Love them when they give you joy, And love them when they don't. When you lie down, let go of anger, When you rise up at dawn, begin again.



## THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ By Ellis Bromberg Stamp Of the Month: BUILDING A SUKKAH FOR SUKKOT

During the seven days of Sukkot -- beginning this year with Erev Sukkot on October 6 -- we Jews may move many of our activities from our homes to a temporary three- or four-walled structure called a sukkah where we eat our meals and may even sleep at night. This serves as a reminder of

the way G-d provided for our ancestors in the wilderness during the Exodus from Egypt. There are many rules, found in Leviticus 23:42-43, that outline how the sukkah is to be built and how it should be covered with branches of autumnal, harvest, or Judaic themes; all or part of its roof should be open to the sky.

Sukkot is considered a joyous occasion, referred to in Hebrew as *Z'man Simchateinu* (the time of our rejoicing). The sukkah itself symbolizes the fragility and transience of life and our dependence on G-d.



Traditionally, building the sukkah begins at night after the end of Yom Kippur, as the start of a first mitzvah immediately following our atonement for sins of the previous year. And it is customary for all members of the family to participate in building and decorating the sukkah, as depicted in this month's featured stamp, a 7.40 shekel multicolored 2017 issue from Israel.

#### Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow





The book I am reviewing this month is based on the experiences of one rabbi concerning a class of his students in his temple's school. The rabbi is Edward Feinstein, and the book is TOUGH QUESTIONS JEWS ASK (a young adult 's guide to building a Jewish life). It is the result of individual teachers having a difficult time with teens and their reactions to situations which led to the resignation of

those teachers as they tried to tackle the class. What could the temple do?

Well, who better to take over the group of students? Rabbi Feinstein of course! The last resort! Judaism encourages us to ask questions, and that's exactly what he had the students do. The rabbi was willing to take tough questions - about religion, the world and more. As adults we continue to ask questions - some easy and others extremely difficult. Our goal should be to think about our questions and if necessary, seek out help to bring more meaning to those things we consider important.

As part of the book review, I am choosing only some questions that were discussed in the book. Space and time constraints limit how many I may include. But these questions must be familiar to you because at one time or another we have asked them - sometimes as a teen and even as a senior.





- 2. What good is praying? Miracles are everywhere, but most of us don't notice. The sun goes down and then rises. Those are miracles: Miracles don't have to break the laws of nature. We just don't always recognize them. Becoming healthy after being sick is a miracle. We just have to notice these miracles. Perhaps if we did, we would complain less and appreciate more. Then why don't we do that? We are too busy and are distracted, so we miss the opportunities to feel God close to us. Prayer "is a way we stop and notice the miracles around us it's our moment with God." Most Jewish prayers get us to stop and notice. The author states "The purpose of prayer is not to change God. The purpose of prayer is to change us." The remainder of this chapter discusses "If I pray for something, will I get it?" and "Do I have to go to Synagogue to pray?"
- 3. Why does God let terrible things happen? Accidents, disease, tornadoes, floods and more destruction follows these and other disasters all around the world. We have all had our share of some of these, some people more than others. We have negative feelings when we watch them discussed through the media. Should we experience guilt and feel we deserve these events? Or do we feel nature follows its own rules, and God doesn't intervene? We should also understand that oftentimes there is good as a result of tragedy. A house might be damaged due to strong storm winds, but the people that come to that house after a hurricane asking you if you are ok they are examples of the good that follows the bad. Maybe this is God helping out. Last year, one of my neighbors knocked on my door after all those tornadoes barreled through Port St Lucie and neighboring communities. She asked if I was ok and then asked if I would like to come over to her house for a cup of coffee. Actually, this turned out to be a meaningful therapeutic talk session, much needed by both of us. People willing to share kindness and support one another is oftentimes the result of frightening occurrences. We have to remember that many good things are not in the media. But that media is sure to cover every problem in the world! This section also includes "how can anyone believe in God after the Holocaust?" There is so much food for thought here, it's really worth it to look at the book.

As you must have discovered by now, there are a tremendous number of questions that all of us have thought about throughout our lives. Because this book deals with so many of them, I leave it to you to refer back to the book for more ideas you might like to think about. Some other questions in the book you might want to reflect on are: what's the meaning of life, why do religions need so many rules, why do people hate Jews, what's the importance of marrying someone Jewish, what's true in the Bible, what happens to us after we die, why is Israel so important, why be Jewish, and why should I believe in God? Thinking about these questions using Rabbi Feinstein's book is extremely helpful and may make it easier to deal with them head on.

## **Quarter Auction**

We have had many requests to explain a "Quarter Auction" so here is an explanation:

A quarter auction is a fundraising event that combines elements of a raffle, an auction, and a direct sales party. It's a fun way to raise money for a good cause while enjoying some friendly competition and socializing with others. Here's how it works:

**Arrival**: When you arrive at the event, you'll be given a numbered paddle for a donation. This paddle will have a corresponding numbered chip that will be placed into a drawing basket.

**Preview**: Before the auction begins, you'll have the opportunity to browse the items up for "auction." These items will be on display for about an hour after the doors open, allowing you to decide which ones you're interested in.

**Bidding**: Once the auction starts, an announcer or helper will hold up an item and announce whether it's a "one-quarter" or "two-quarter" bid. If you're interested in bidding, you'll put one or two quarters (depending on what was announced) into the bucket for each paddle you wish to bid with. For example, if you have two paddles and want to bid with both of them to increase your chances of winning, and the item is a "one-quarter" bid, you'll put \$0.50 in the bucket and raise your paddles. If you decide to bid with only one paddle, you'll pay \$0.25.

**Collection**: A worker will walk from table to table with a bucket to collect bids. Once all the quarters have been collected, the bucket is shaken to mix up all the chips.

**Winner Selection**: The announcer will draw a number from the bucket, and if they draw your number and you had bid on the item, congratulations! You've won that item at a great price. If they draw your number and you didn't bid on the item, simply call out "no bid!" and they'll continue drawing numbers until they find a winner.

**Additional Activities**: Quarter auctions may also include various raffles and cash-and-carry items throughout the evening.

Remember to bring quarters with you to the event; however, if you forget or run out, there will be rolls of quarters available for purchase. Enjoy the excitement of bidding on items while supporting a good cause!






