### From the Desk of Rabbi Bruce Benson

Our ancestors were an unhappy lot. They lived on the lower strata of Egyptian life, at the beck and call of “full blooded Egyptians”, but they weren’t really chained slaves.

They were day workers, doing the lowliest of jobs in a society. We were allowed the simplest of the great gifts living in Egypt offered at the time. Yet, when things went wrong, many failures of the Pharaoh and his followers were placed on the lower strata of society.

We chose, through the story of a man named Moses, who committed a capital offense crime, to run for safety and freedom. Are we prepared?

The flight to freedom was a tenuous one at best. How fast can we escape without having our escape thwarted by Pharaoh’s armies chasing us down?

So, in a very hap hazard sort of a way, we did a grab and run escape.

So, the question is, what would you take, if all you can take is what you can carry? What could you leave behind - things that you have held onto for a lifetime. Do you try to carry what gives your heart pause? Are decisions made based on physical weight? Pictures?

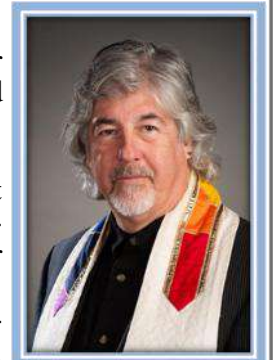
Ok. Frames? Probably not. No pun intended, I think you get the picture.. Now, imagine there are NO fast food places and any of the accoutrements of today’s culture to help (fast food places, pharmacies, suitcases - (well think about that why don’t you?) You can take, for a trip of unknown time - boxes of crackers.

I think the idea is what do we have to do to be ready if ever, God forbid, that we have to do it again. How much can you stick in your car? What about what your family members will insist on? What if, as in the Spanish Inquisition era, you had to the end of the month to pack, and be outside the borders of the country or you would lose everything?

Now, consider the lesson of the Exodus, one of the top 3 moments in our history?

- 1.) What if it happens again, are you ready?
- 2.) Can we stop it from happening?
- 3.) What would you take? (Conversely: what would you not have to take?)
- 4.) Would you anticipate help from others? Or at least compassion and understanding?

Would you expect them to understand your plight or would you accept their judgement regarding you and your family’s plight?

# YOM HASHOAH

April 13th, 2025



Light a yellow candle  
to remember those who perished.

*NEVER AGAIN! "To forget would not only be dangerous but offensive, to forget the dead would be akin to killing them a second time....Not only are we responsible for the memories of the dead, we are responsible for what we are doing with these memories. For the dead and the living, we must bear witness."*

*Holocaust Survivor Elie Wiesel*

More than eighty years have passed since the Nazi concentration camps were liberated and the Holocaust that claimed the six million Jewish lives came to an end. To ensure that the six million did not die in vain and that the Holocaust never happens again, Temple Beth El Israel once again will join Jews throughout the United States and around the world by participating in the **Yom Hashoah Yellow Candle Holocaust Commemoration** to keep alive the memories of the Six Million who perished.

The Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle is modeled after a traditional Jewish Yahrzeit memorial candle that burns for 24 hours during periods of mourning. The wax reminds us of the yellow arm bands that Jews were forced to wear during the Nazi regime.

As the years pass, the memories of those who were victims in this ultimate hate crime must not diminish. We encourage your family to light a yellow candle on the night of Monday, April 13, 2026, and join as thousands of Jewish families light their Yom HaShoah candles. This action will continue to increase the awareness of the Holocaust and help perpetuate our commitment to our people – particularly recently, with the marked increase of anti-Semitism.

The memory is important! The number of Holocaust survivors is rapidly diminishing with each passing day. As we lose this precious link, those who deny that the Holocaust happened gain strength. Sadly, a study conducted reported that 22 percent of millennials (23 to 38 years old) say they haven't even heard of the Holocaust.

Temple Beth El Israel Brotherhood will distribute a Yom HaShoah yellow candle to each Temple family. Please join us in lighting this candle in memory of our six million brothers and sisters who perished.

In addition, we encourage you to attend our Holocaust Memorial Yizkor Service led by Rabbi Benson on Friday, April 17th, 2026 at 7:30 p.m. Please mark your calendar and save the date.

**THE STAMP CORNER ~ ~ By Ellis Bromberg**

**THE CLIMACTIC PARTING OF THE SEA TOLD AT THIS MONTH'S SEDERS**

The parting of the Sea of Reeds is the miraculous conclusion to the Exodus story told in the Haggadah, which Jews all over the world will read at their Passover tables on the first and second evenings of the holiday on Wednesday, April 1, and Thursday, April 2. Passover signifies divine salvation and the ultimate transition from slavery. The climactic biblical narrative, fully recounted in Exodus 14-15, is depicted in this month's featured multicolored 6 shekel souvenir sheet issued by Israel in 2010.



It was late evening when God commanded Moses to raise his staff toward the sea that blocked the Israelites escape route as they fled Egypt. The sea split in two and created a path through which the people of Israel passed during the night. At dawn, when the last of them had reached the other side, God commanded Moses to raise his staff once again toward the sea, which then returned to its former state and drowned the Egyptian army in pursuit.

The long period of slavery our people suffered in Egypt and the miracles that God performed in order to save them are central to the historical collective memory of the Jewish people. It is not difficult to imagine the terror they felt when they saw the Egyptian army's chariots approaching quickly, closing in on their camp on the shore. A particularly large and unique miracle was needed to show the people that their status had changed dramatically, and that God's might was protecting them and would lead them to their new land. The faith that motivated them to take the risk and walk between the threatening walls of water created by the split sea strengthened the spirit of the former slaves and constituted an important and vital step in the process of unifying the people of Israel.

The stamp was issued to mark the Jerusalem 2010 International Philatelic Exhibition; its logo is seen in the top right-hand corner of the souvenir sheet.

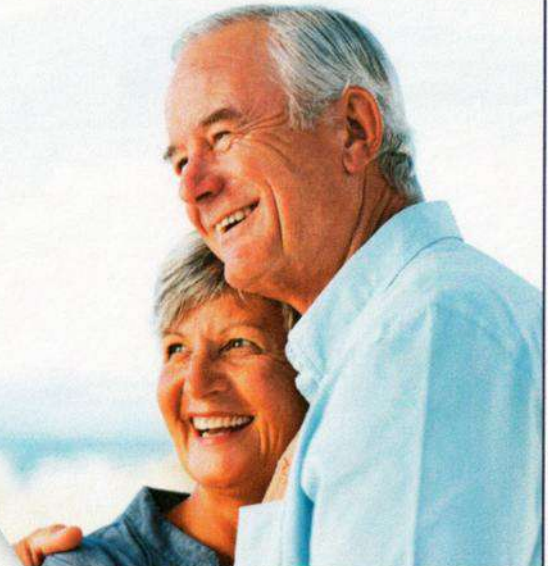

***Our Monthly TBEI Library Book Review.....by Sheilah Korinow***

"In a very profound way, the legacy of the Holocaust remains with us all, whether touched in an actual or existential sense, every Jew born in the throes or thereafter must come to terms with living after the Holocaust." This statement appears on the cover of a book that was written in the back seat of a borrowed car on the way to Boston in September, 1974. It contained three people, all in their early twenties, all wanting to know about the key to life. It was there that a discussion began and the children of Holocaust survivors each had a different story about their experiences. One person's mother hated to read the paper or watch the news because everything reminded her about "the War". To her, "every homicide became a death in her family, every robbery the loss of her home." She also believed that her child reminded her of the life she lost, and repeated things over and over again. Another person in the car said his father's approach was different. He never mentioned what happened. He never mentioned what happened to him during the War. It was his nightmares that woke his child up at night, that led his child to learn about his father's horrible memories. The discussion among the three riders in the car continued and had a profound effect on each of them. Then a few months later more participants joined in, then more and more joined in the discussions and before you know it *Living After the Holocaust: Reflections by Children of Survivors in America* grew into a book and was edited by Lucy Y. Steinitz with David M. Szonyi. This is the book I am reviewing - a timely one considering Yom HaShoah shows up on the calendar on April 14th.

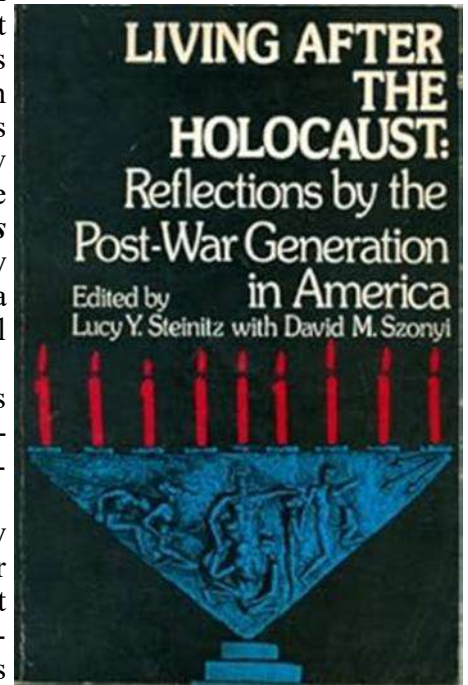
Living After the Holocaust consists of a manageable number of articles (many of which are short) that relate to the children of survivors - each article is informative and really concentrates on those children's emotions. Remember, those children are now us! The articles consist of:

- Stories passed down from survivors, sometimes over and over again. They contained the heroes of what was seen: "a mother holding her infant in her arms. A Gestapo officer wrenched it from her in full view, dashed it against the ground or against a wall....A father deserted his son. The two were hiding in a barn when the man heard people coming to search. He ran for his life and left the boy behind." The children of survivors felt it was an excruciating experience to listen to these stories. Other times it was not so gruesome. There were also stories concerning the war - about victories and escapes. Sometimes all of these, good and bad, were told not all at once, but in fragments. Children of survivors admit that this information has permeated their conscientiousness and thinking.
- There is a section of children's literature and the Holocaust. Learn about the "Hiding Books" and the "Refugee Books".
- There is a conversation between five children of survivors. Very revealing!
- There are sections of poetry on the major topic. - There are essays about: "Why the Jews?", "Towards a Framework for the Teaching of the Holocaust", "How Jewish Students View the Holocaust", "Children and Families of Holocaust Survivors: A Psychological Overview", "Psychological Issues in the Lives of Children of the Holocaust Survivors: The Children as Adults", and finally an extremely touching "Letter for My Loved Ones (Who Perished)". This letter is so emotional and deep, it is really the reason alone to look at this book.

Hopefully, all of the above gives you an idea of what Living After the Holocaust contains. It includes the negative and the positive, the past and the future. One of the editors, in the Forward to this book wrote: "I discovered that the Holocaust happened only because human beings - people who laugh and cry and feel happiness and pain, just like the rest of us - caused it to happen. Therefore, the danger of it happening again is ever-present. Precisely because the Holocaust occurred once, it lies very much within the realm of human capacity to be repeated." That's certainly something to think about. Thus, it becomes necessary to see the Holocaust from all angles. To this end, this book is not about the Holocaust per se, but about the saving remnant, our parents, and above all their children, us. In no way do we see this book as a conclusion, it is a beginning.

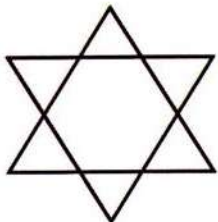

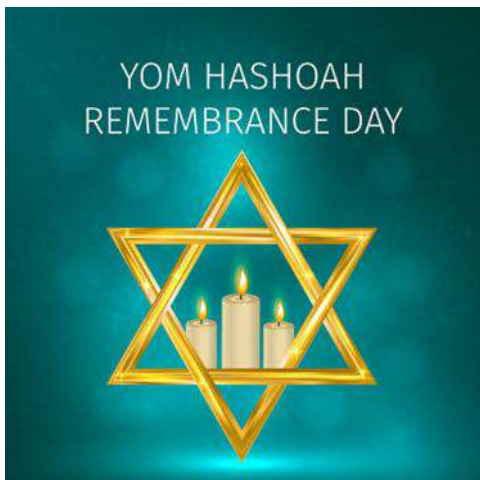
