure, there were few Jews in the American colonies in 1776. Nevertheless, the commitment of American Jews to the Declaration's principles and Jewish contributions to the Revolution demonstrate a connection to the ideals enshrined in the document. We Jews have a strong sense of civic duty and patriotism, and the Declaration serves as a reminder of the nation's founding principles. In particular, the document's assertion that "all men are created equal" resonates strongly with Jewish values, which emphasize the inherent dignity and worth of every individual, regardless of background. And its reference to "the pursuit of happiness" aligns with Jewish ideals of building a just and prosperous society for all.

The Declaration also echoes Biblical traditions: its statements about natural rights, the importance of a government accountable to the people, and social justice find echoes in Jewish history and religious texts.

Today, the Declaration of Independence continues to be a powerful symbol of American values and a source of inspiration for us American Jews, acclaiming the principles of freedom, equality, and the pursuit of happiness that are central to both our American and Jewish identities. It serves as a reminder of the ongoing struggles for justice and equality faced by American Jews, and our commitment to building a society that lives up to the ideals of the Declaration.

Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow




During this time of year, when it is so hot and humid and of course raining like there's no tomorrow, we start to think about more indoor activities. Of course, that includes reading. I noticed that last summer I reviewed the book *100 Essential Books for Jewish Readers* edited by Daniel B. Syme and Cindy Frenkel Kanter. and informed you about 10 books on the list, so there are quite a few "essential" books remain-

ing. You will notice they are from many different aspects of Jewish life: texts, Jewish Observance and Jewish Values, Jewish Philosophy and Theology, Israel and the Holocaust, and Fiction and General Works on Jewish Themes.

Now let's place some books on a new list:

Holy Days by Lis Harris. Discovering an old photo, the author sets out to find out about her roots. We're talking about a Jewish secular woman who delves into the lives of those who are Hasidim. This is an extremely interesting book for those who want to understand the details of the Hasidic world.

What They Say Behind Our Backs^{} by William B Helmreich. This book examines nine different groups: Jews, Italians, Blacks, Poles, Japanese, Chinese, Irish, White Anglo-Saxon Protestants, and Hispanics. The author analyzes the stereotypes that have been perpetuated against them. He talks about prejudice and its beginnings in childhood. In his chapter about the Jews,



Helmreich discusses the lie found in *Protocols of the Elders of Zion* and how false it is, and also discusses the death of Jesus. In addition, he includes other lies such as: the Jews control of the media, the Jews have horns, and that Jews are shrewd businessmen. This is an extremely meaningful book, especially in today's world.

Guess Who's Jewish in American History? - written by Bernard Postal and Lion Koppman. In this book, you will find short biographies about the individuals mentioned. Some you are familiar with, others not so, but they all made contributions to American History. You will find interesting information about individuals such as Emma Lazarus who died without knowing her sonnet on the Statue of Liberty would become famous. This is an easy book to read, with many pages of photographs. It even has a chapter named "Curosia and Eccentrics", and one on "Nobel Laureates", plus "the Presidency and Jewry". We find a chapter on "Women" and one on "Heroes". How proud we should be of those who came before us! Jewish contributions are and will contribute to us and to all those around us.

The Shawl by Cynthia Ozick is a novella of only 69 pages. The author takes the ordinary and transforms it. In Poland, it is a shawl which hides a woman's infant while she is marching to a concentration camp. This is a riveting book, a book about "motherly love and loss". The description of this work of fiction says it is "as much about feelings as it is about the details of events themselves." Our Temple Library has *The Shawl* available.

Voices Within the Ark: The Modern Jewish Poets edited by Howard Schwartz and Anthony Rudolph. See how Jewish poets hold poetry especially dear - after all, we are also "people of the psalms". We always need a new perspective on life, and poetry does just that. Read the poems of 350 Jewish poets from many parts of the world. They had been written in their original languages. Some of the poets are well known, some are not. But they are the voice of the Jewish People.

Good People by Danny Siegel. This book has been described as a "compendium of ideas, resources, and names of people who are making a difference in the world." The author has written chapters about the deeds of those who practice Tzedakah - "The Shoe Lady of Denver" who found 500 pairs of shoes in a dumpster, thrown out by a store. Her name was Ranya Kelly. She continued to search mall dumpsters at night, eventually collecting 165,000 pairs! Another chapter is made up of a listing of "mitzvah phone numbers" for specific Tzedakah projects such as gathering cribs for needy children, starting a community food bank and using pets to visit hospital patients. Siegel also has a section of the book which illustrates specific human problems that require creative solutions – the response achieved and the individual who thought of it. The reader is always challenged by the author. The book states: "his message is simple. Get involved. Stick your neck out. Help the poor and the needy, not as a nice thing to do, but as a command from God...each of us has the potential to change the world." Certainly a "feel good" book!

Books are a critical part of Judaism. They tell us who we were, who we are and where we are going. Their lessons leave us with much to ponder. Most of the books mentioned in this review are available on Amazon and in libraries. One of the books is a part of our Library. I hope many of you will be encouraged to include at least one or two books of Jewish interest on your reading list. 



Shabbat prayer study sessions




As of now these are the scheduled dates:


