From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

Sometimes it's really hard to be a Jew. The questions abound: Are you Jewish enough? Too much? Secular versus Religious. Can you legitimately call yourself a Jew if you're not Orthodox or, at least, Conservadox? When asked a question about your religion, do you bluff or do you actually know the answer?

And how do you feel if you bluff and get away with it? Have you helped support your faith community or have you confused the questioner?

The challenge for all faith communities is becoming daunting. By growing percentages, people are drifting away from organized religions and for differing reasons. My kids are grown and so it's not as important now - I've done my job, let them make up their own minds, what do I get from it and why do I have to pay dues to be a Jew? These are just some of the questions that are put on the table for those still committed to the idea of having a relationship to the synagogue world.



It's quite sad that synagogues are making choices that work against their longevity. Hiring undertrained clergy because it's cheaper is reducing the Cantor to a song leader, not someone versed in traditional Jewish music, but people who can sing "camp" songs. Around the country, temples look first at the cheapest option to keep dues down or risk losing people who make choices of trips over Torah, ships over Shabbat, lunches over learning.

Being Jewish is a lifelong experience, it doesn't disappear after Bar or Bat Mitzvah. Learning more about who you are and why that is requires a lifetime of learning even if it's not every day. We have ongoing classes for all of us to learn, grow and fulfill the Jewish paradigm of "informed choice". That was the vision of the founders of Reform Judaism: make choices as to what works for you based on information and knowledge, not convenience or lack of education and knowledge.

Interestingly, prayer is a learned skill, not a challenge to survive. Looking inward to become the best that you can be, requires some work, some review of self, and the willingness to grow. Each of those things can be found in the temple in some way: Sisterhood or Brotherhood, Adult Education, Services, Torah study, social events, and more.

Rabbi Mordechai Kaplan, the founder of Reconstructionist Judaism, suggests that Judaism falls into three categories: Religious (services), Education, and Social. He suggested that each Jew is 100% a Jew regardless of how the 3 parts are divided. Like a pizza, we are all 100% a full pie no matter what size the three pieces are. When put together, you still have a whole pie.

The Four Chaplains Ceremony

SUNDAY - FEBRUARY 1st at 5:30 p.m.



The Saga of the Four Chaplains tells an inspiring story of four military chaplains who sacrificed their lives during World War II to save others. On Feb. 3, 1943, the USAT Dorchester, carrying over 900 soldiers, was struck by a German torpedo in the icy waters of the North Atlantic.

As the ship began to sink, Army chaplains Lt. George Fox (Methodist), Lt. Alexander Goode (Jewish), Lt. John Washington (Catholic), and Lt. Clark Poling (Reformed Church in America) offered prayers and calm guidance, distributing life jackets and helping soldiers to safety.

When the supply of life jackets ran out, the chaplains gave up their own and linked arms, praying together as they went down with the ship. Their selfless actions embody unity, courage, and faith under unimaginable circumstances.

Remembering the Four Chaplains is vital because their story transcends faith and exemplifies service to others above self. They remind us of the power of unity, especially during times of crisis.

This year, the Korean War Veterans Chapter 106 will host the Four Chaplains Memorial Ceremony on February 1st , 2026 at 5:30 p.m. at Temple Beth El Israel, located at 551 SW Bethany Drive, Port St. Lucie.



Celebrate Tu B'Shevat on February 7th following the Saturday morning Service

What is Tu B'shevat?

Tu B'shevat gets its name from the date on which the holiday occurs, the 15th of the month of Shevat. A minor Jewish holiday, it is often referred to as the new year (or “birthday”) of the trees. The holiday originated in the Talmud, and was based on the date chosen for calculating the agricultural cycle of taking tithes from the produce of the trees, which were brought as first-fruit offerings to the Temple in Jerusalem.

How is Tu B'shevat celebrated?

The holiday of Tu B'shevat fell out of practice after the destruction of the Second Temple, but was revived by kabbalists in the Middle Ages. They instituted the practice of the Tu B'shevat seder, a meal that partly mirrors the Passover seder and involves eating biblical foods native to the Holy Land and drinking four cups of wine. Tu B'shevat has developed into an ecological holiday that reminds Jews of our connection to the earth and to our role as caretakers of the environment. Some modern practices include donating money to plant trees in Israel or planting trees locally. The kabbalistic Tu B'shevat seder has also been reclaimed.

What kinds of foods are eaten on Tu B'shevat?

As part of the Tu B'shevat seder it is customary to eat from **shiv'at ha'minim** (seven species endemic to the Land of Israel): wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives, dates. Beyond that, there are many possible variations for preparing a Tu B'shevat meal, usually incorporating dried fruit and nuts, and one can be creative in deciding how to plan the menu.



On February 9, the Technion in Haifa, Israel's oldest university, will mark the 101st anniversary of its official opening in 1925. The school's first class consisted of 17 students -- 16 men and one woman -- whose studies mainly focused on architecture and construction engineering. Notably the school chose Hebrew as its language of instruction, even though most of the lecturers were Jewish professors who had recently emigrated from Europe and hardly knew Hebrew. Although its original educational offerings were limited, the Technion would evolve into one of the world's top 10 technological research universities.

The school and its alumni have consistently led the development of Israel's infrastructure. In addition to aspiring towards excellence in research and education, the Technion has been closely tied to Israel's security and economic planning. Four Nobel Prize winners have emerged from the school: distinguished professors Avram Hershko, Aaron Ciechanover, Dan Shechtman, and Arieh Warshel.



This month's featured 9.10 shekel multicolored stamp was issued last year to mark the Technion's 100th anniversary. The stamp's design encapsulates the past, present, and future of the school, showcasing the groundbreaking research for which it has become known in Israel and around the world. Scientific and technological innovation is depicted in the upper part of the stamp through various symbols: a molecule (representing research in chemistry and Nobel prizes in the field); DNA (symbolizing advancements in biology, medicine, and life sciences); and the electron (representing pioneering technological research in engineering). The past is represented by the number 100.

In 1923, two years before the school's opening, Albert Einstein visited the site and planted a now-famous palm tree there, symbolizing his support for the nascent institution. The tree still stands on the Technion's original campus in Haifa's Hadar neighborhood where the school was located in its early decades. That building, now the Madatech science museum, is shown on the tab, the label attached to the bottom of the stamp. The Technion currently has five campuses: three in Haifa; one in Shantou, China; and another in New York City, part of Cornell Tech.

Upon its 100th anniversary, Israeli President Isaac Herzog commented, "The Technion is a symbol of Israeli excellence. One hundred years of innovation, groundbreaking research, and the continuous pursuit of world-class achievements. A leading scientific and technological institute, the home of Nobel Prize winners, and a bridge for collaboration between Israel and the world."



Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow

It's always nice to take a break - not only from what we do, but also from the many serious and more complicated ways of thinking required for my monthly book reviews. This comes at a time when I had heard positive remarks about our December 25th Temple get together to listen and laugh when two comedians performed for us. At the same time, I happened to notice a book on one of our shelves, *OLD JEWS TELLING JOKES* , written by Sam Hoffman, a man who had a website devoted to video portraits of elderly people telling jokes. The site was covered by many blogs and has been featured in *New York Magazine, The Huffington Post, and The Wall Street Journal. *He joined with Eric Spiegelman, a man who produced Internet content for a production company. (He was also a lawyer). The book then caught on when Sam Hoffman decided to just videotape his dad and friends telling the same old jokes they've been telling for many years. No one under 60 was allowed to tell jokes (he needed people with lifetimes of experiences). Before you knew it, they were shooting rounds of jokes in New York City and in Los Angeles, with plans for Florida and London.

In this book, the jokes are categorized into chapters, which as the authors wrote, "trace the trajectory of the Jewish experience in America...and our goal is a portrait, both in photos and jokes, of an evolving culture." The topics covered are the following, and I am quite sure you can think of what some would be. They are: The Jewish Mother, Who are the Jews?, Coming to America, Moving to the Suburbs, The Rabbi, Food, Husbands and Wives, Sex, Illness and Doctors, Getting Old, and Illness and Death: The Last Laugh.

It's true, sometimes you will come across a joke that will cause you to roll your eyes - but this just makes us appreciate the really good ones.

Let me show you a few of the jokes in the book:

- It's the year 2016, and a Jew has been elected president. He calls his mother and says, "Ma, I'm the president of the United States! Are you coming to the inauguration?"

She says, "Eh, well, I've got nothing to wear."

He says, "Ma, I'm gonna be president. I can get you a dressmaker."

She says, "Eh, well, I only eat kosher."

"Ma, I'm gonna be president! I can get you a kosher meal."

She says, "Eh, well, how am I going to get there?"

"Ma, I can get you Air Force One. Come to the inaugural."

There's another guy standing next to the first guy, and he asks him, "When my mask fell down, did you get a look at my face?"


The second guy says, "Yeah, I did."
